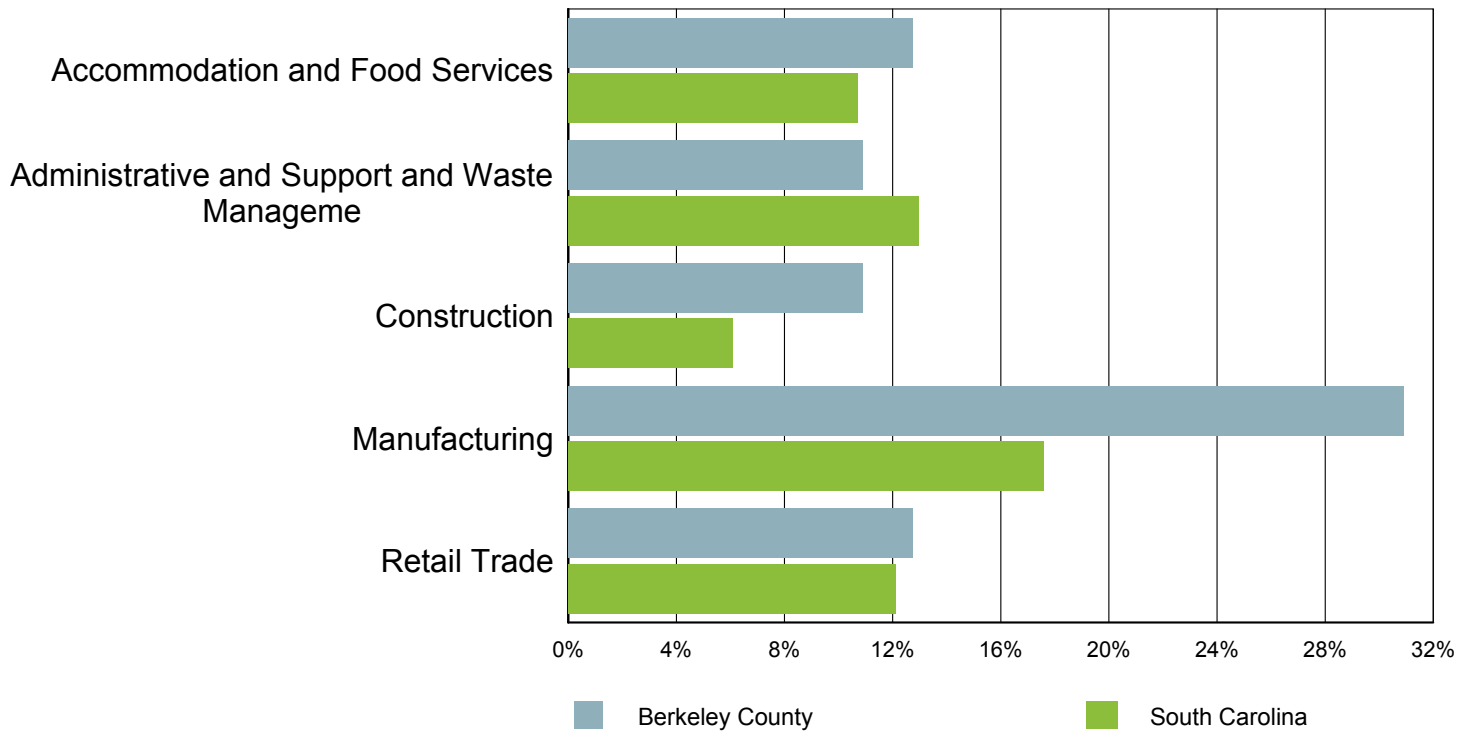

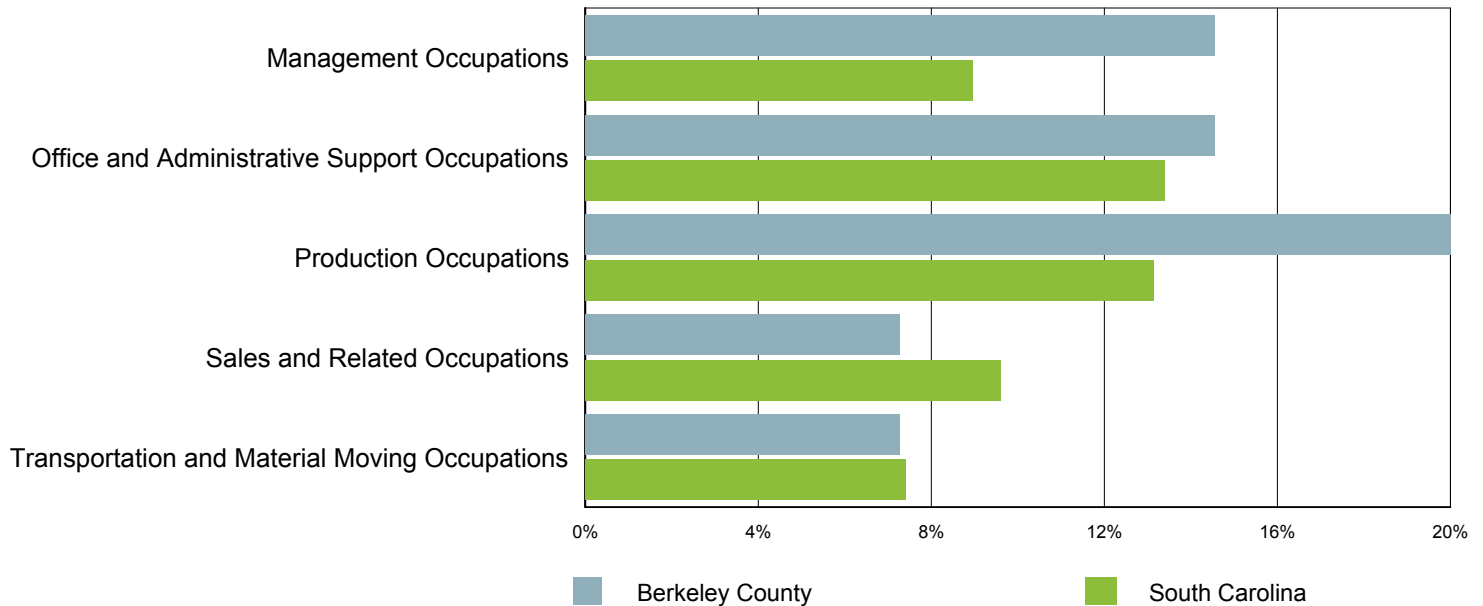

