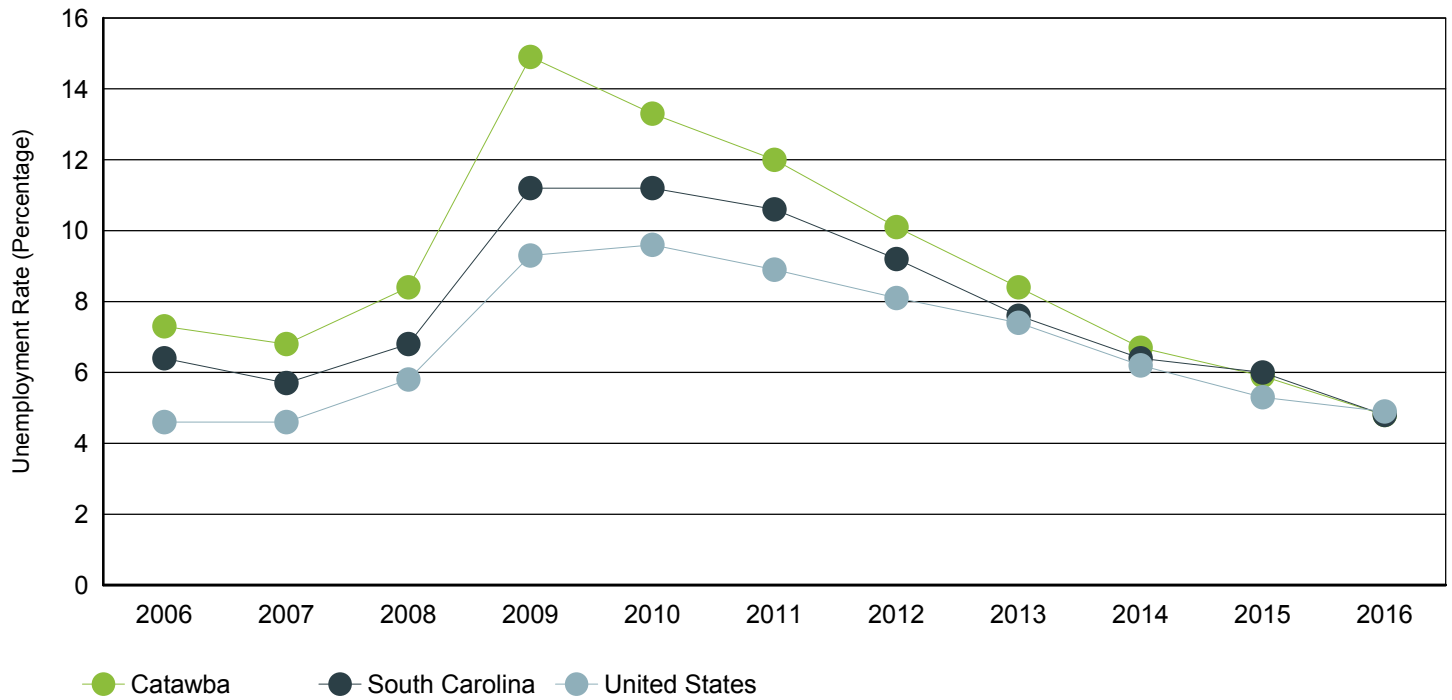

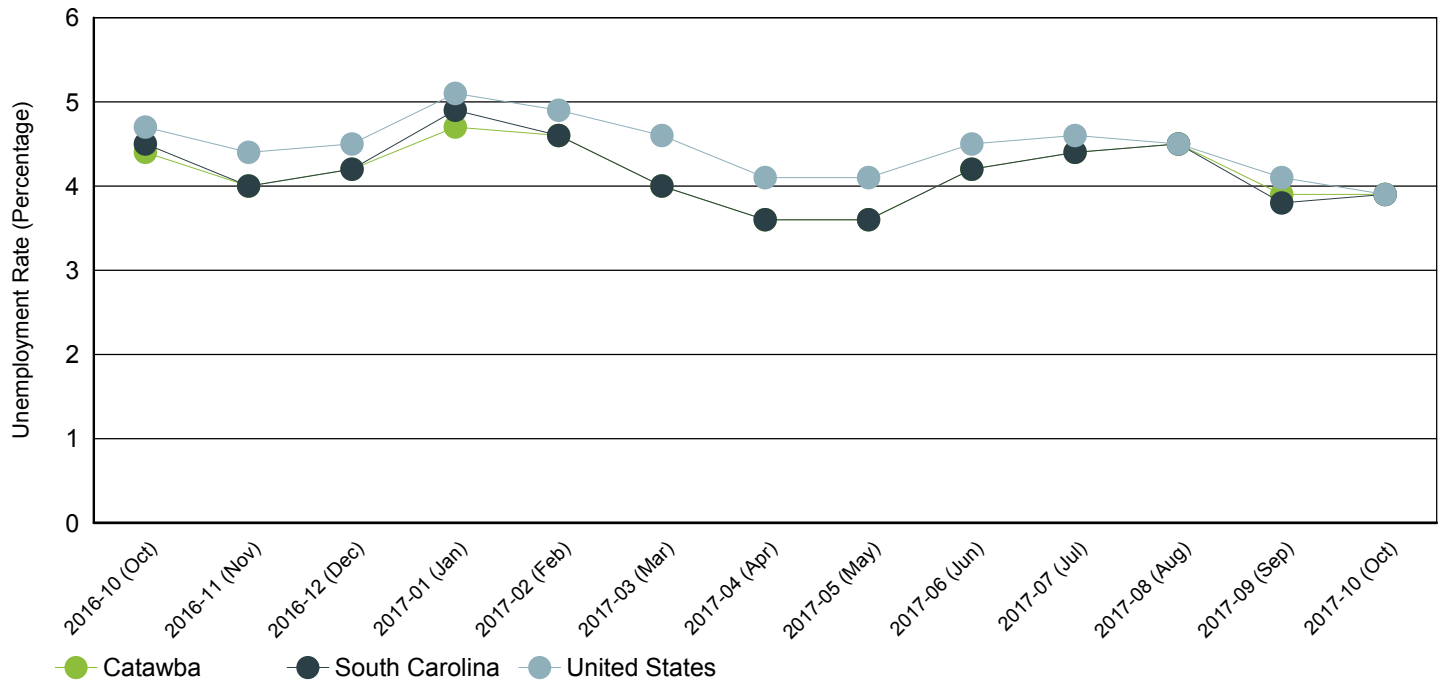

