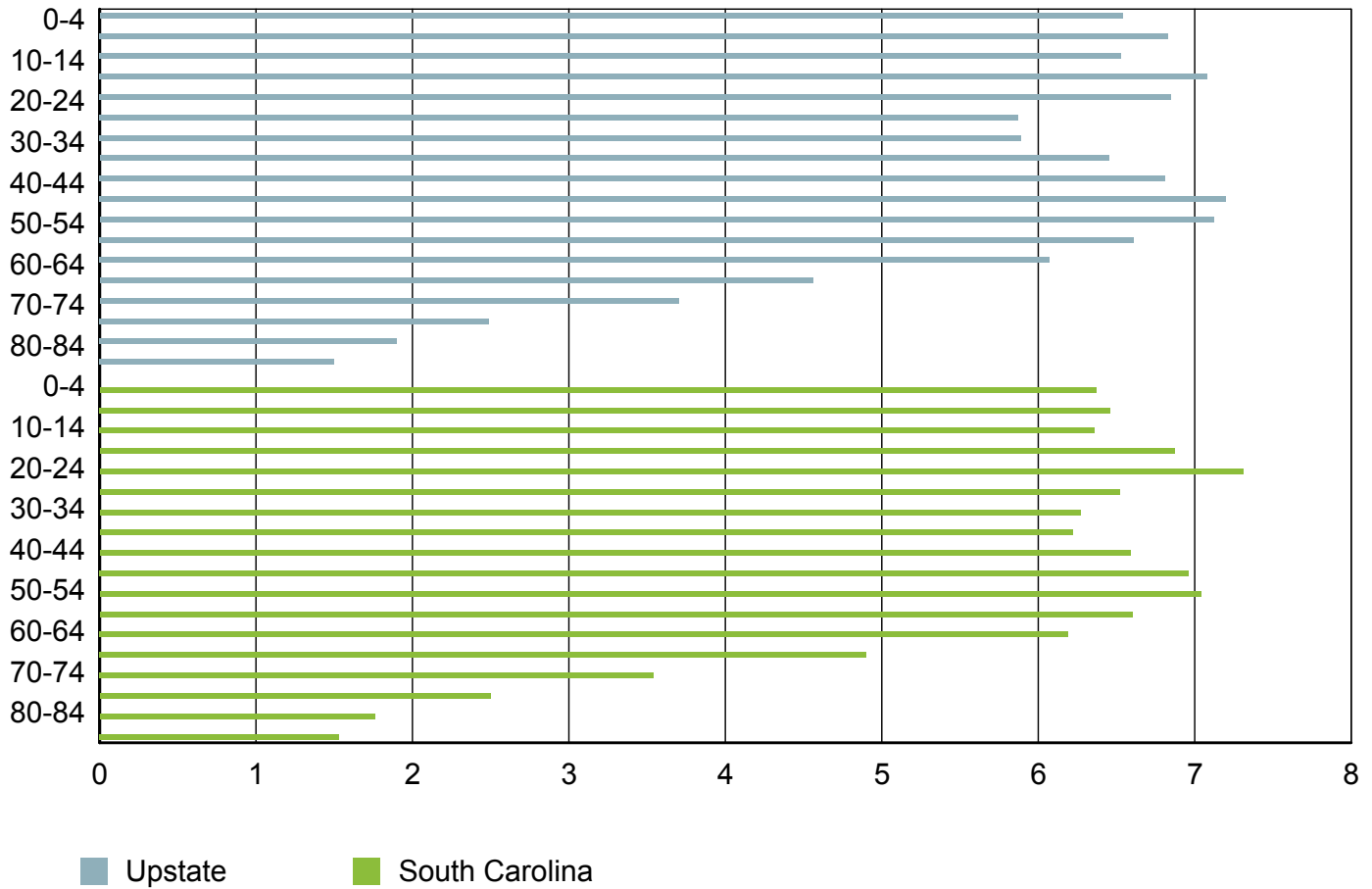