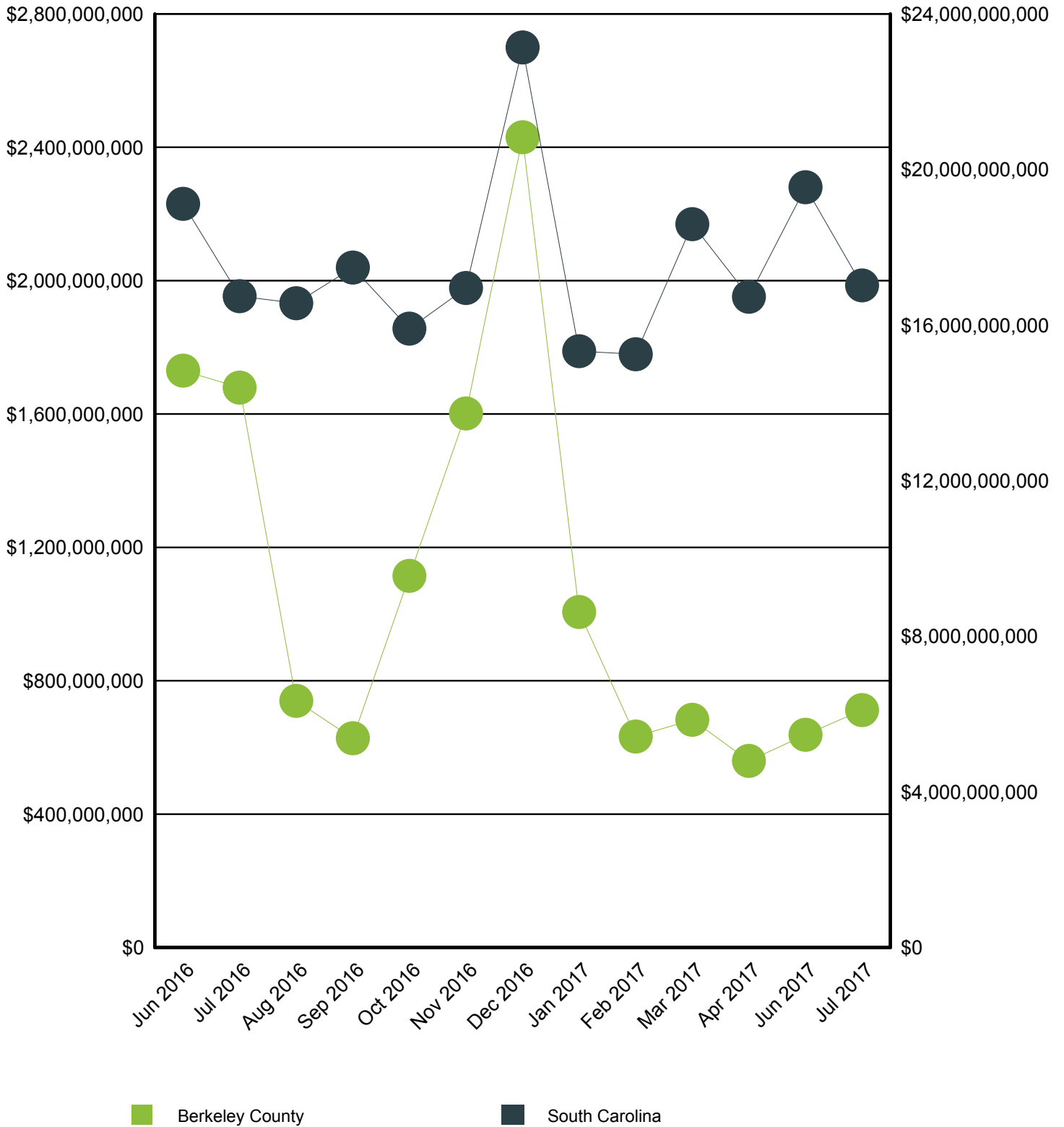