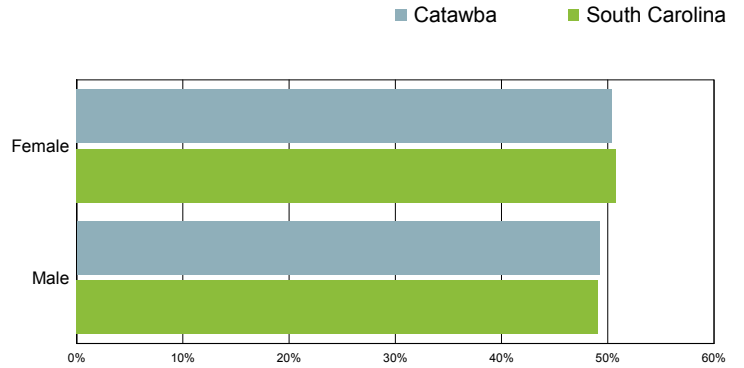

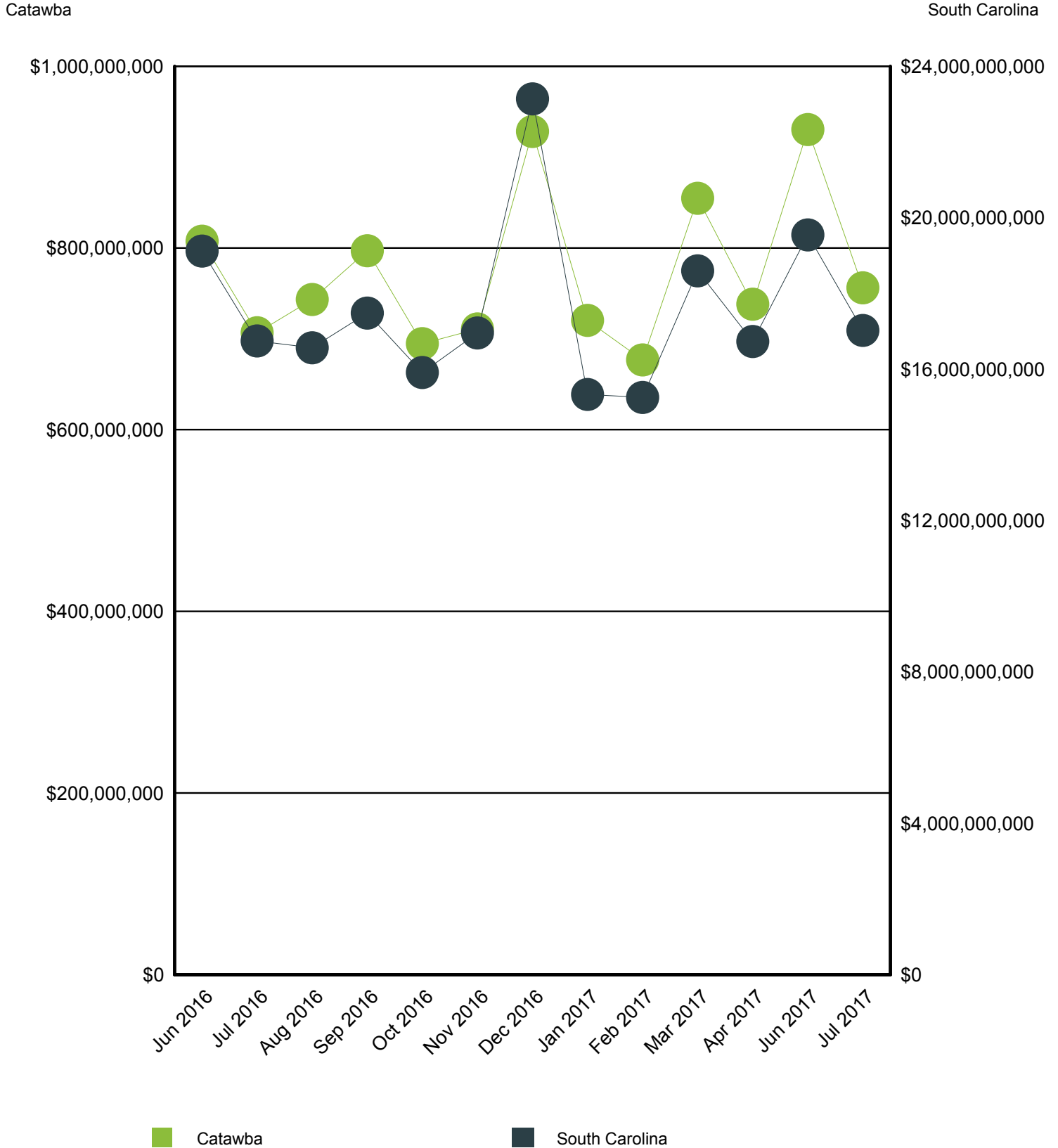