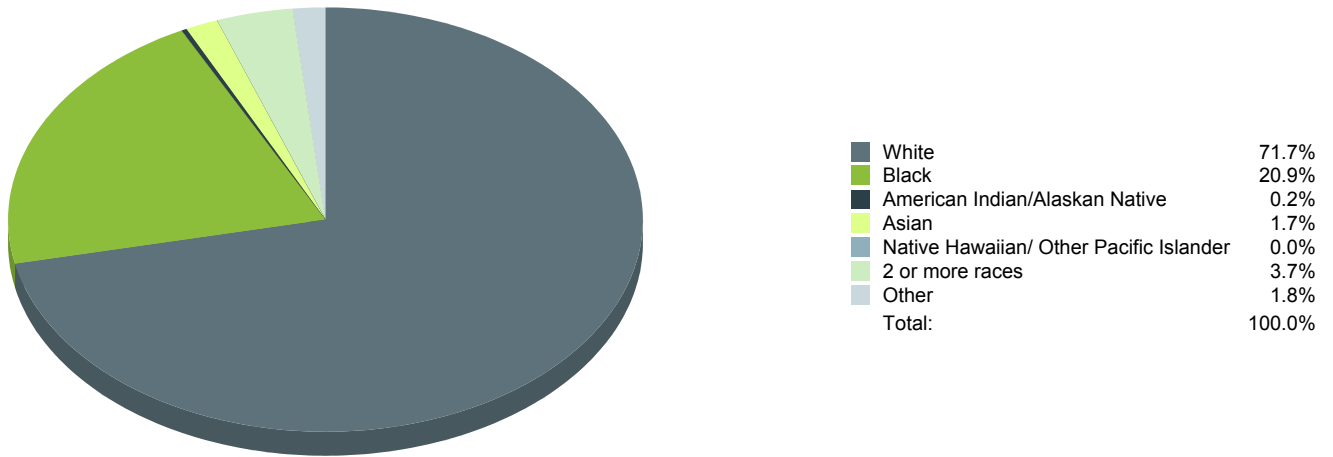

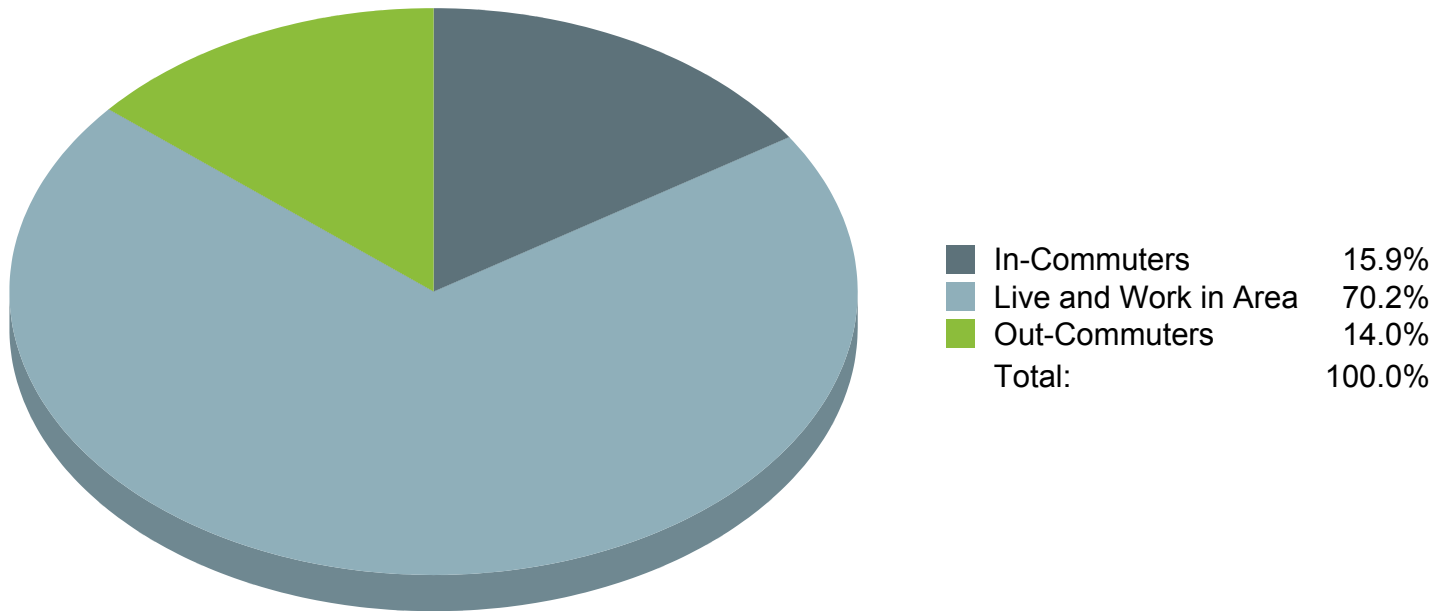