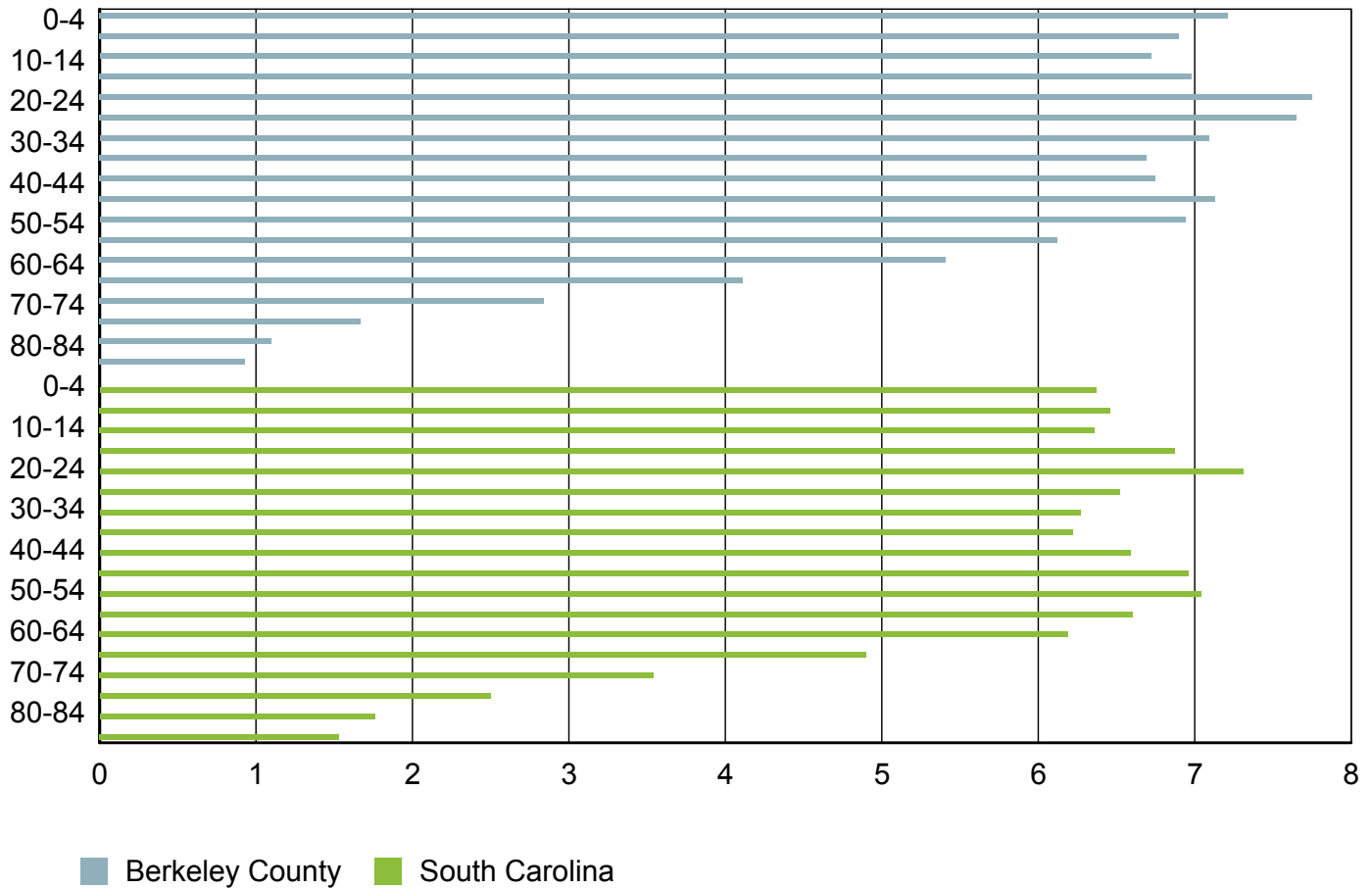

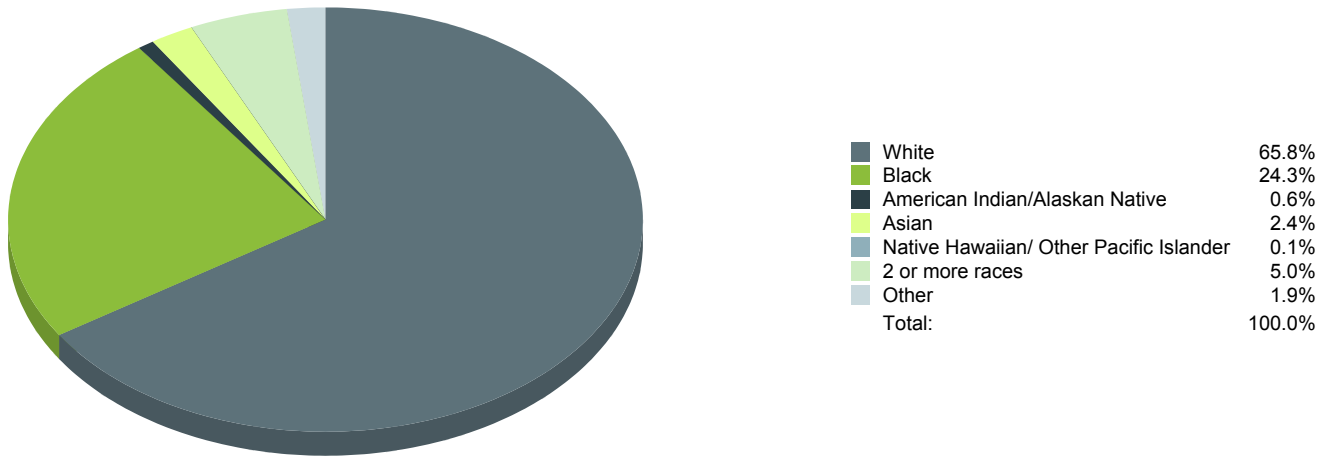