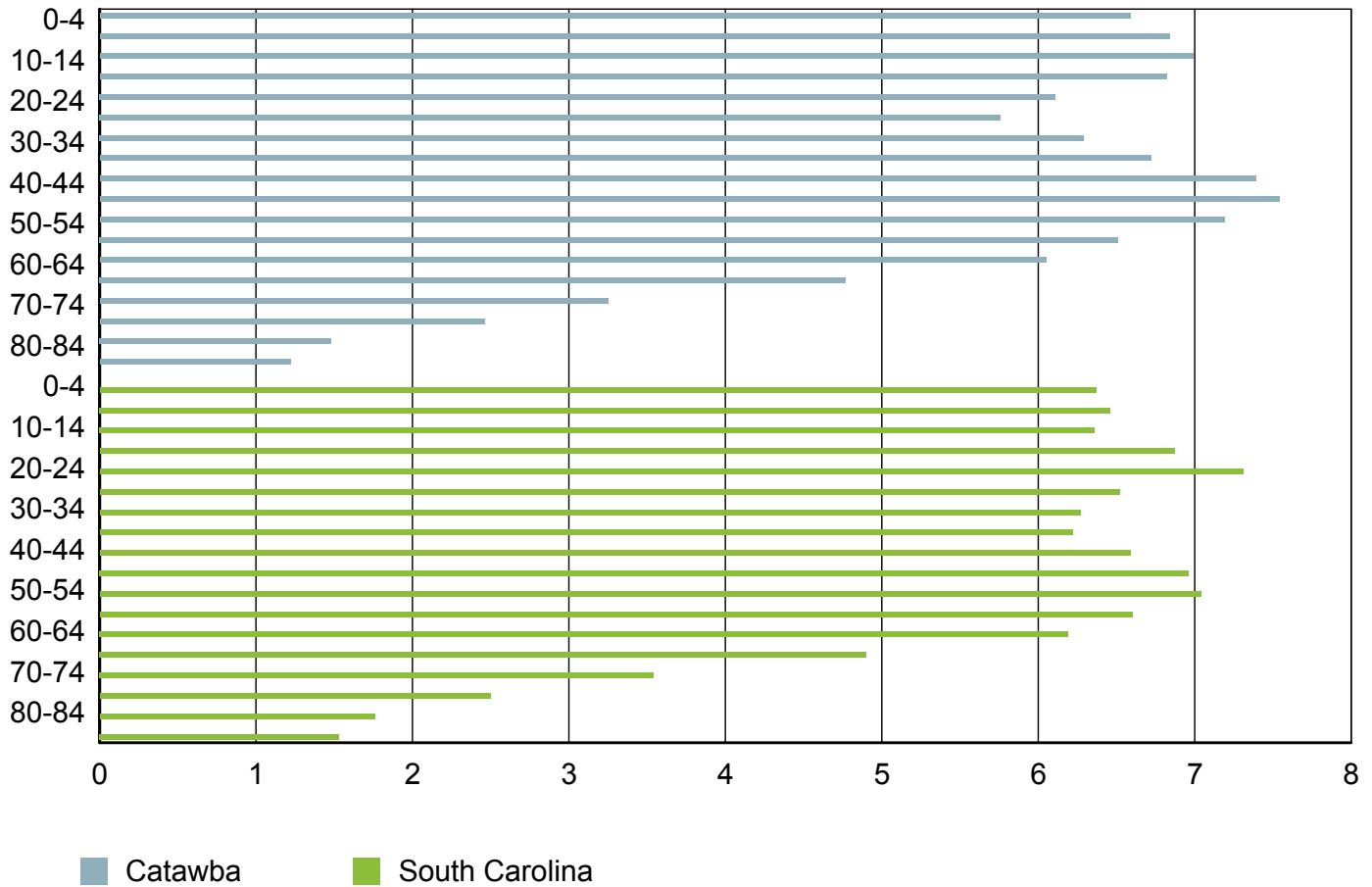

Population by Age



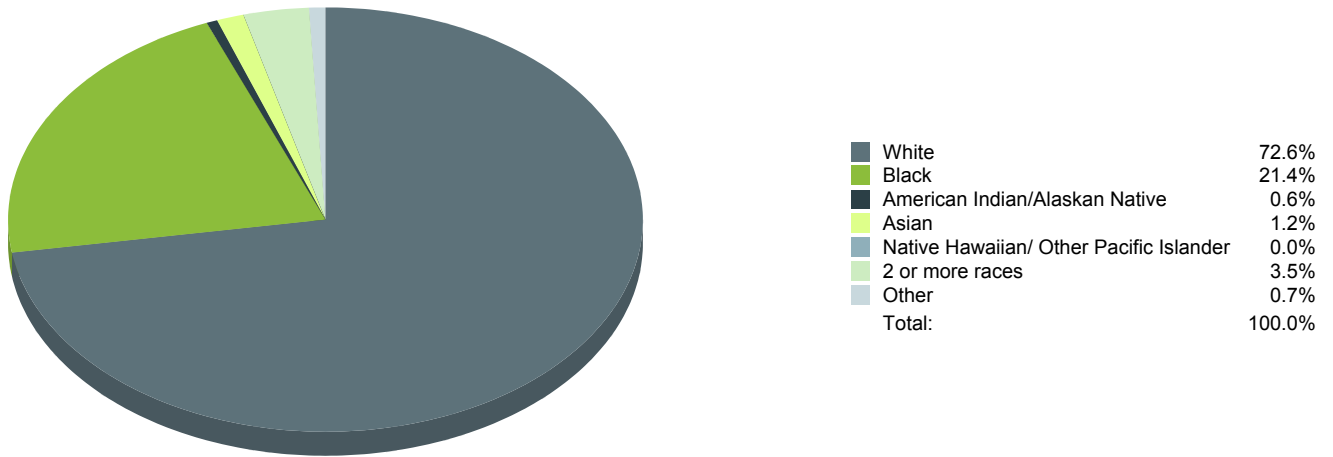

