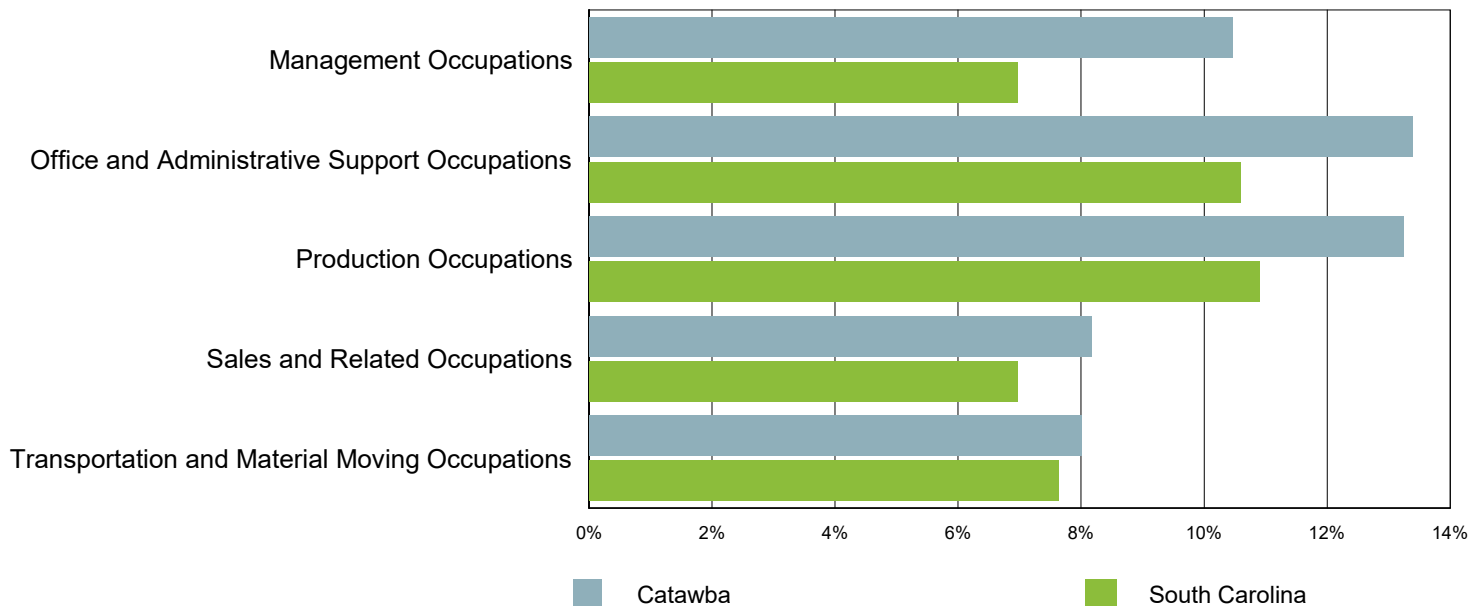

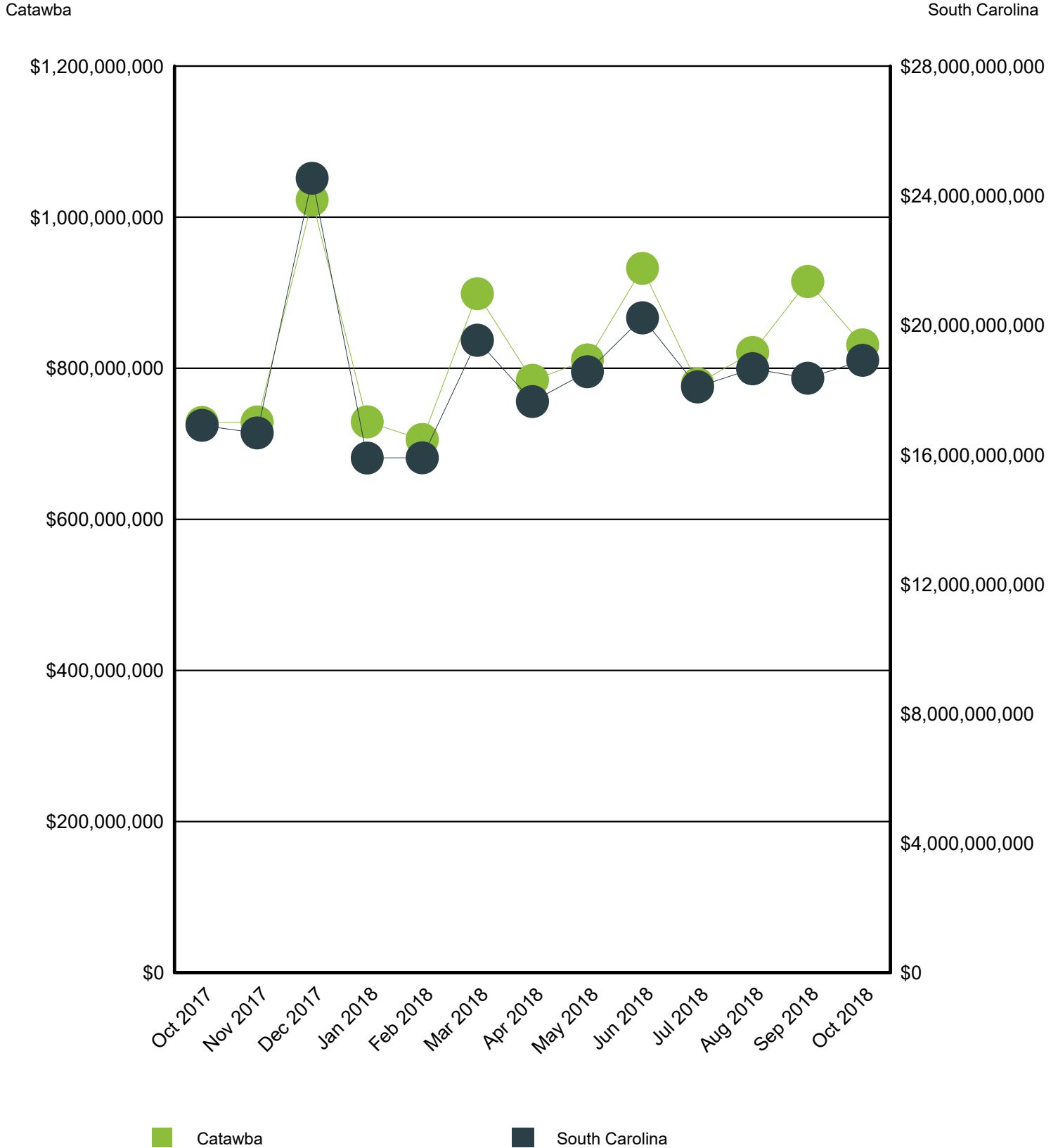