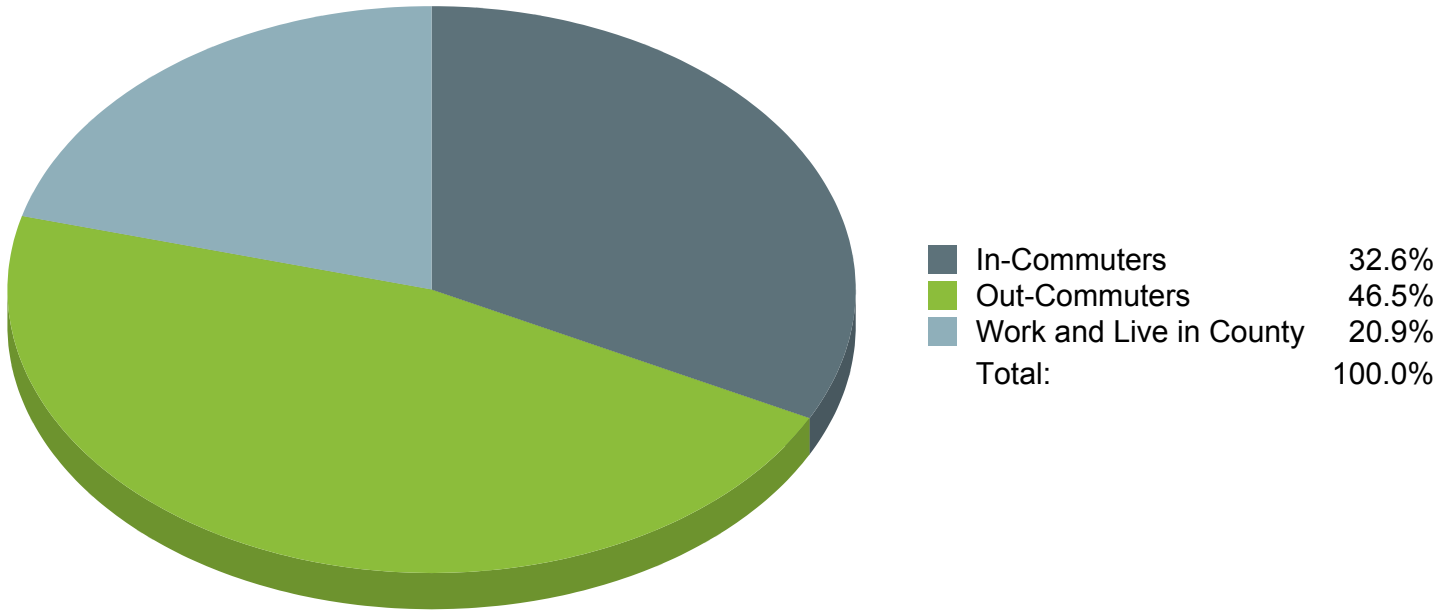

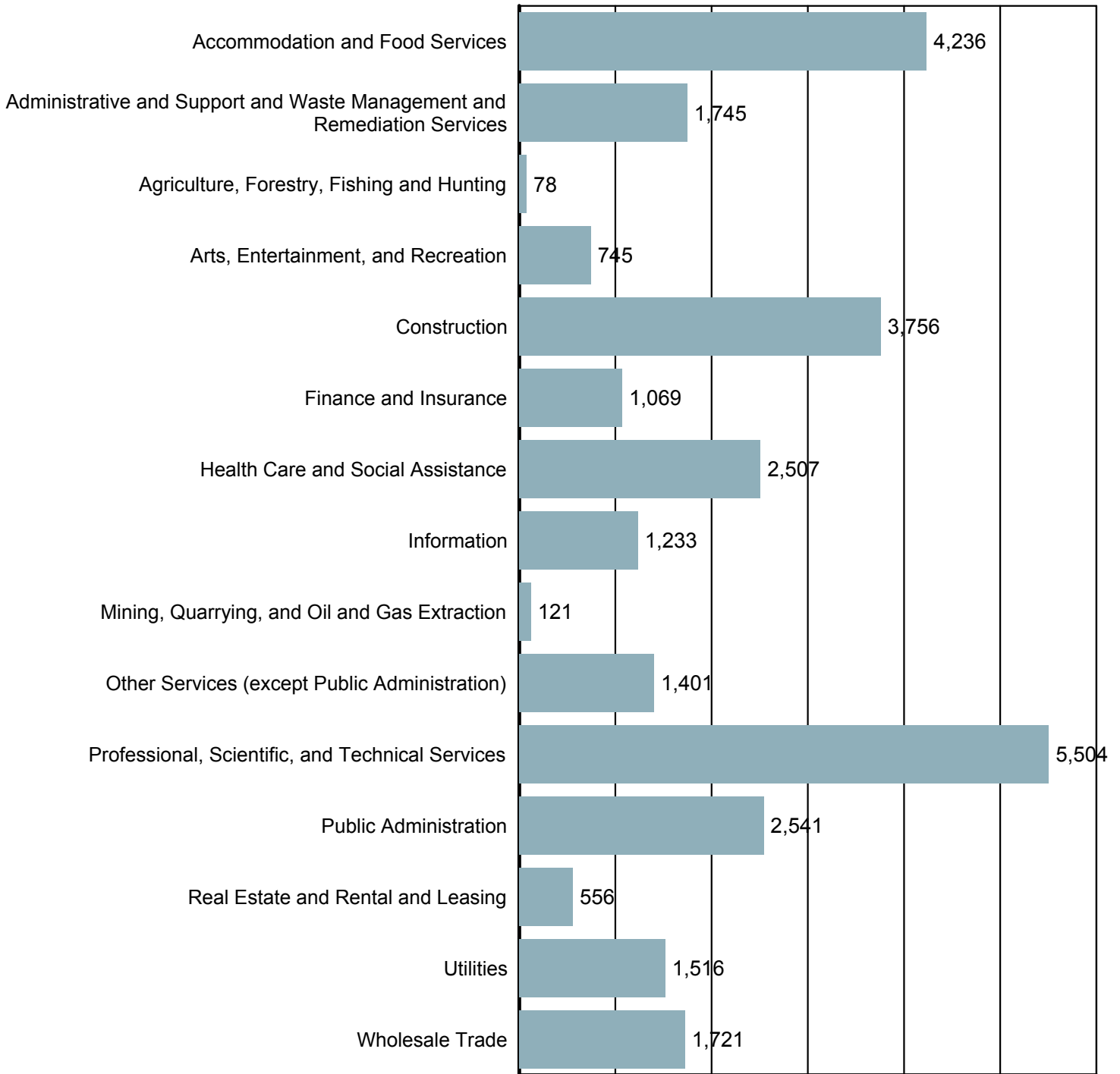