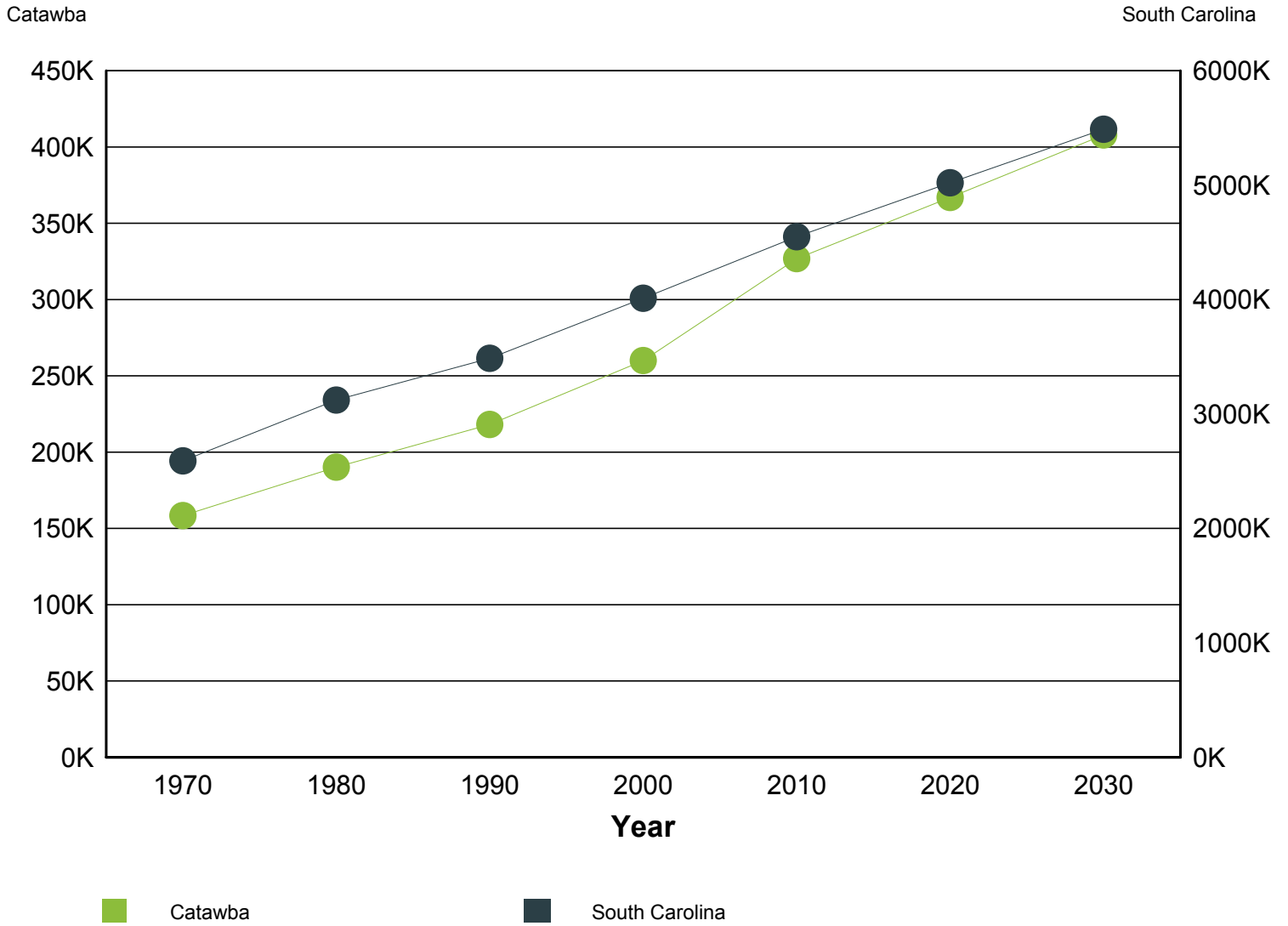

Population Change