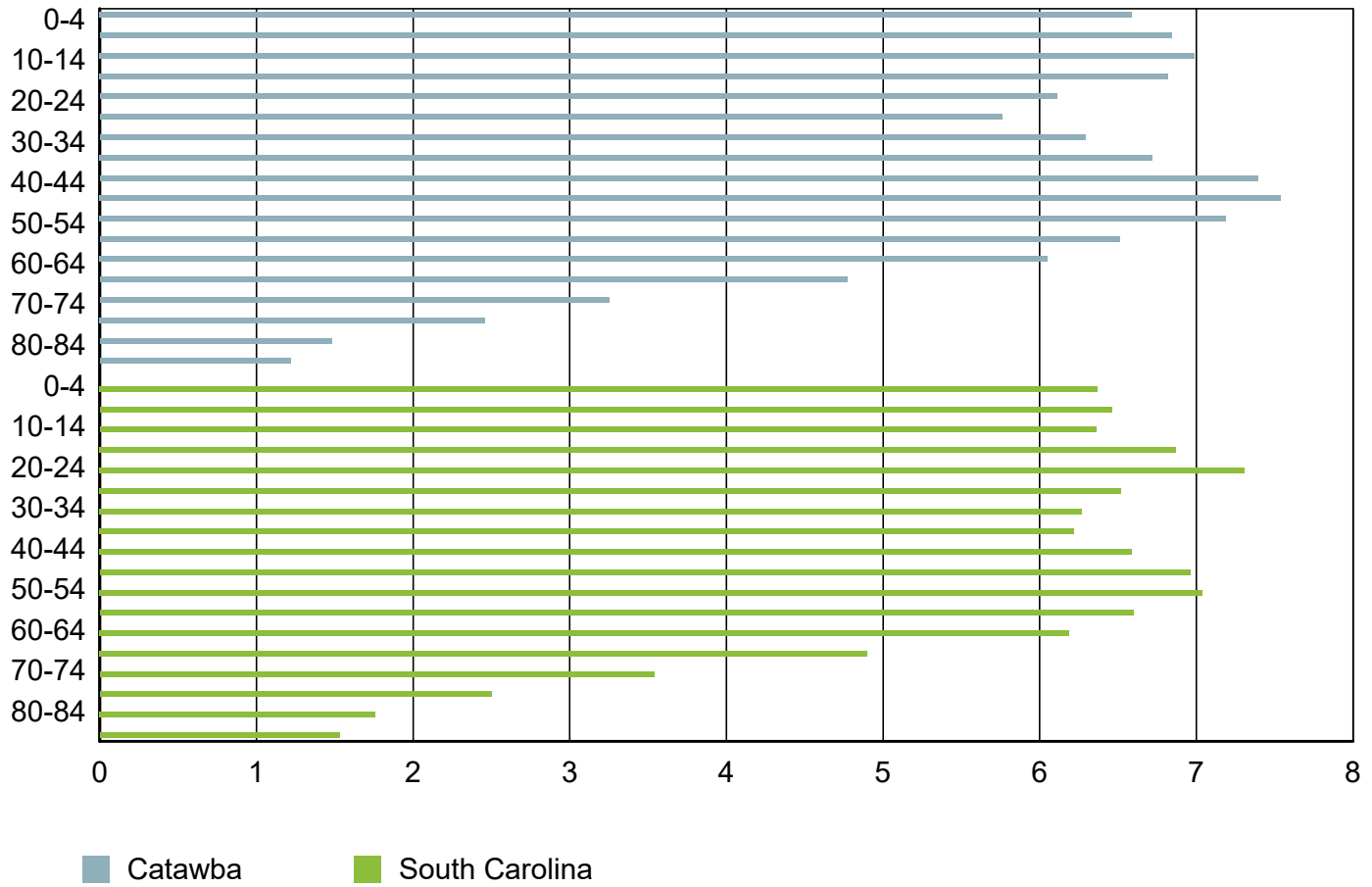


# Retail Sales