### Employment by Industry

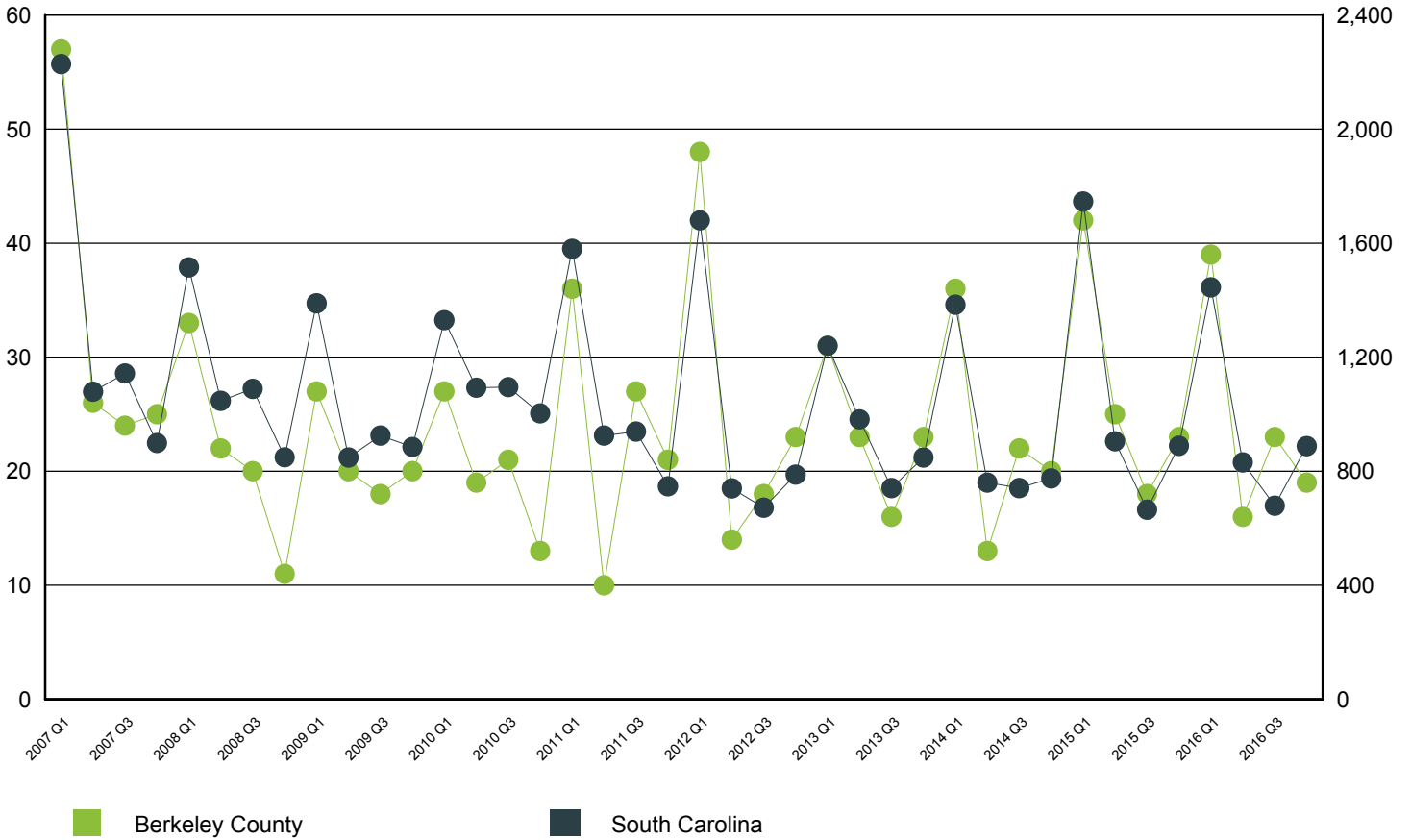