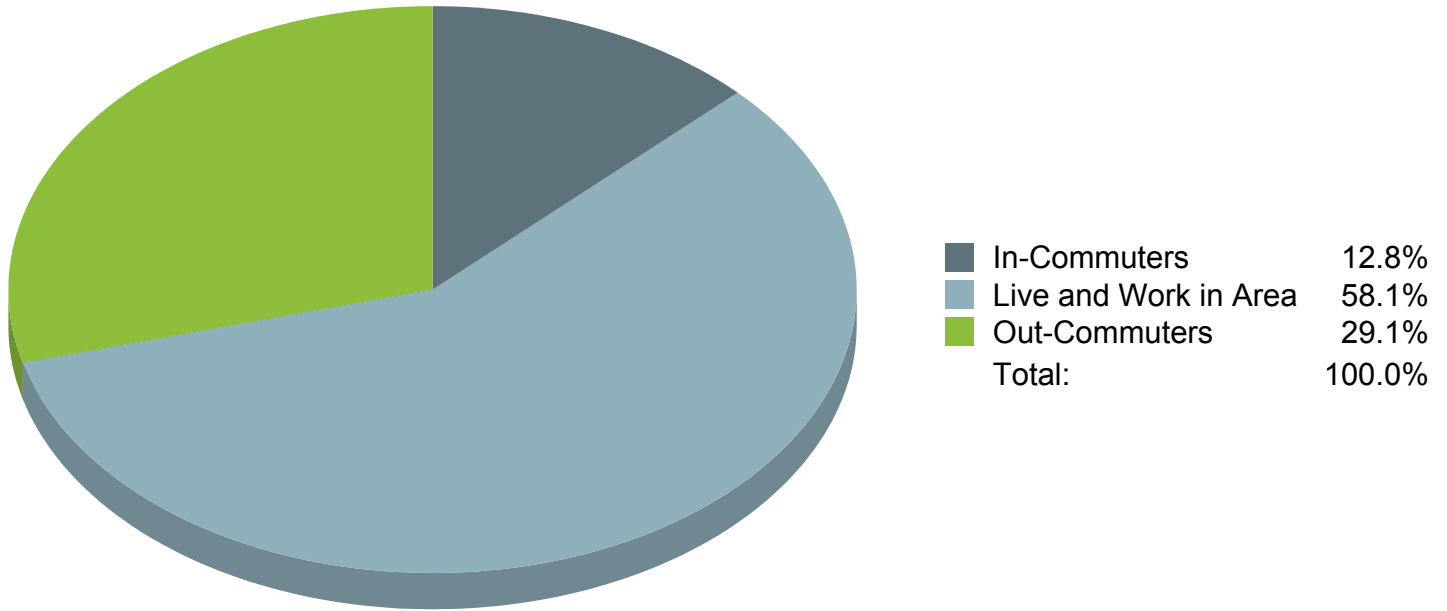

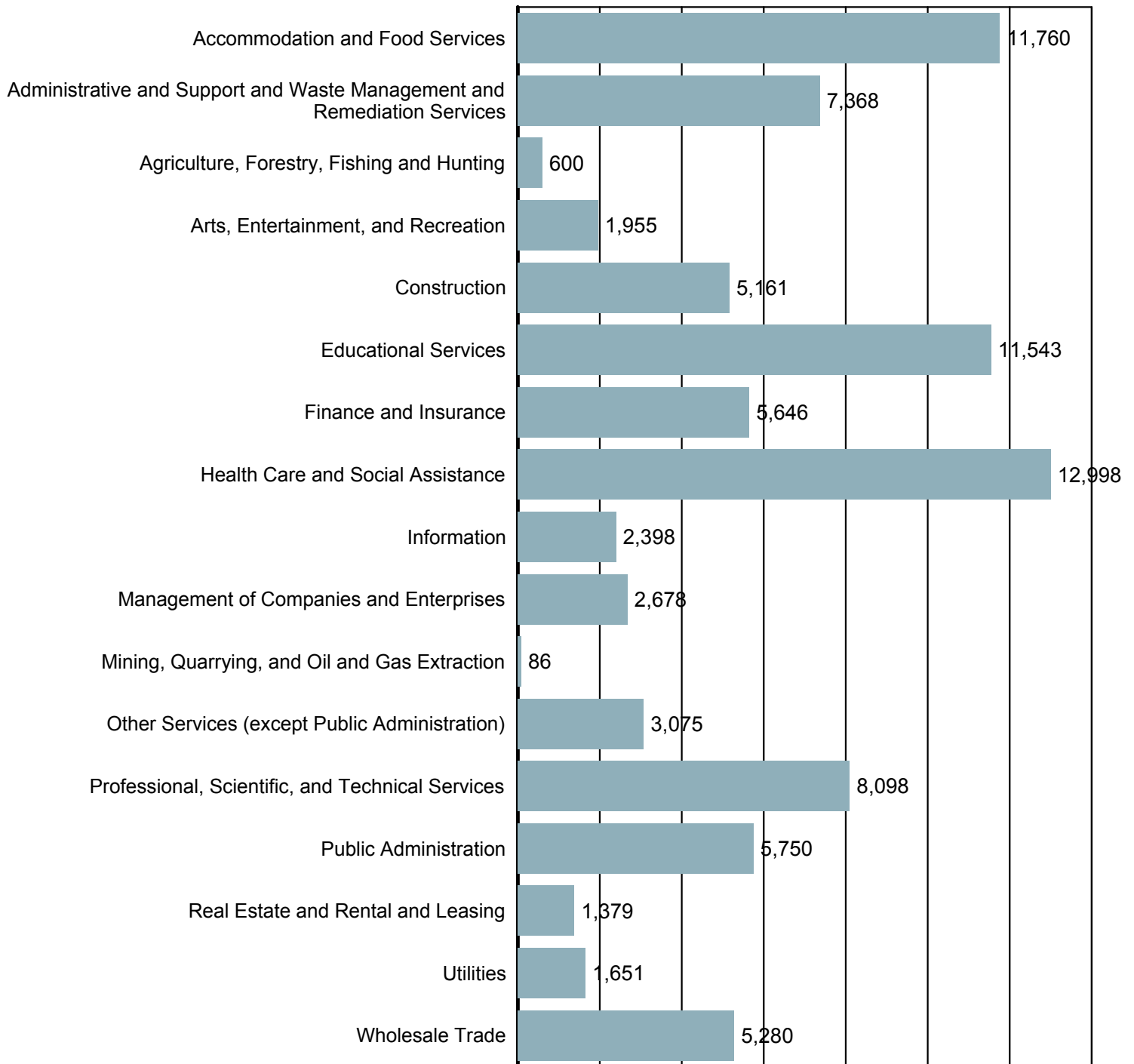