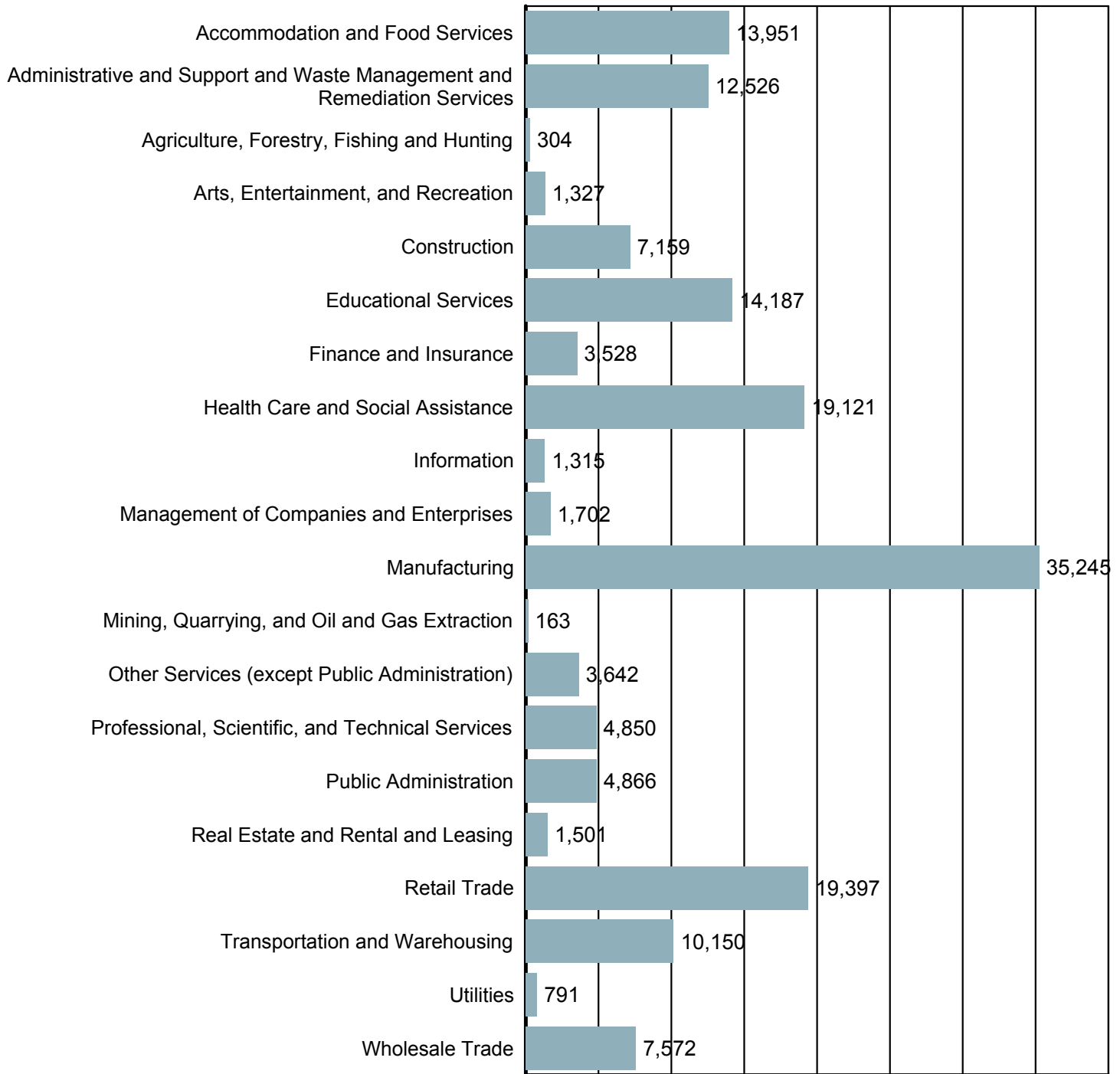