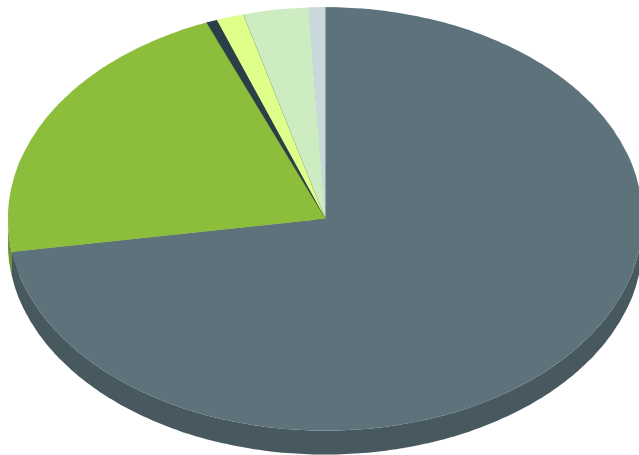

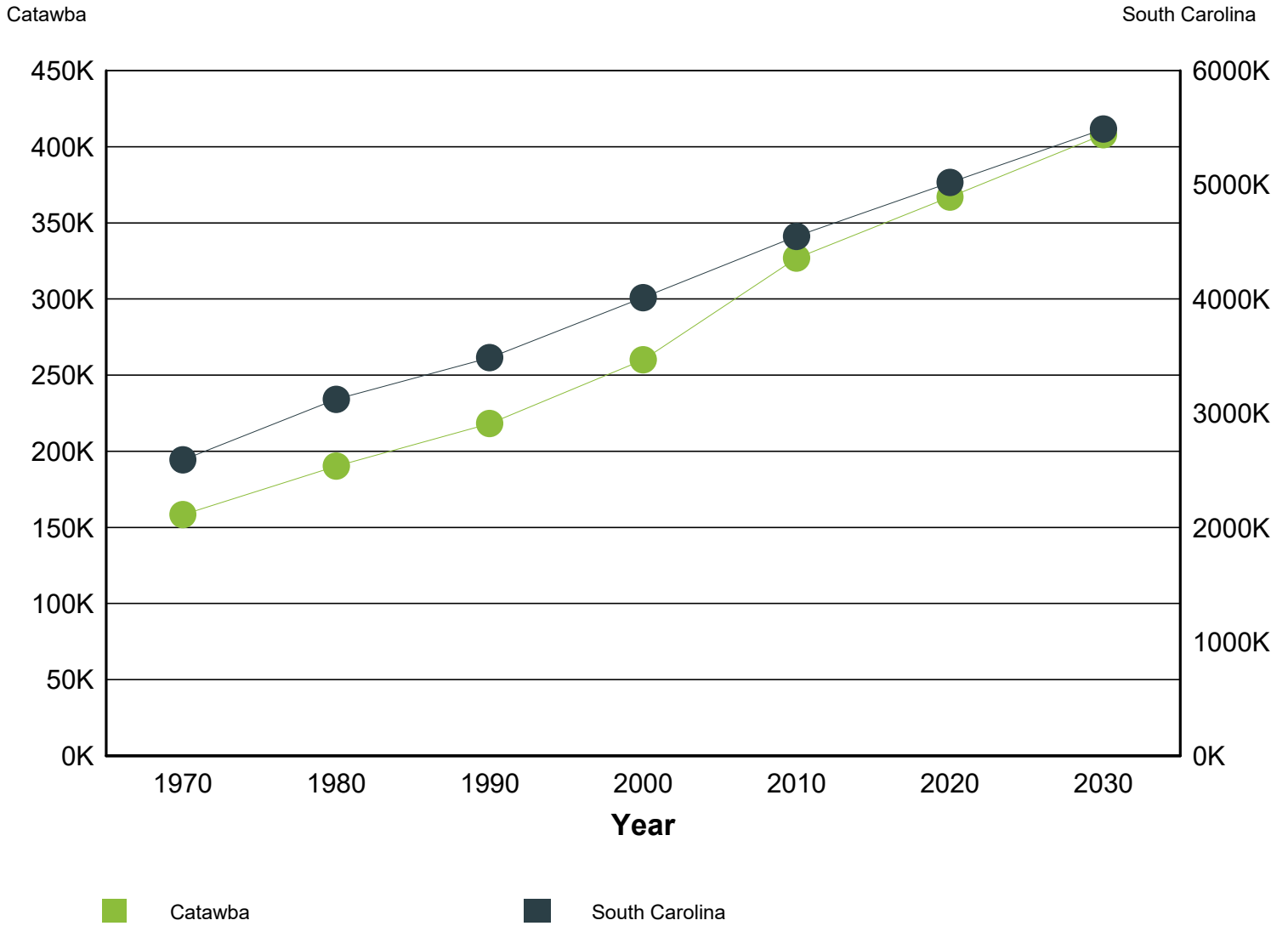