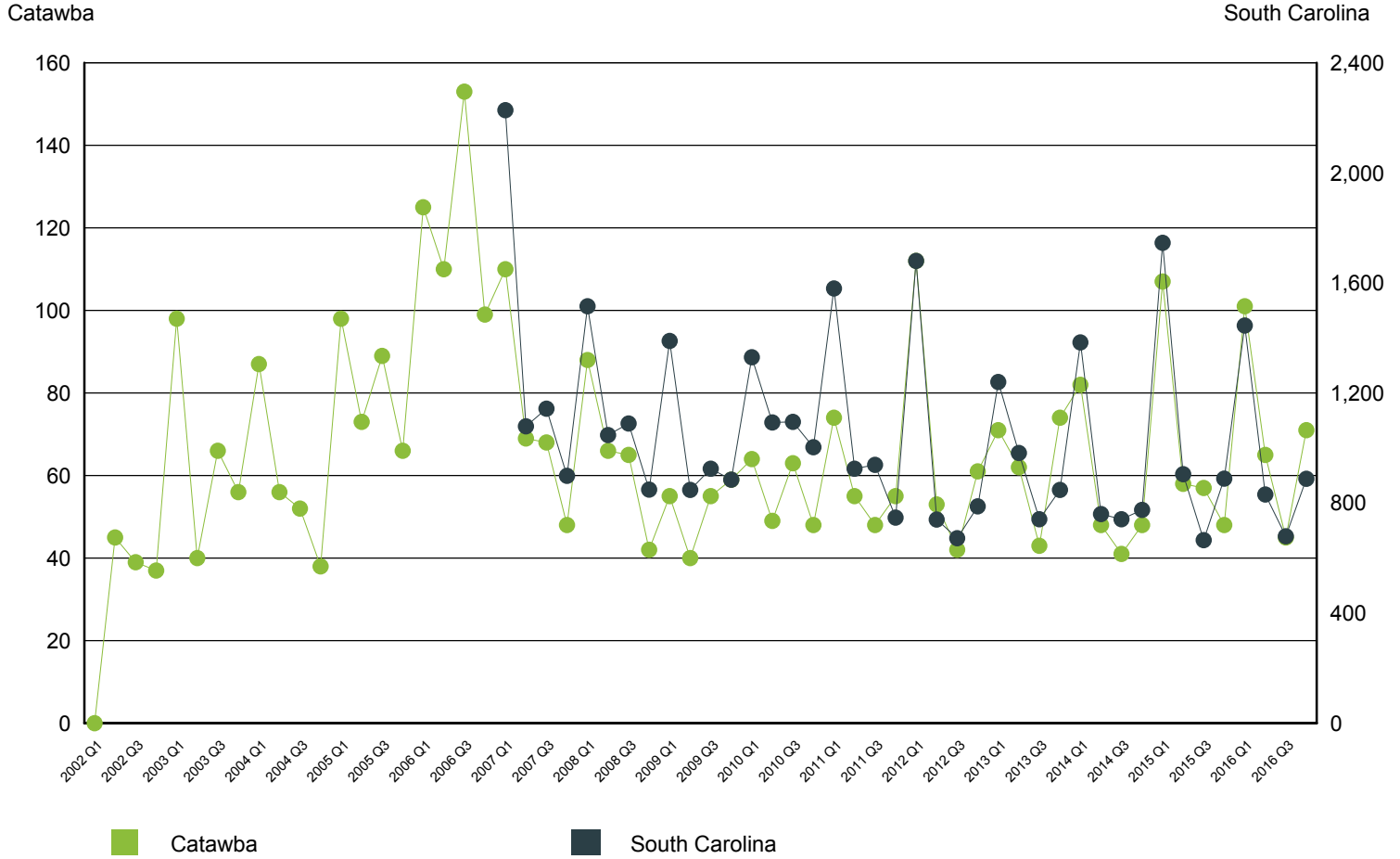

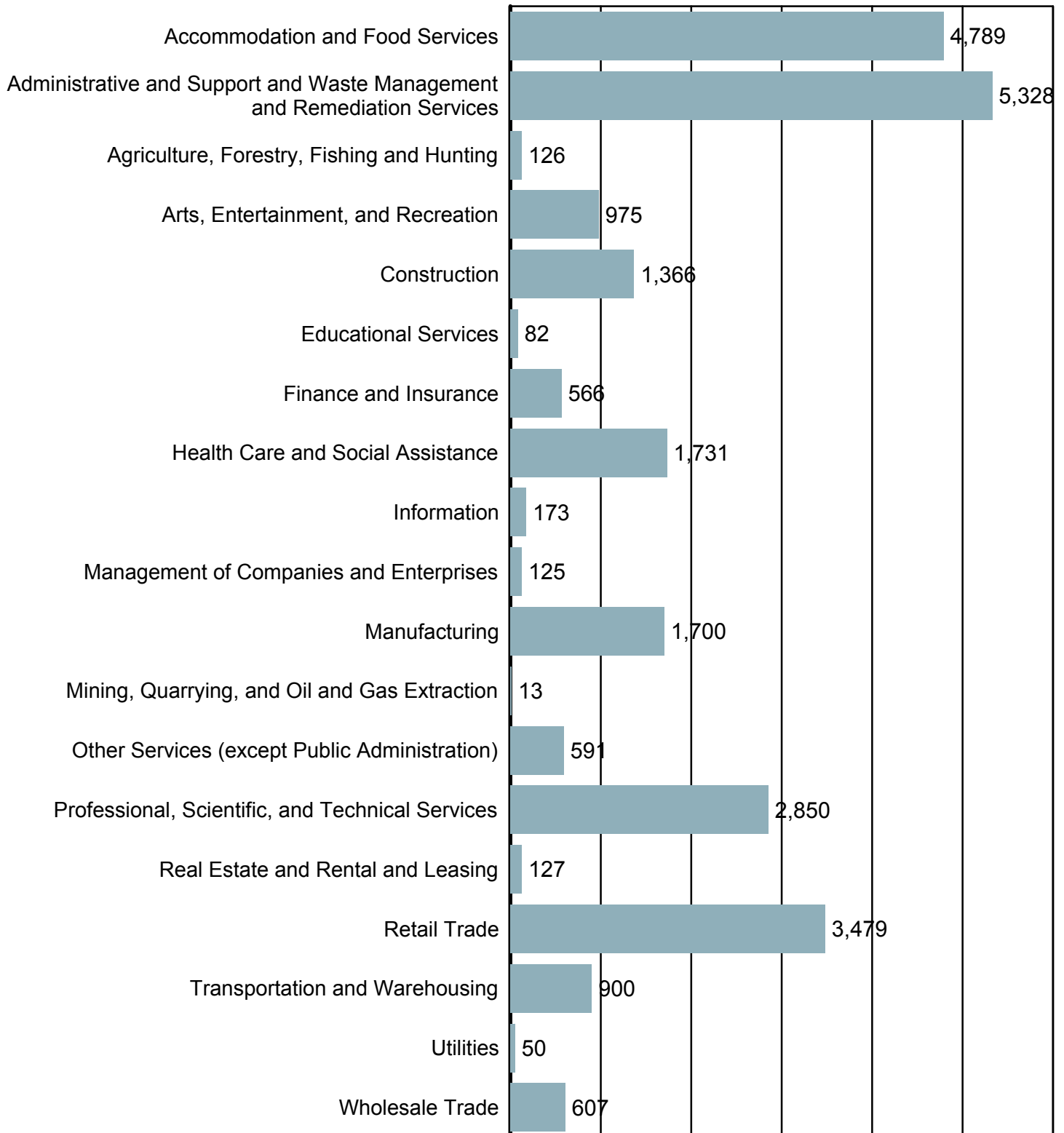