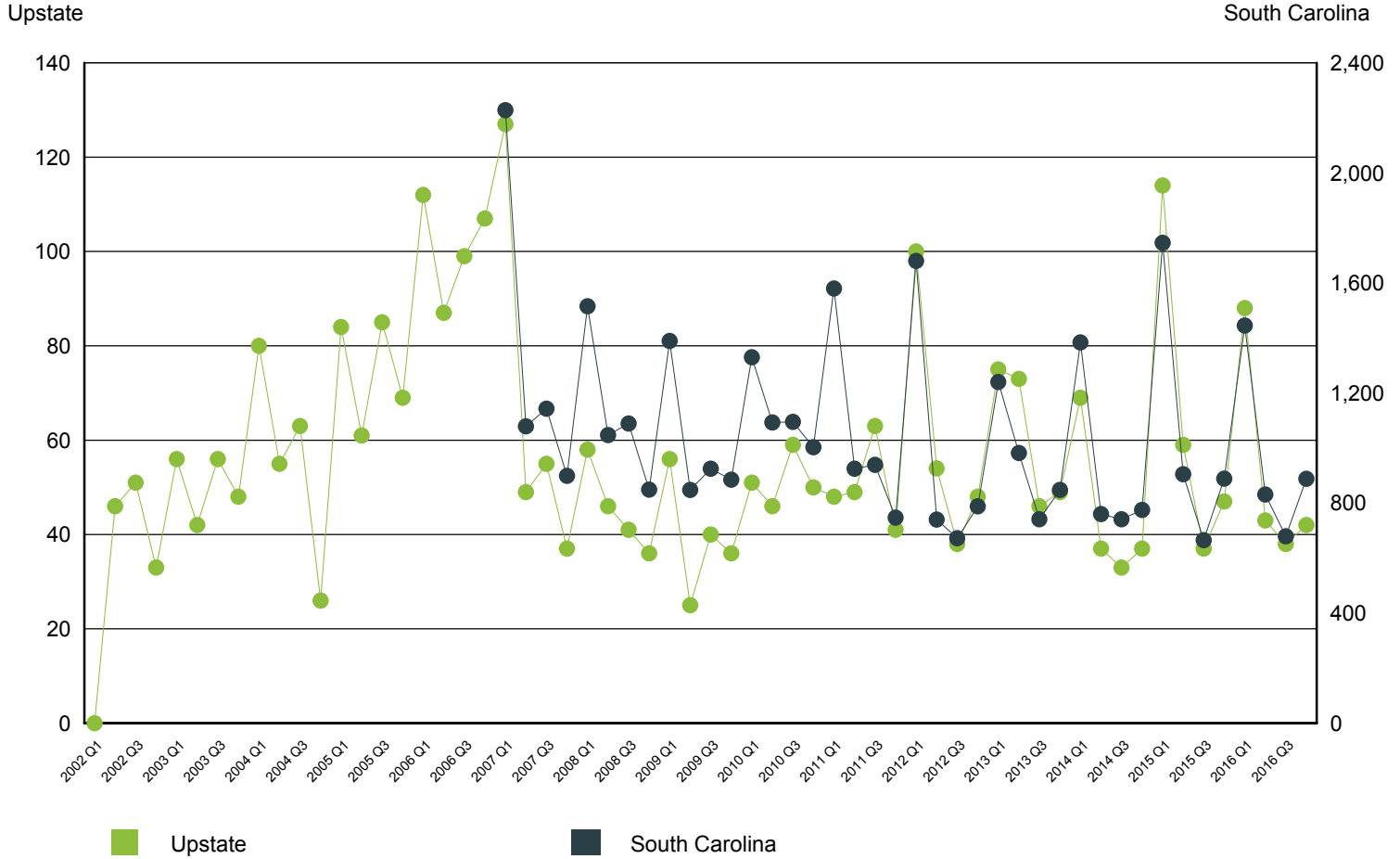


## Employment by Industry