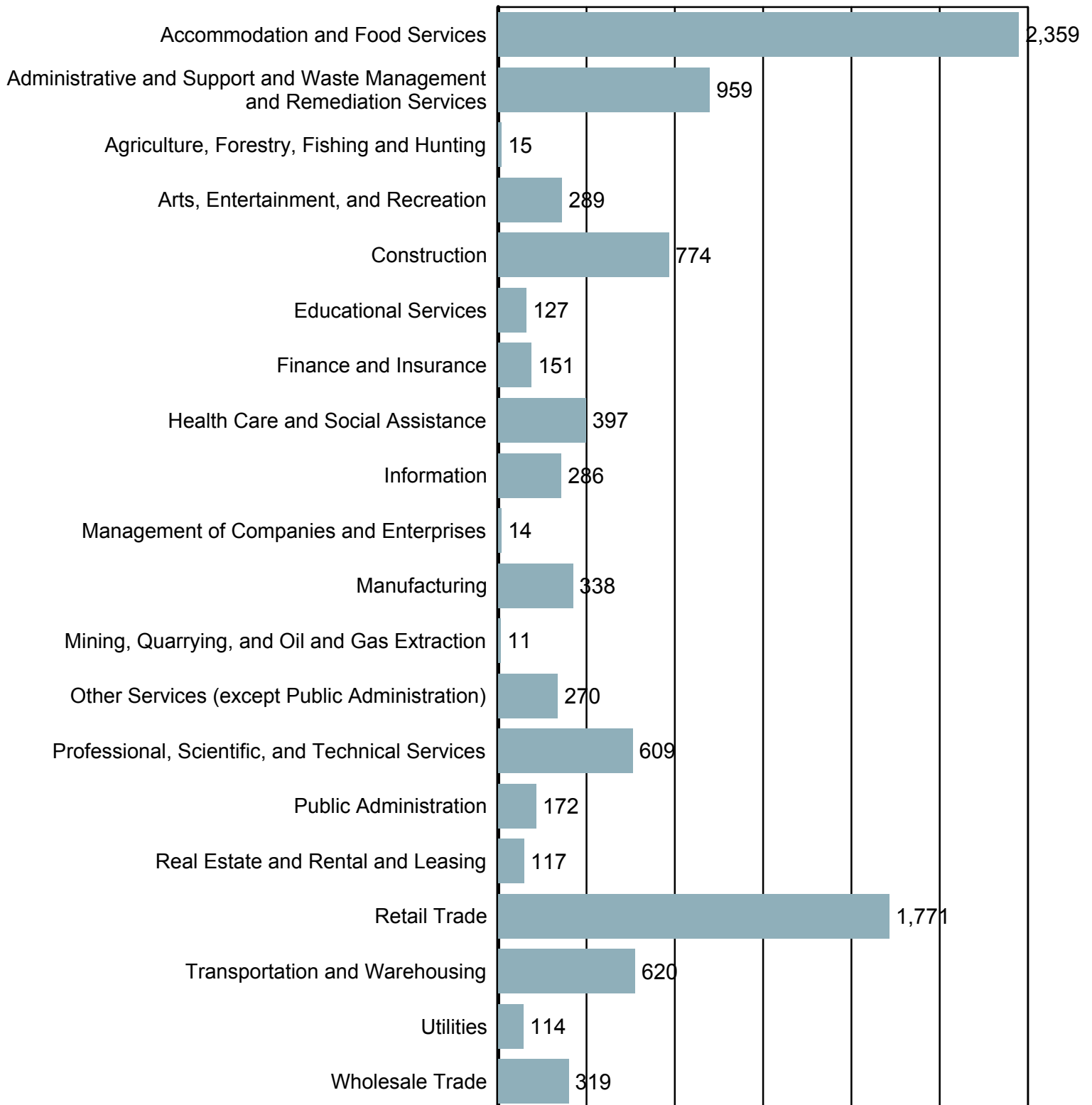