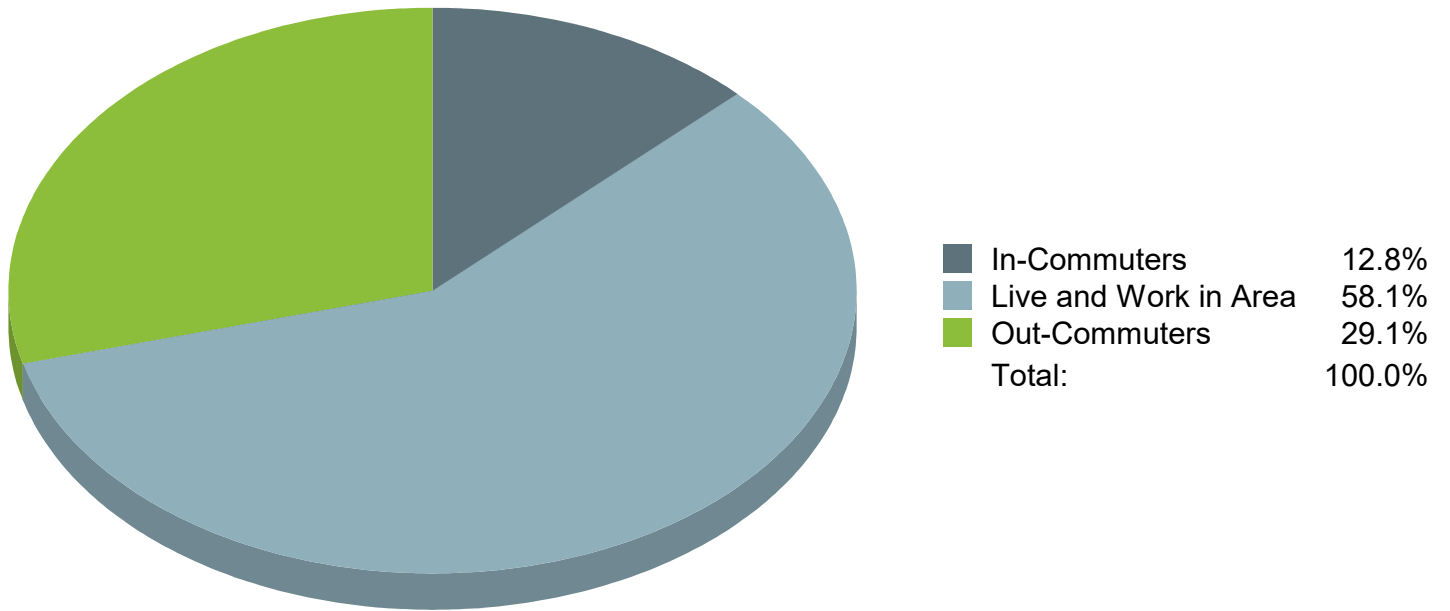

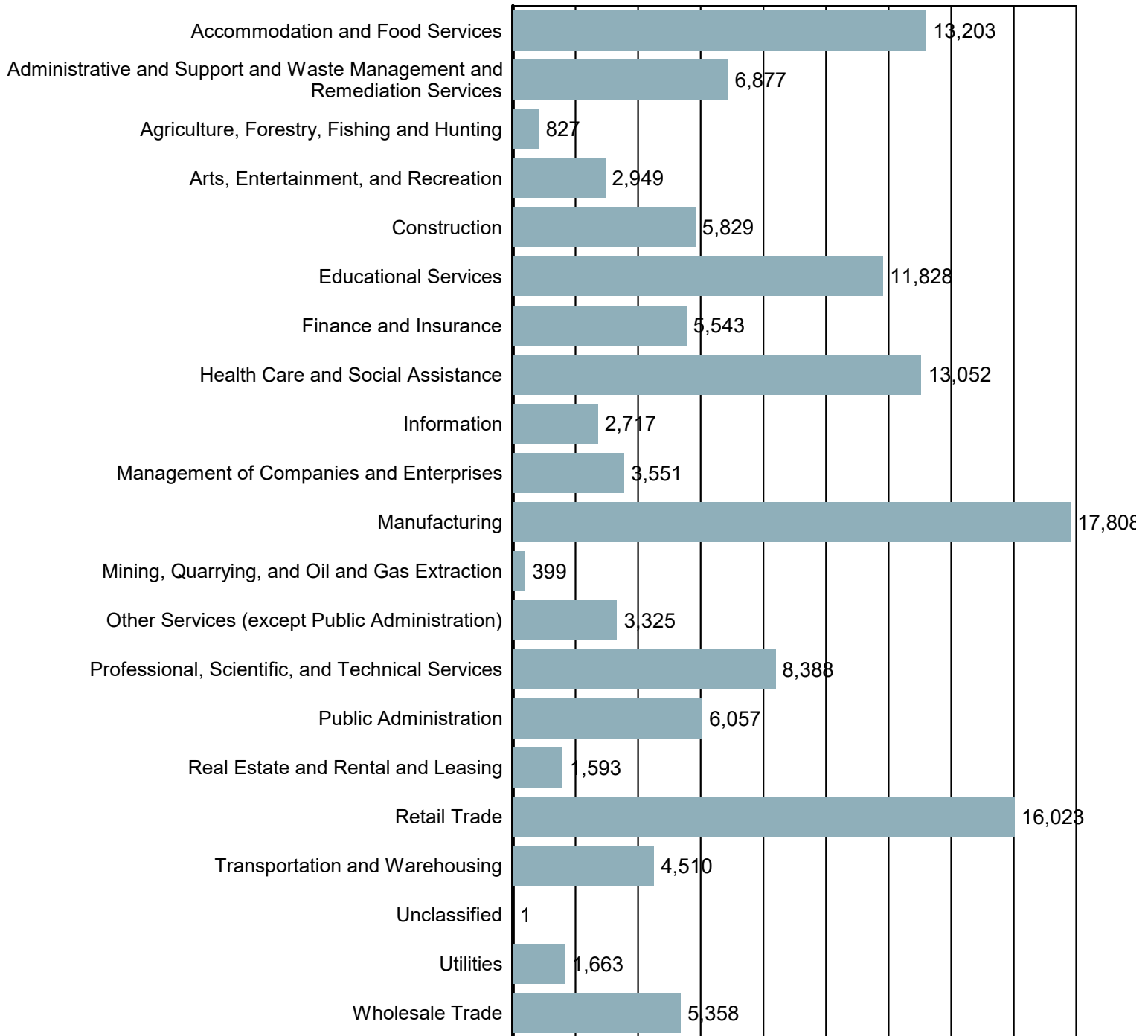