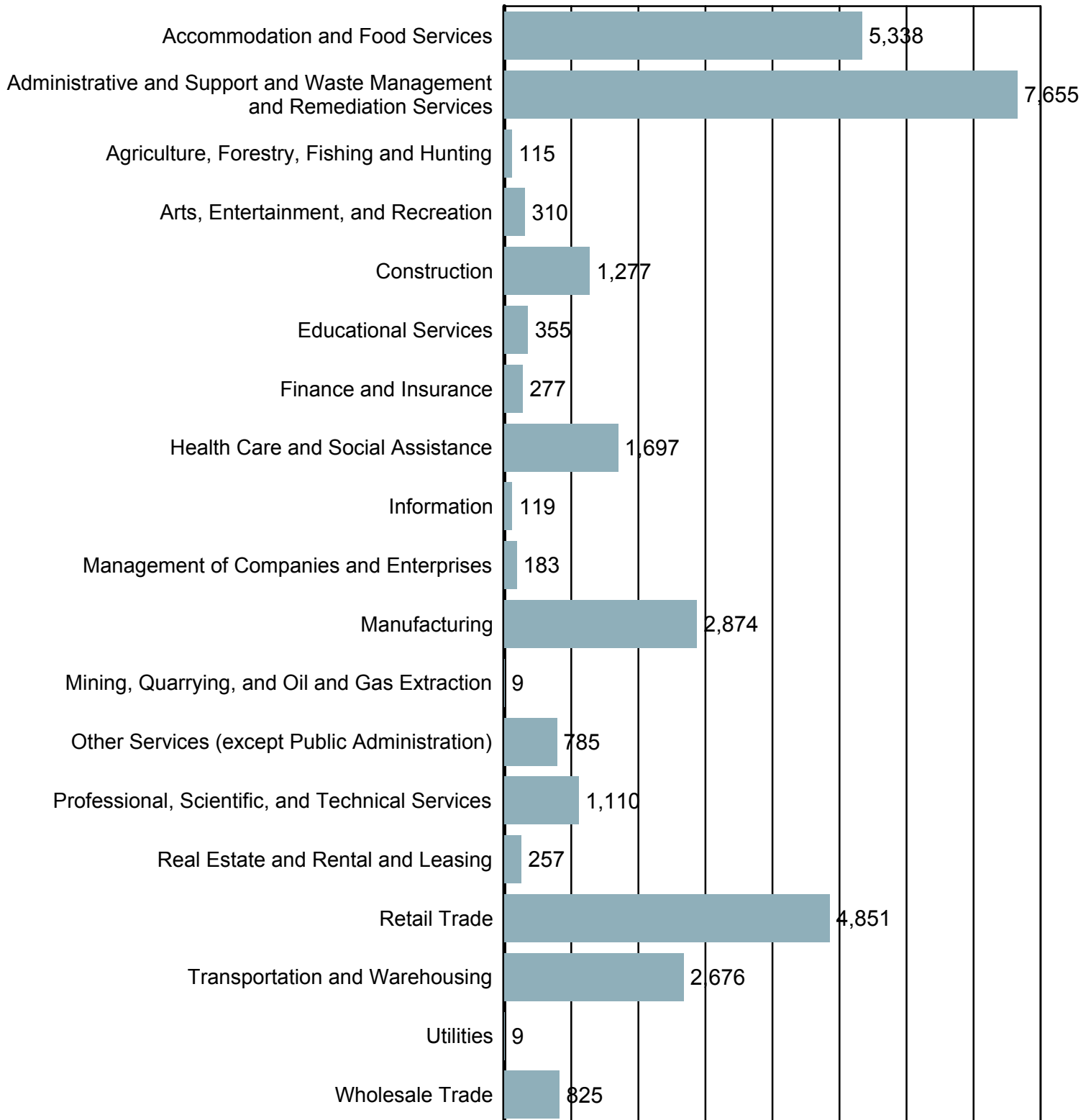