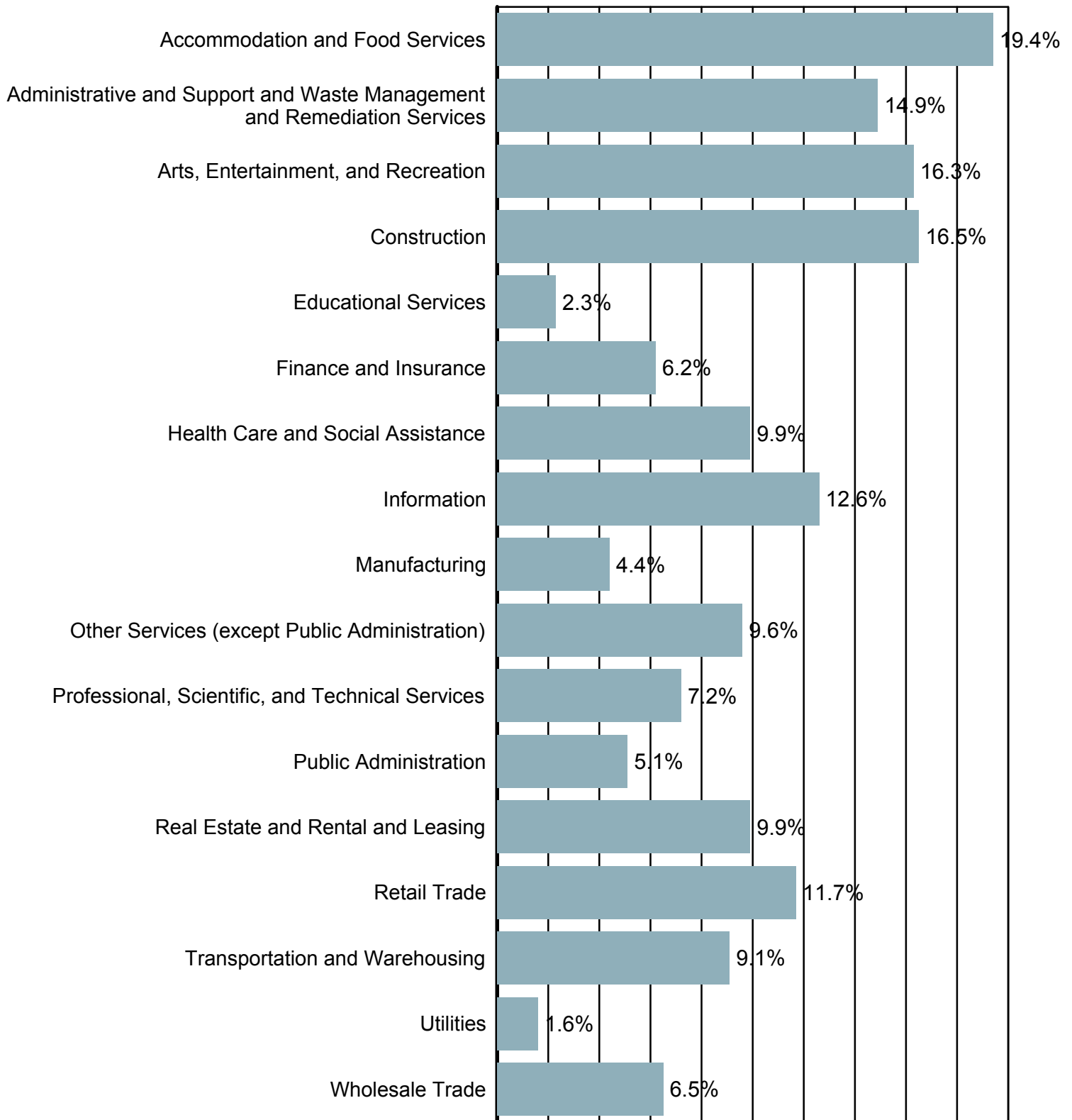

### New Hires by Industry