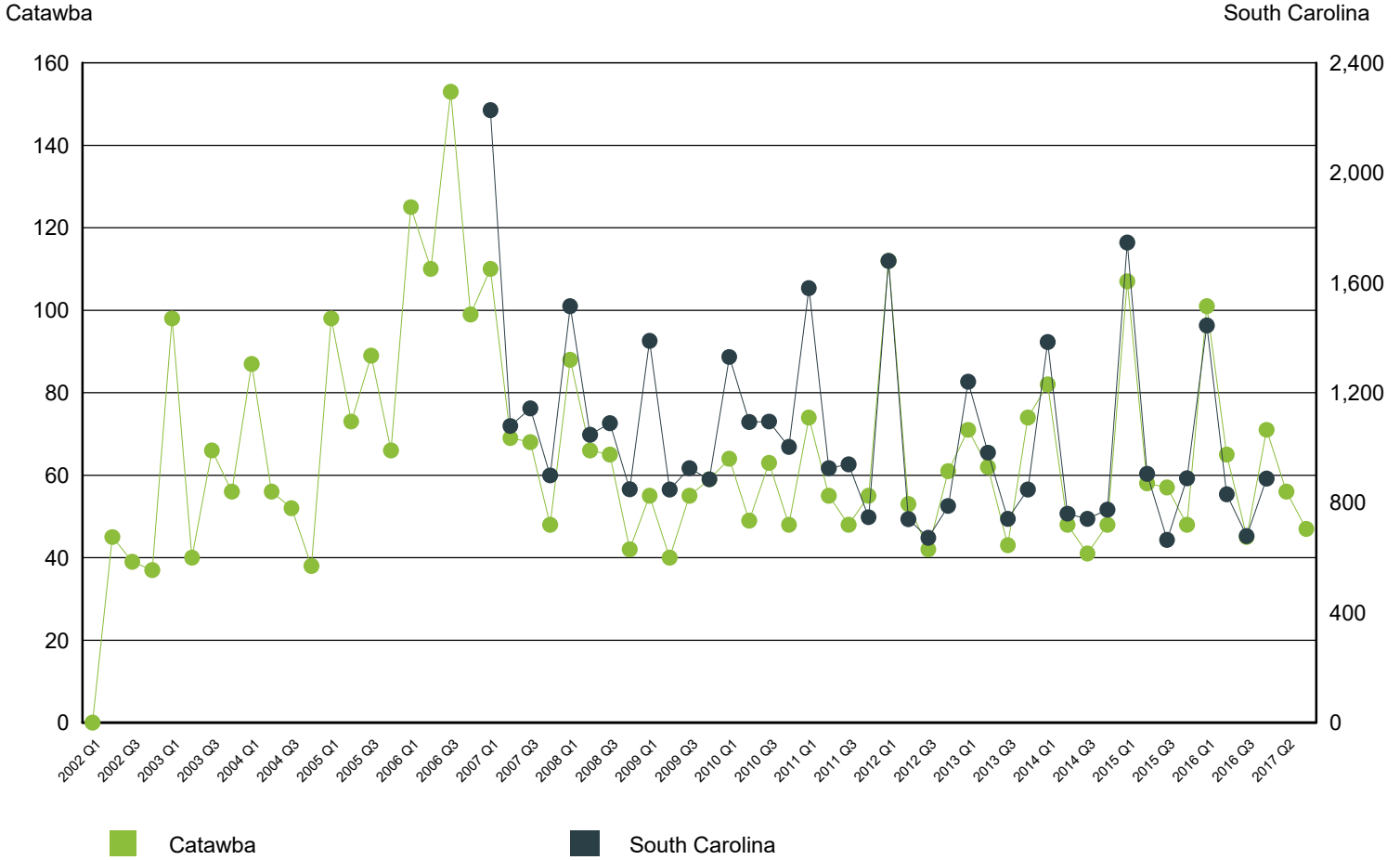


## Employment by Industry

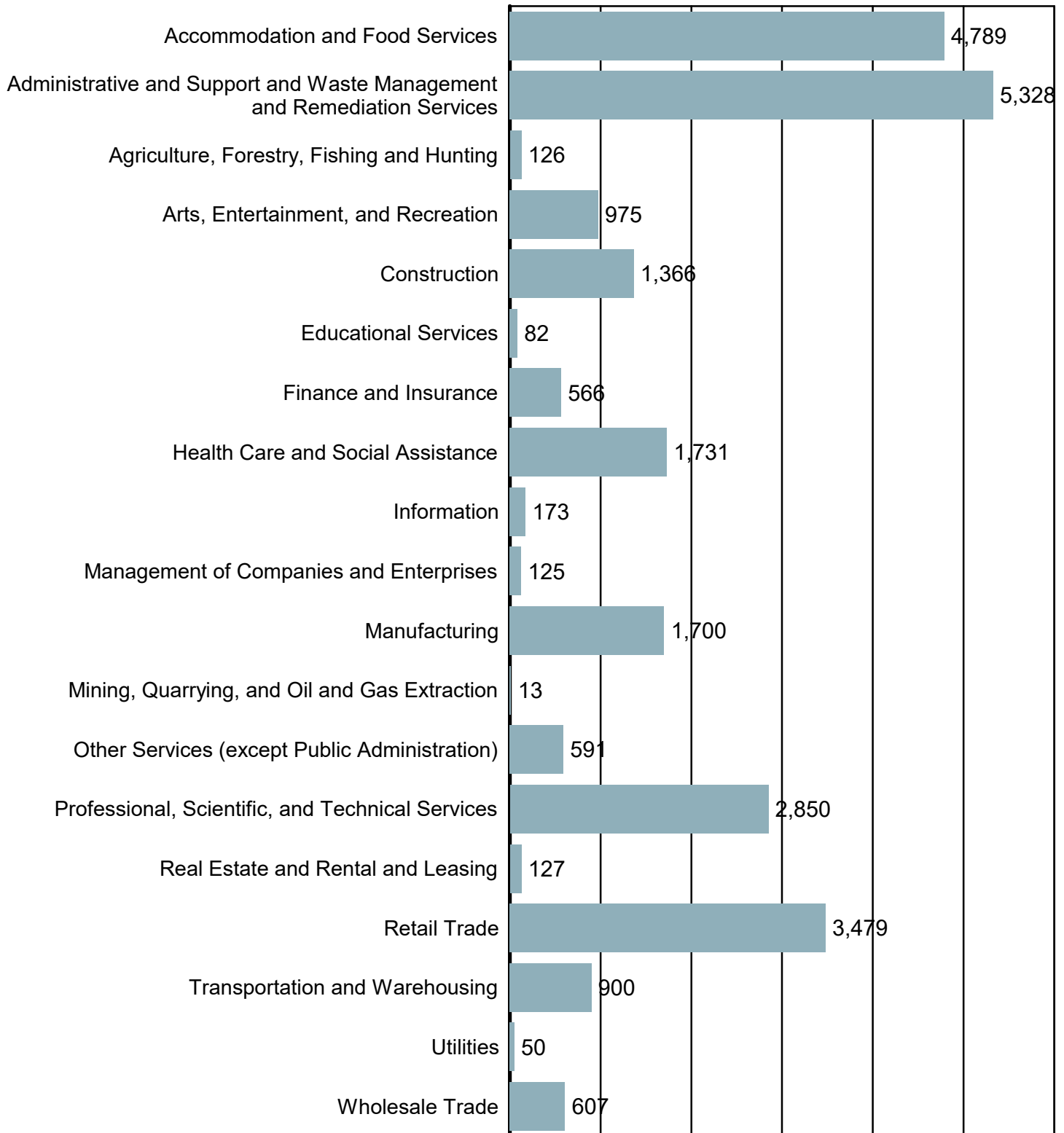