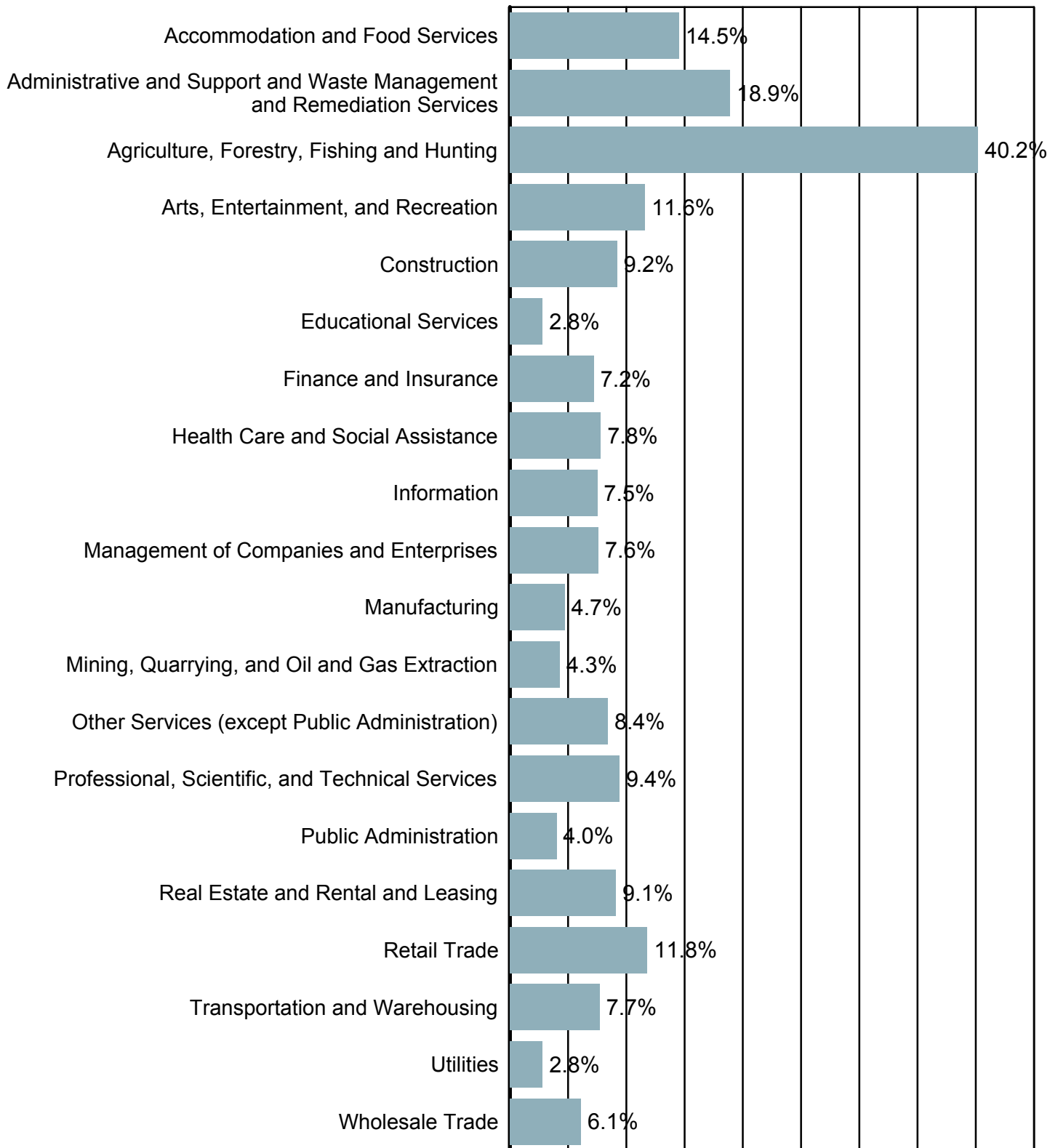

## New Hires by Industry