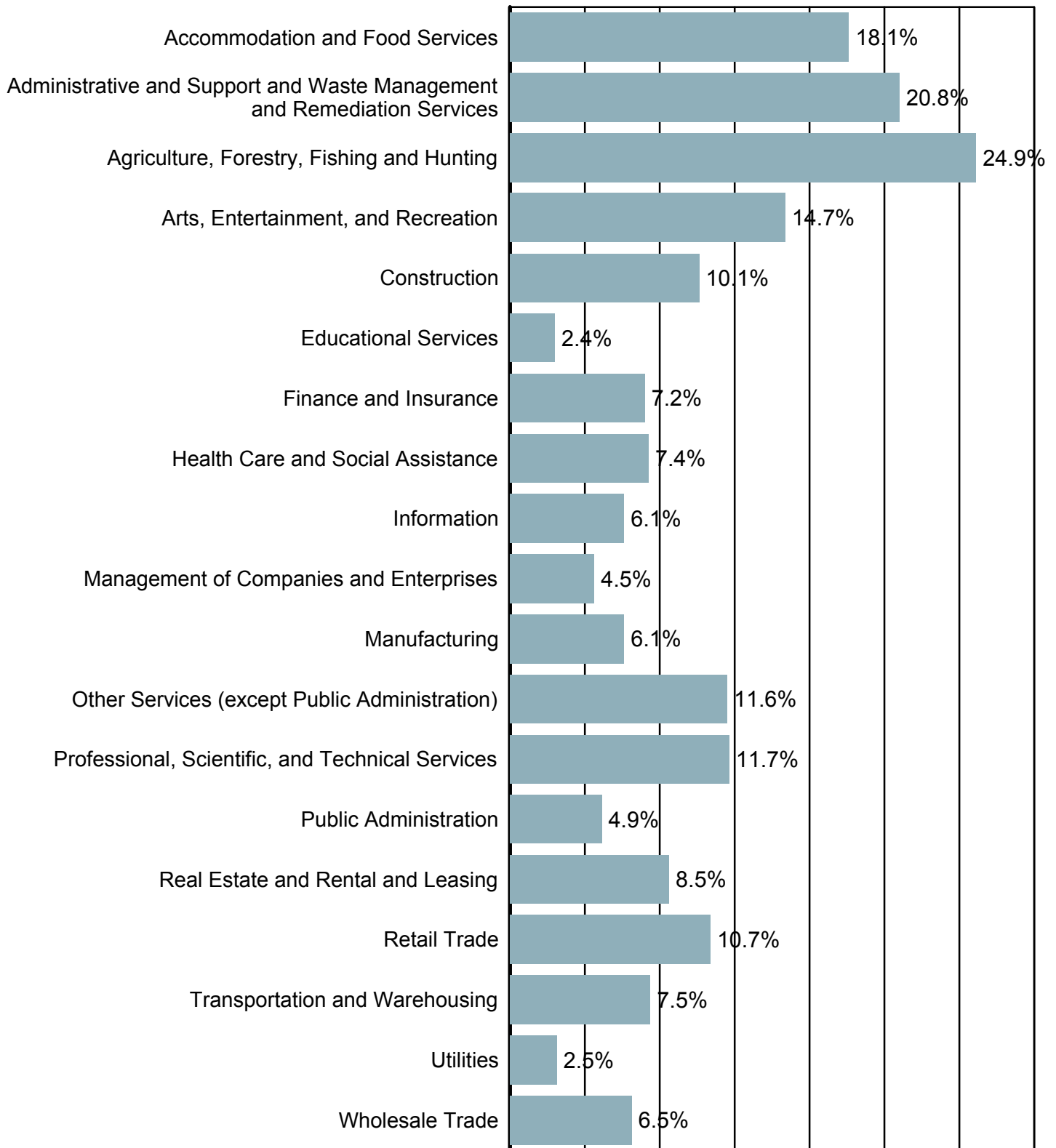

New Hires by Industry



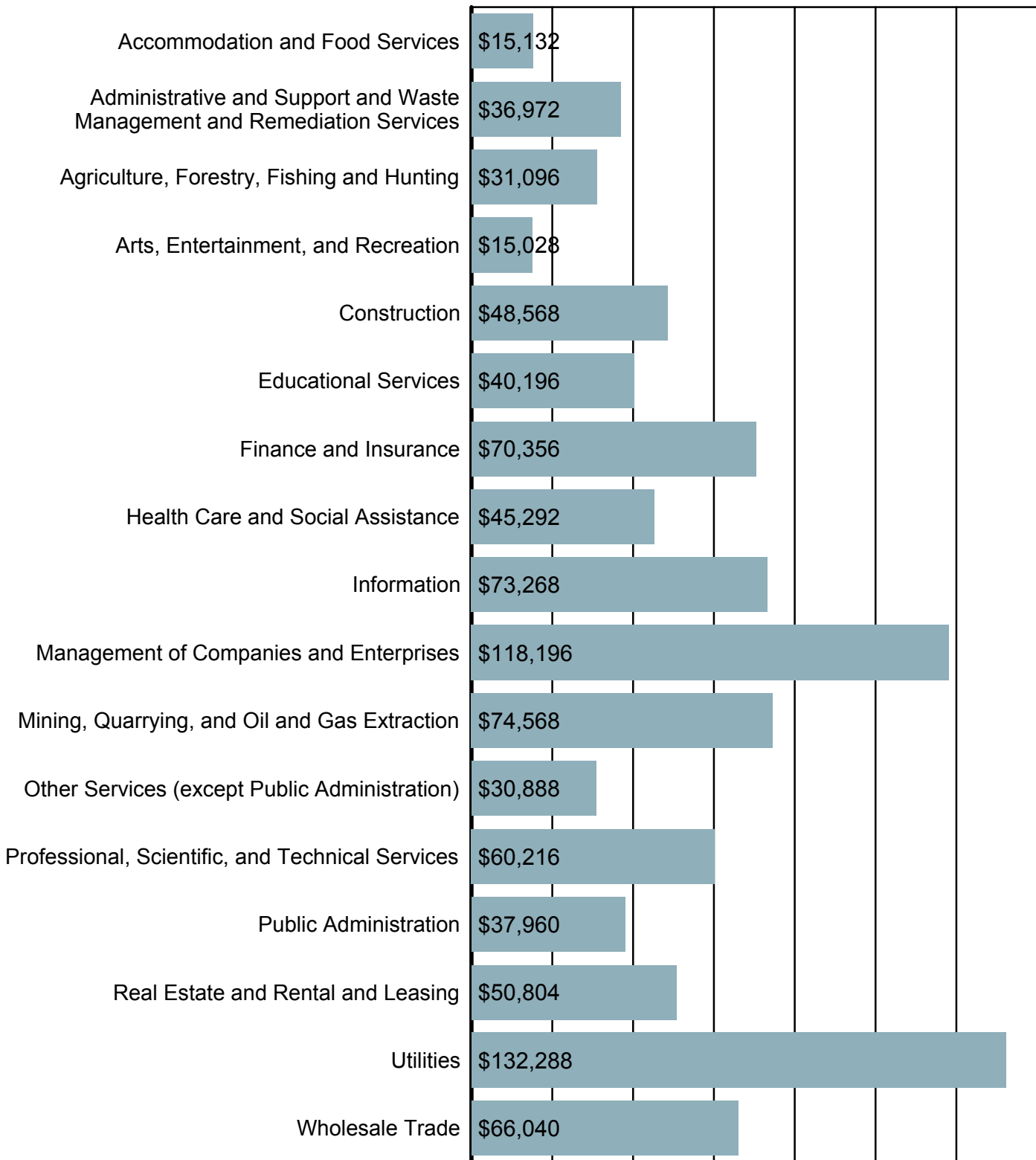