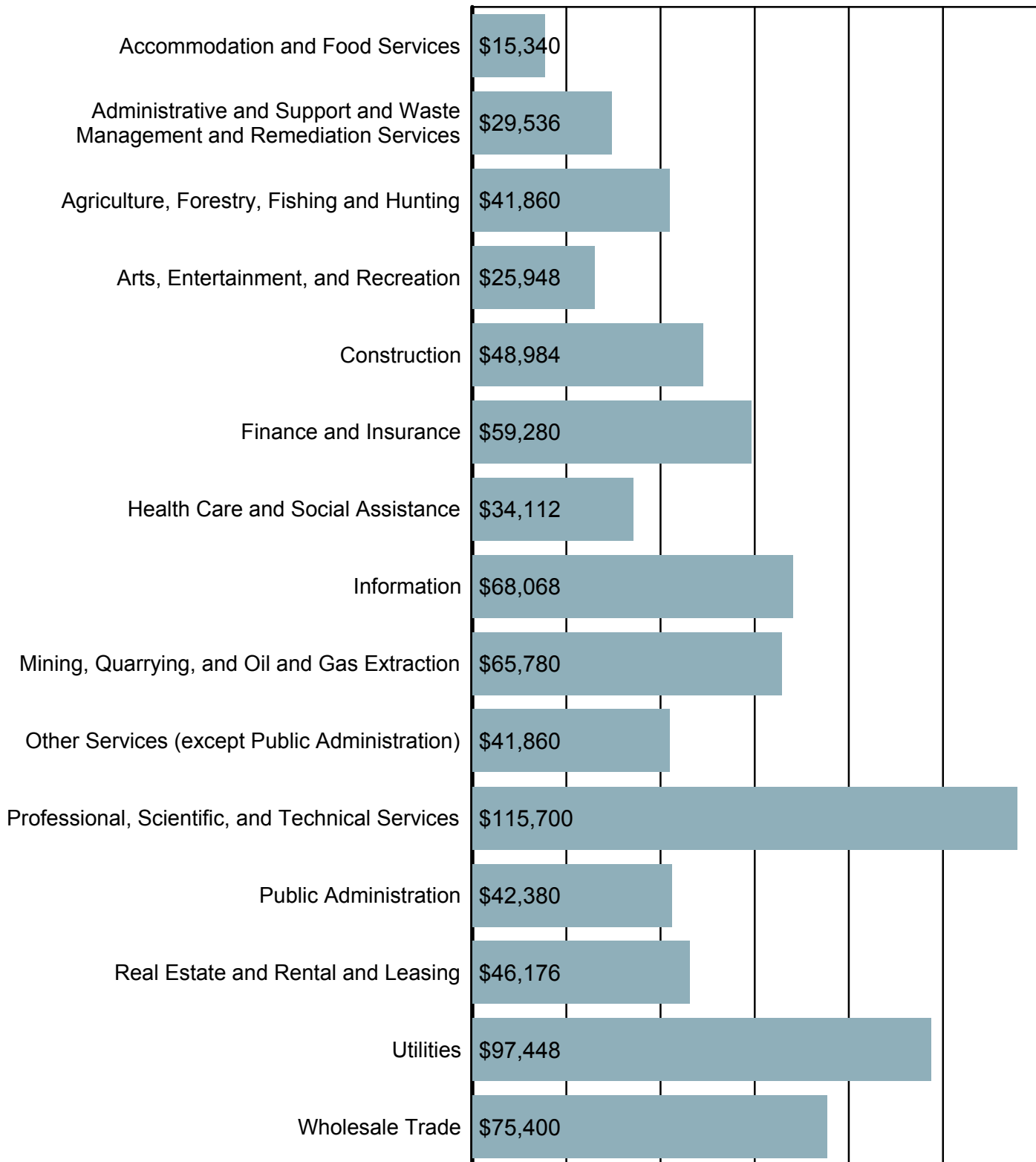

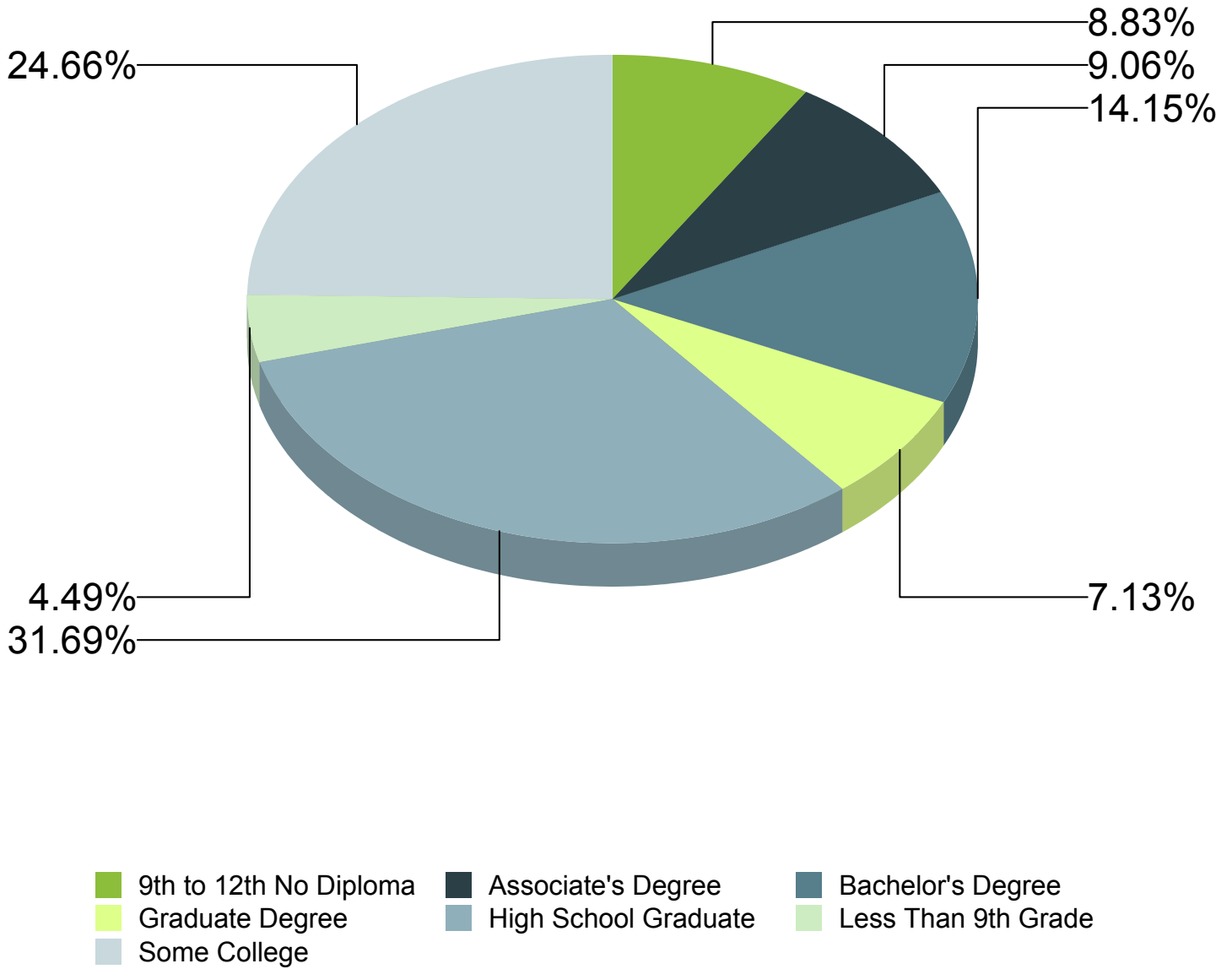