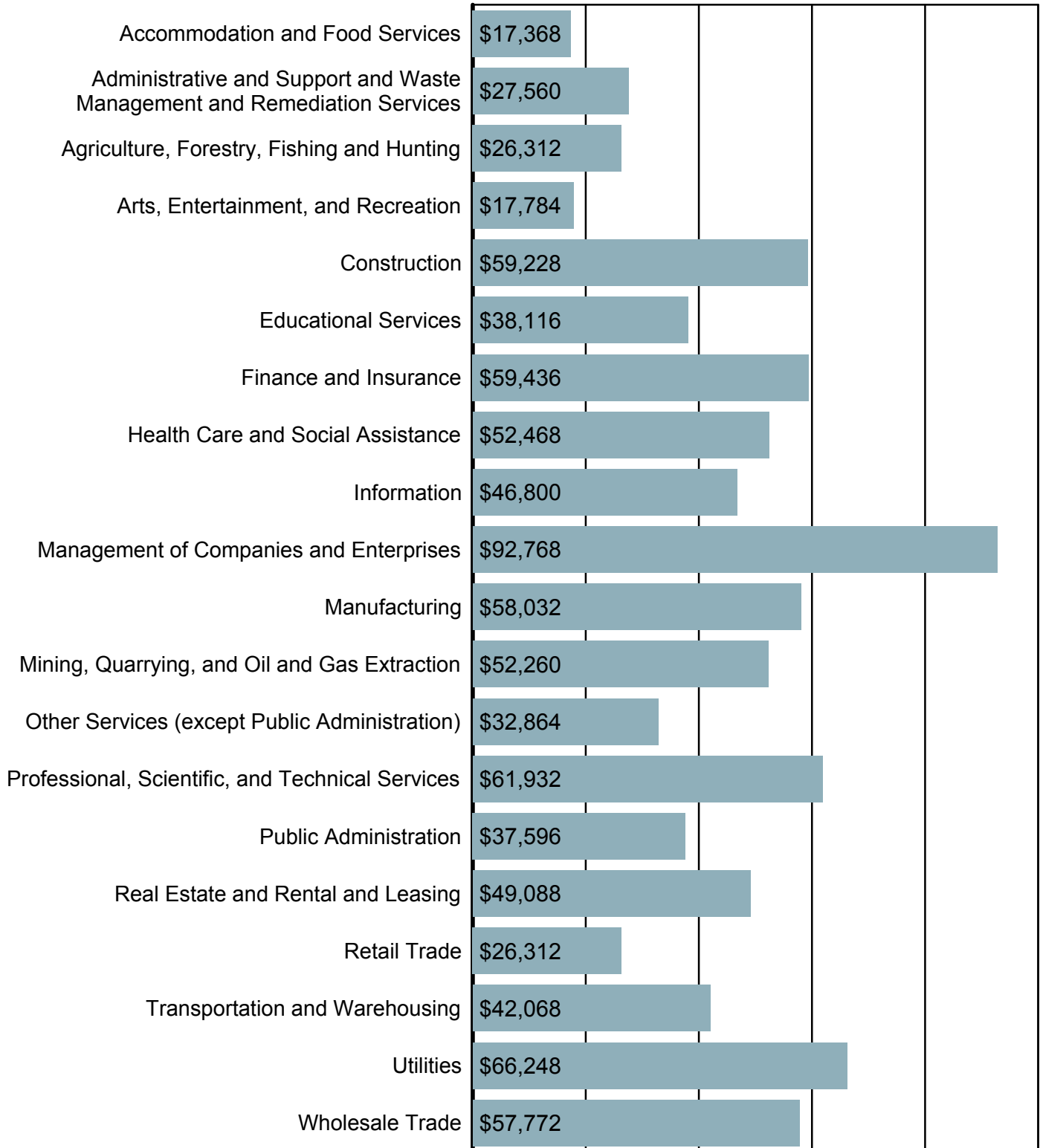

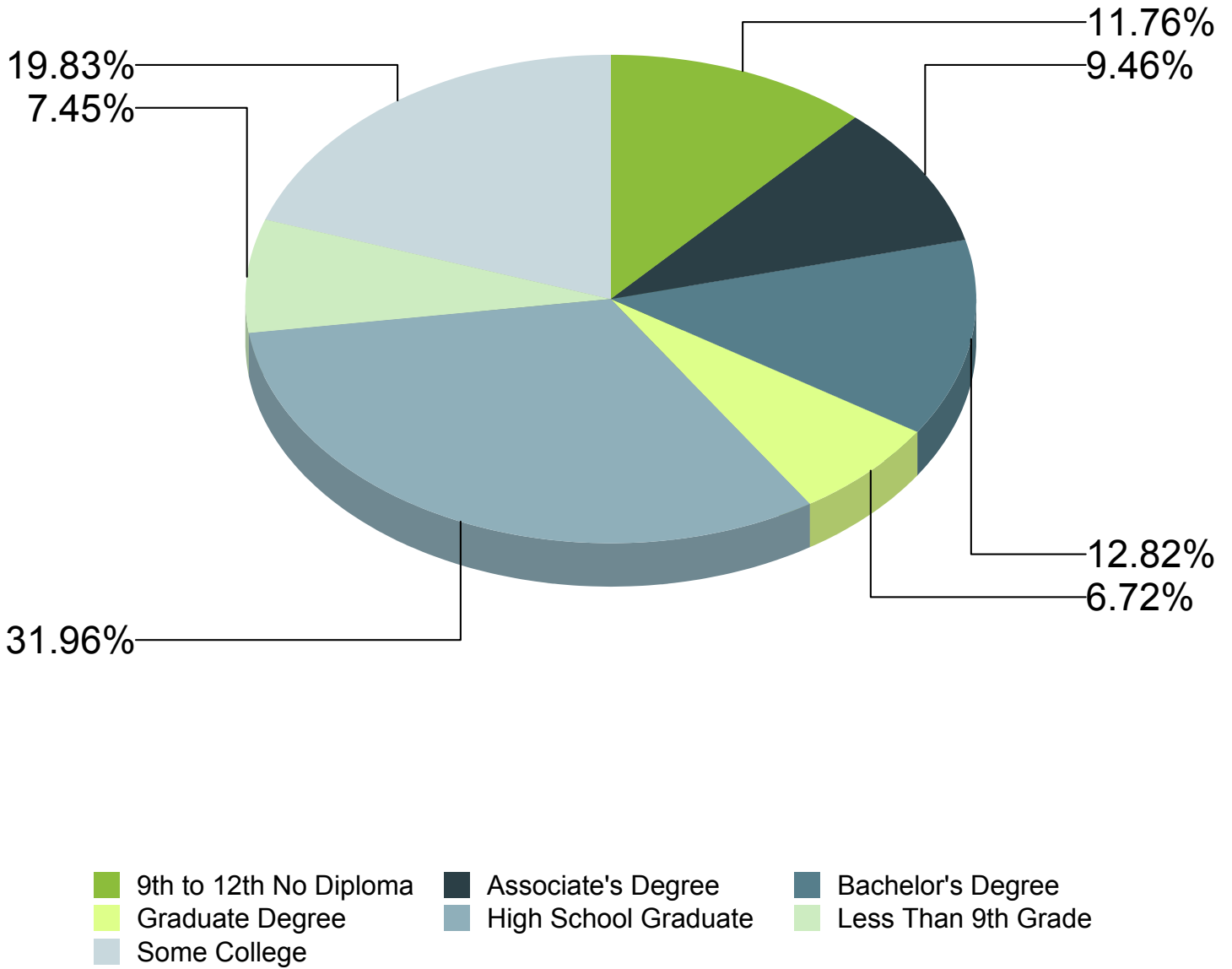