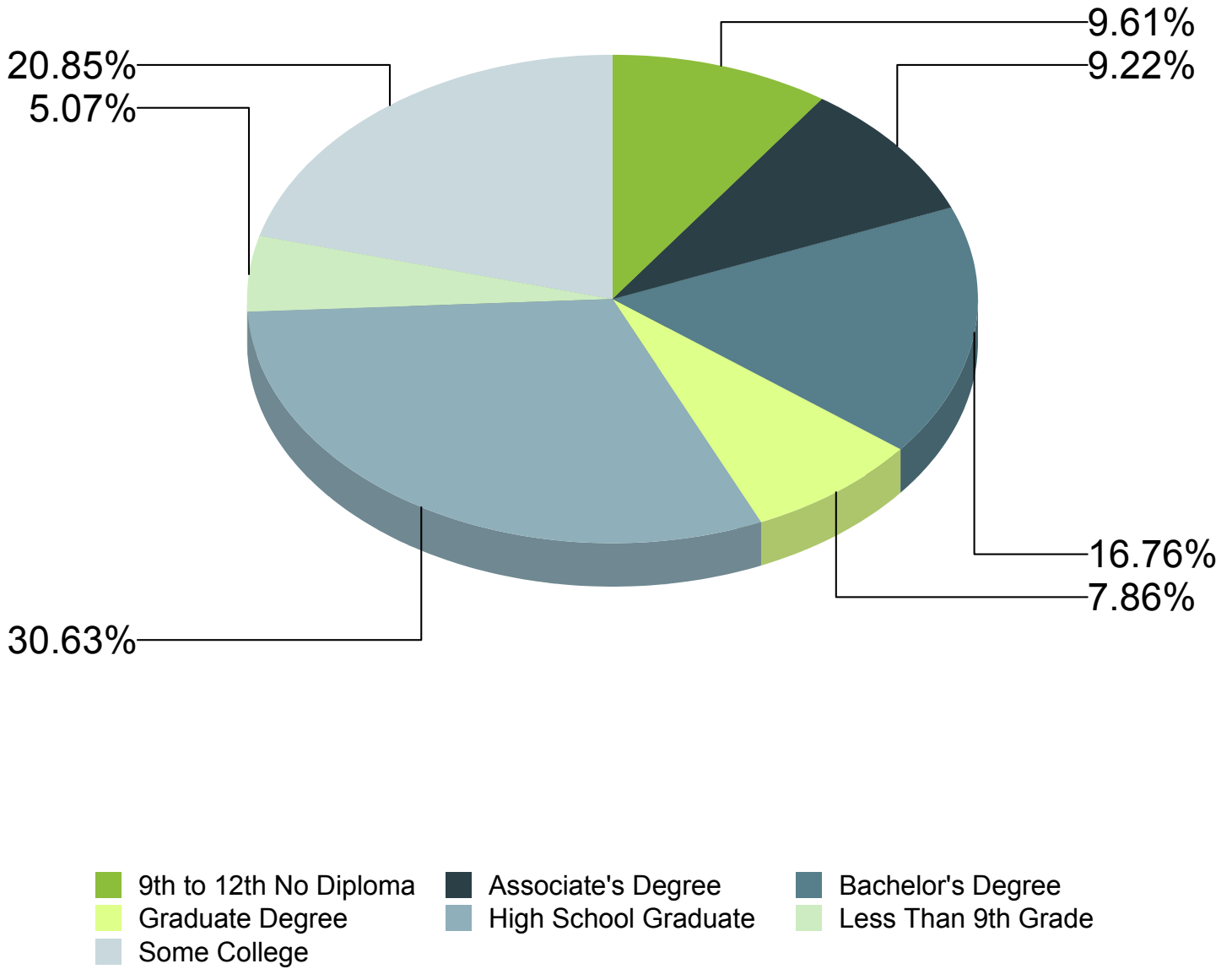

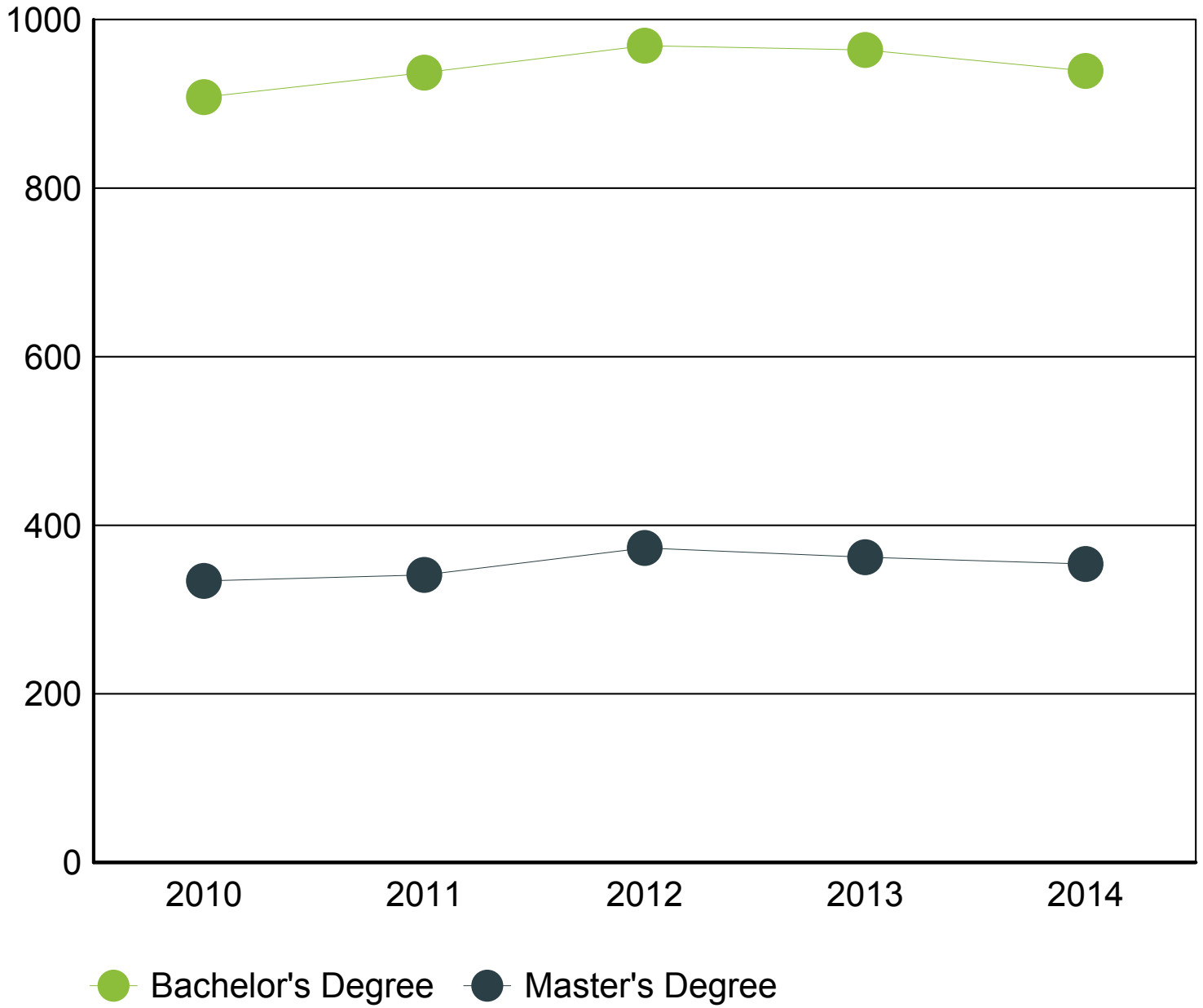