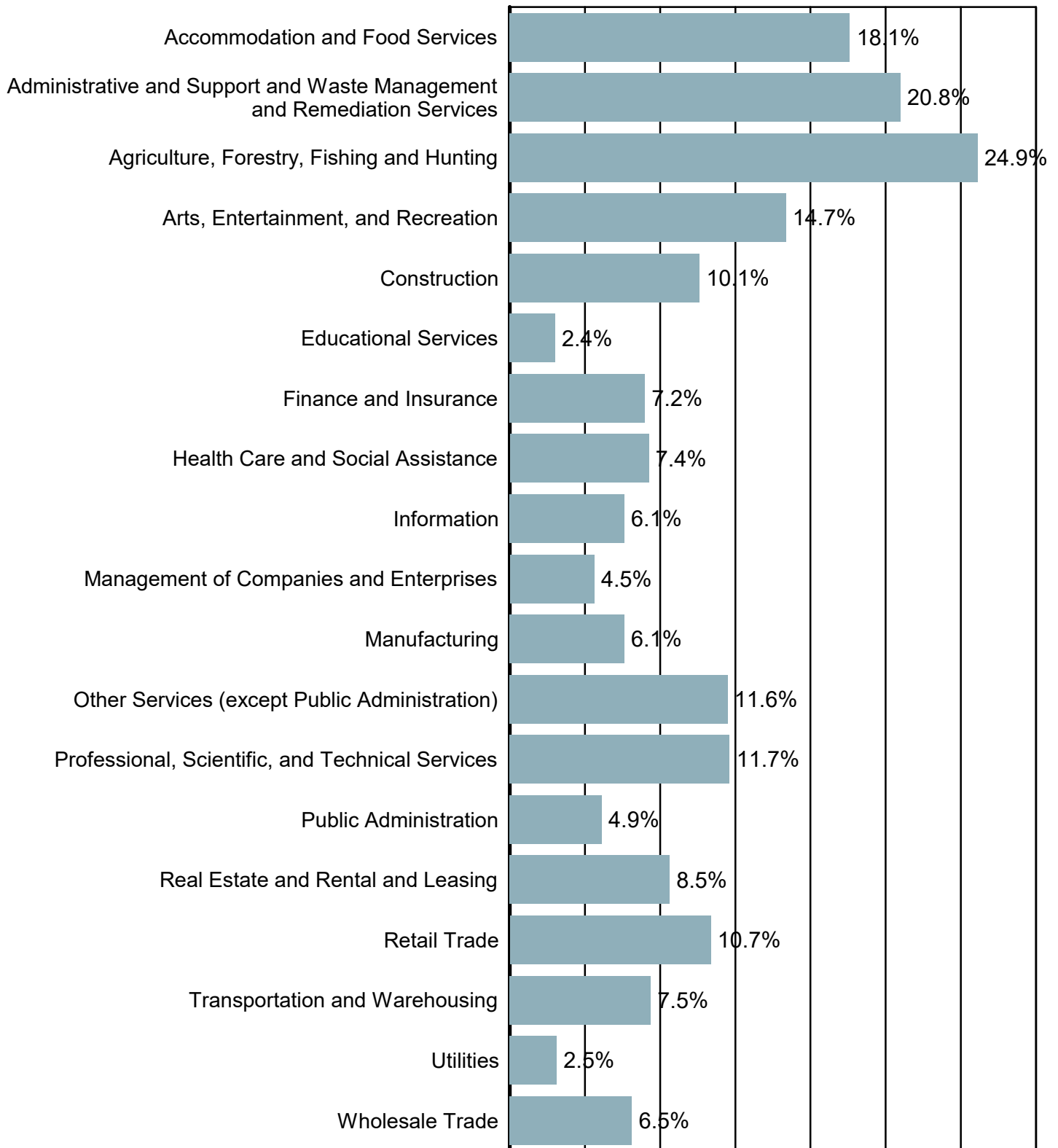

## New Hires by Industry