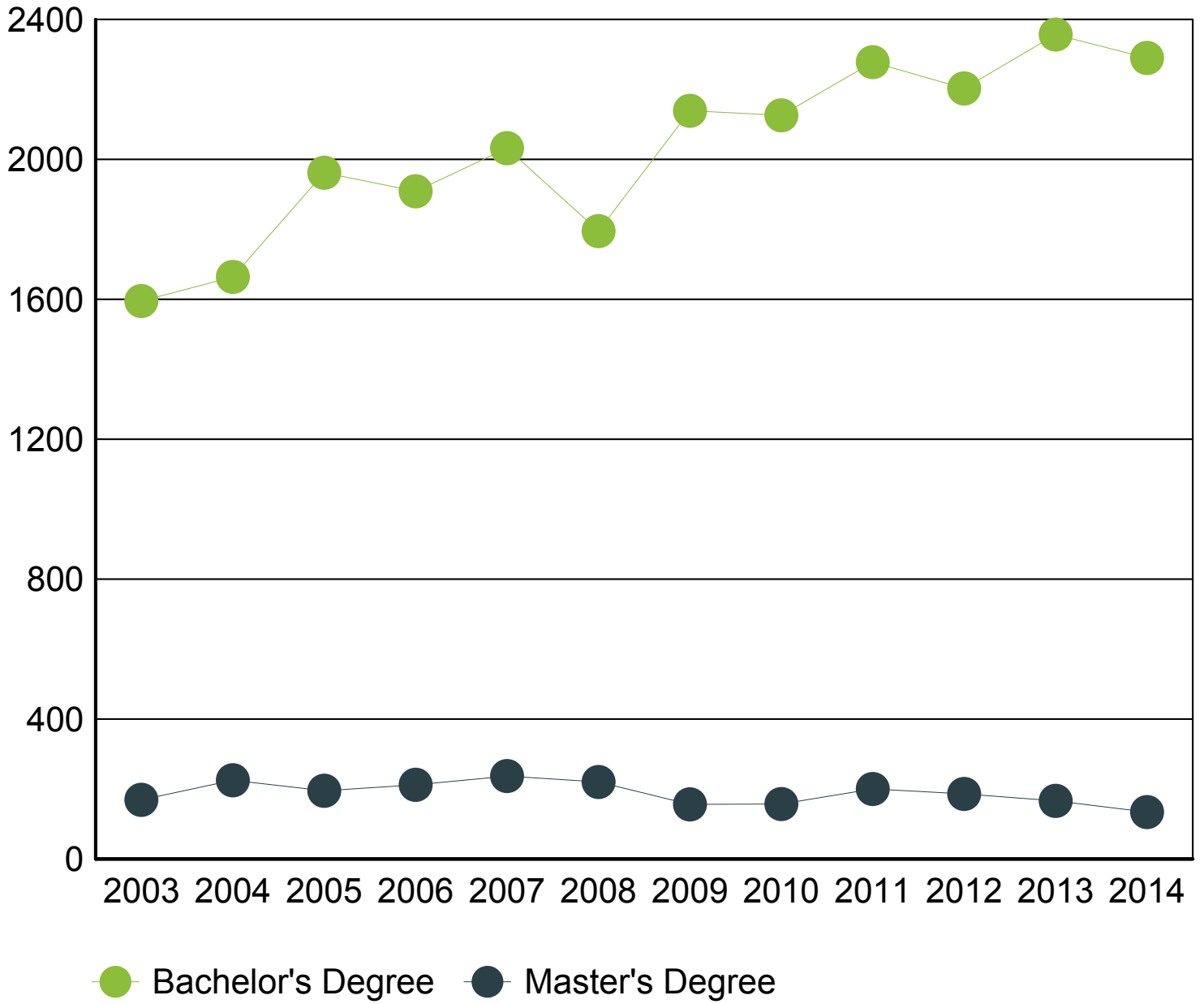