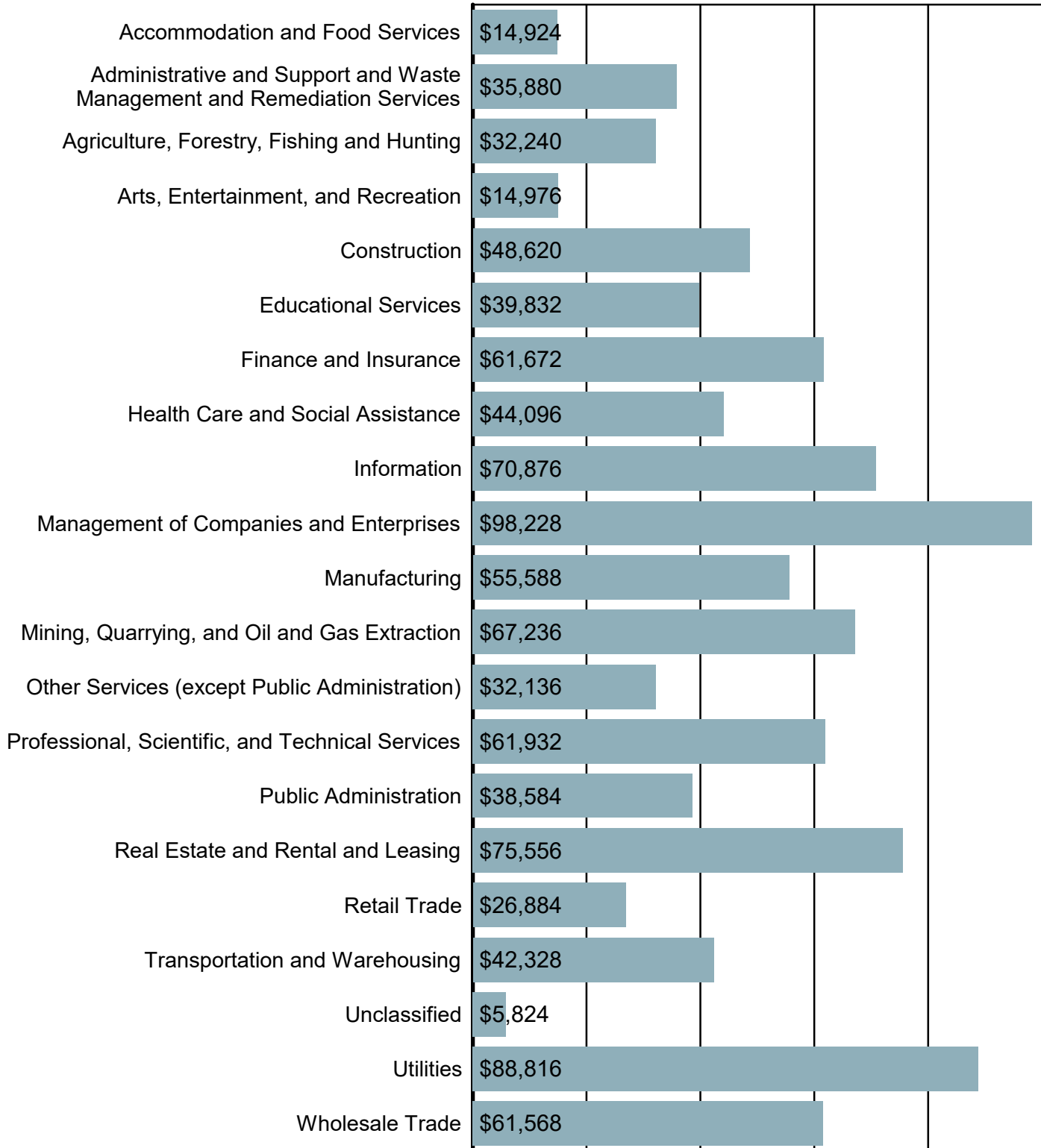

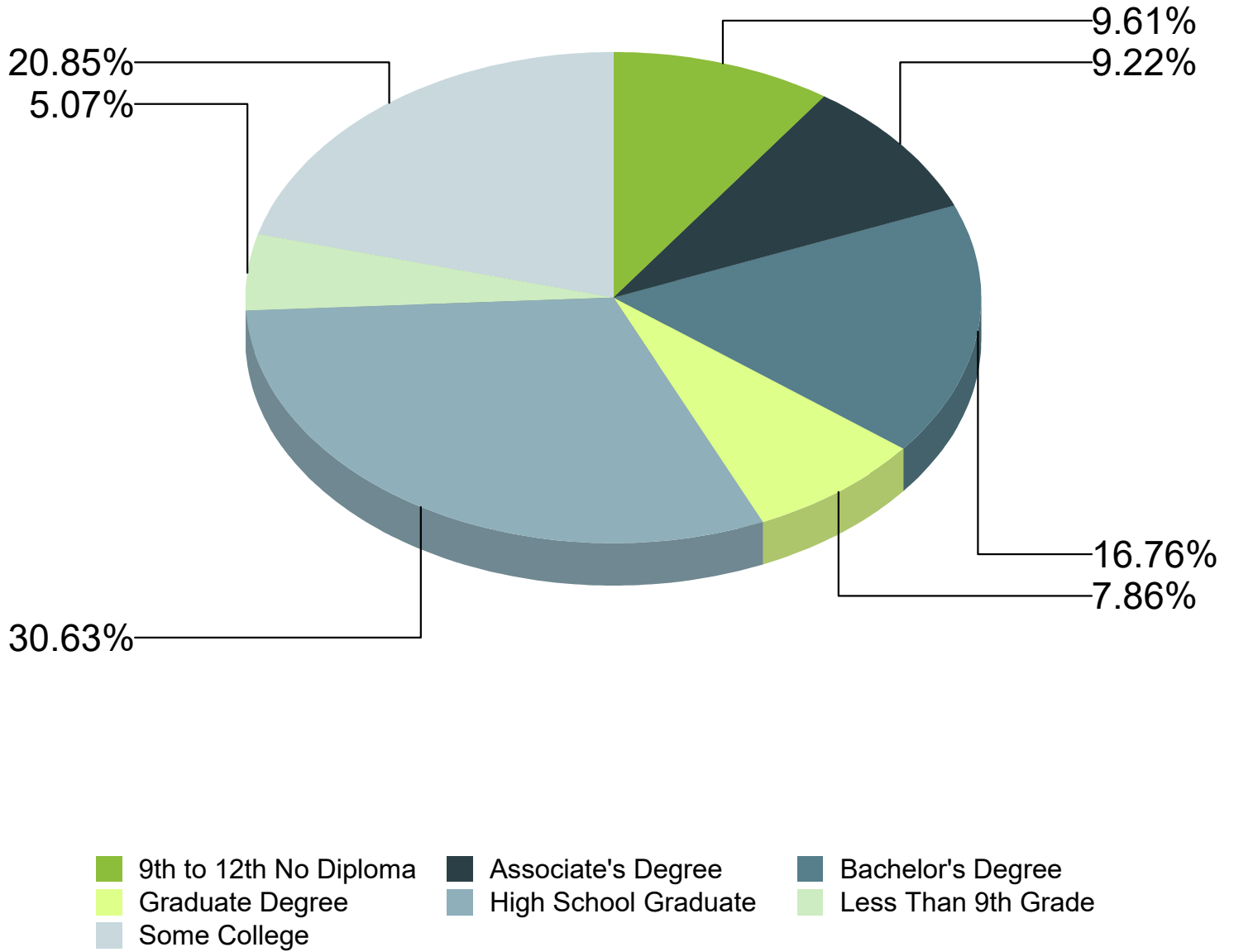

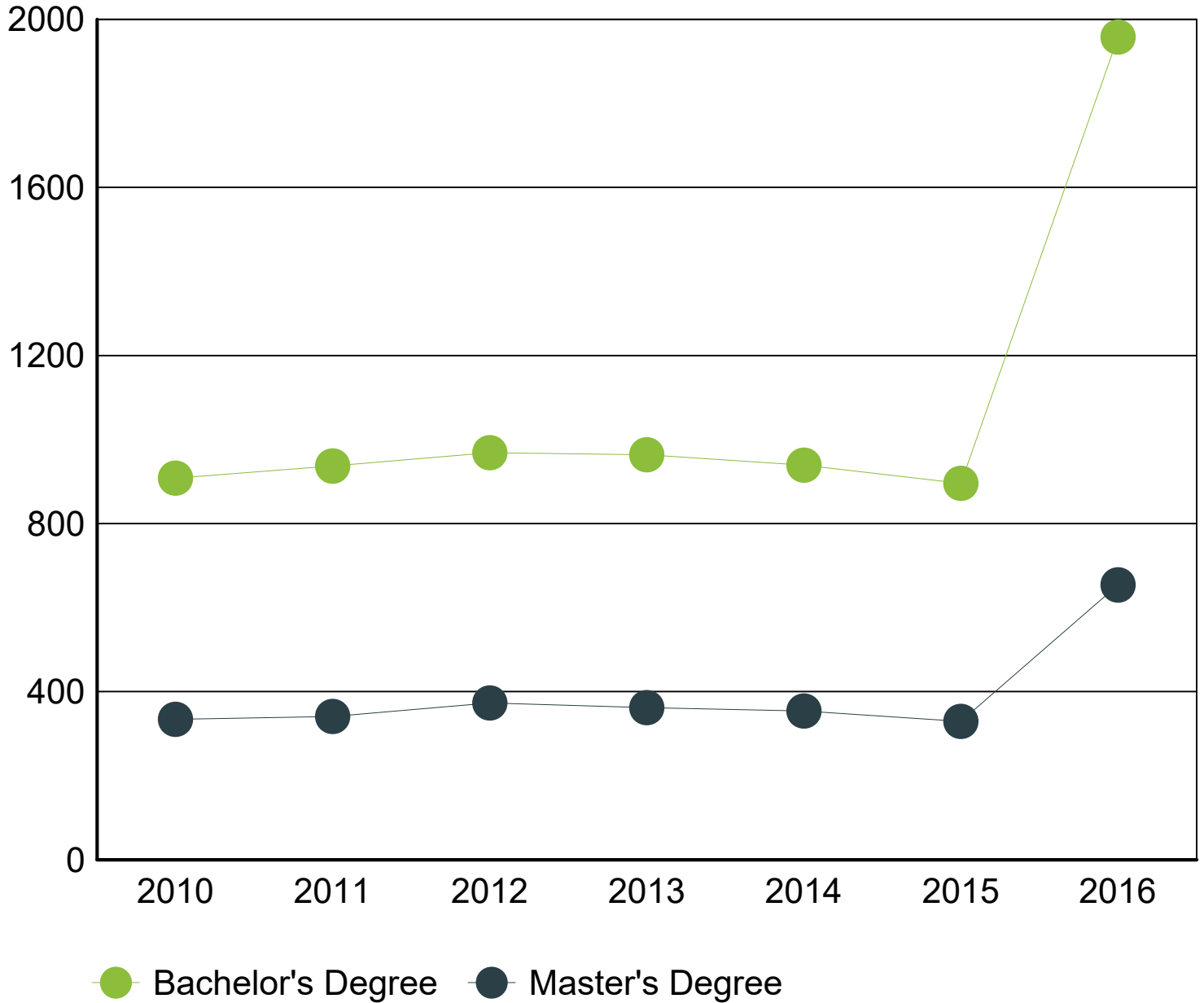
(Population 25 Years and Older)
