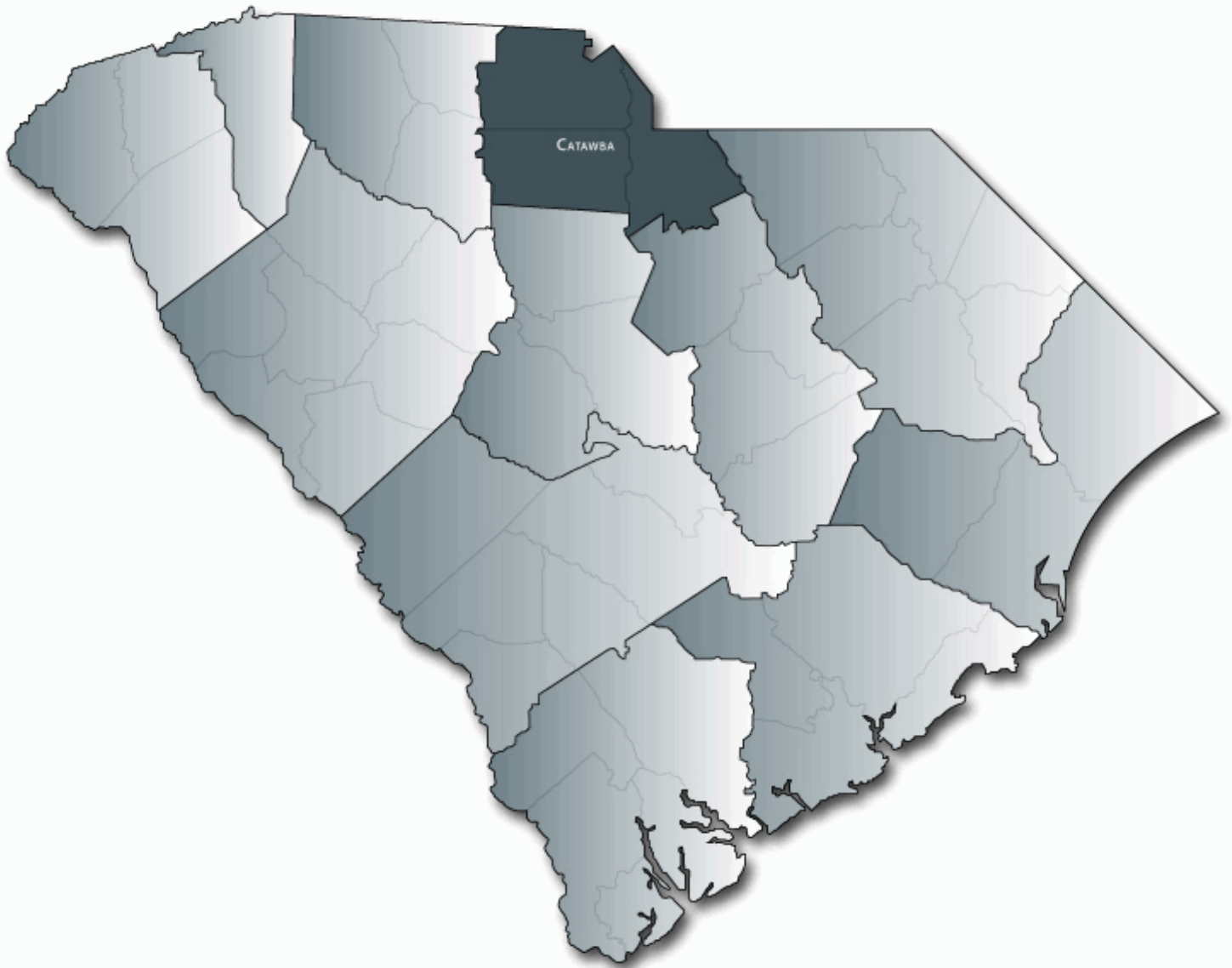

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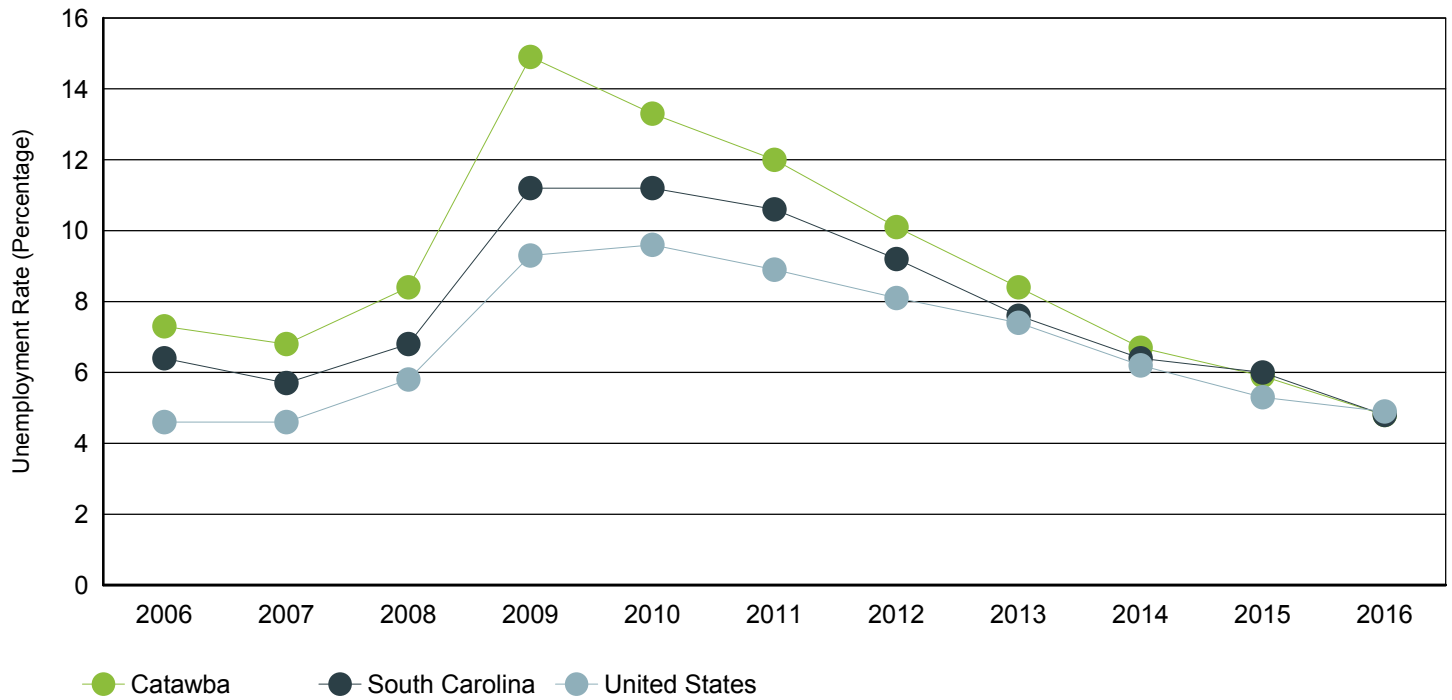
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Annual Unemployment Rate (Unadjusted)

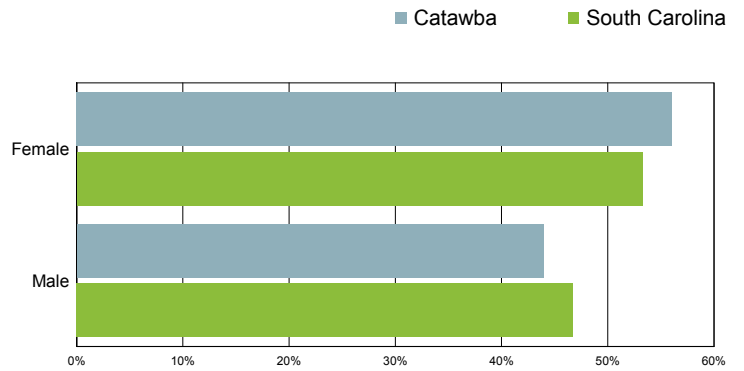

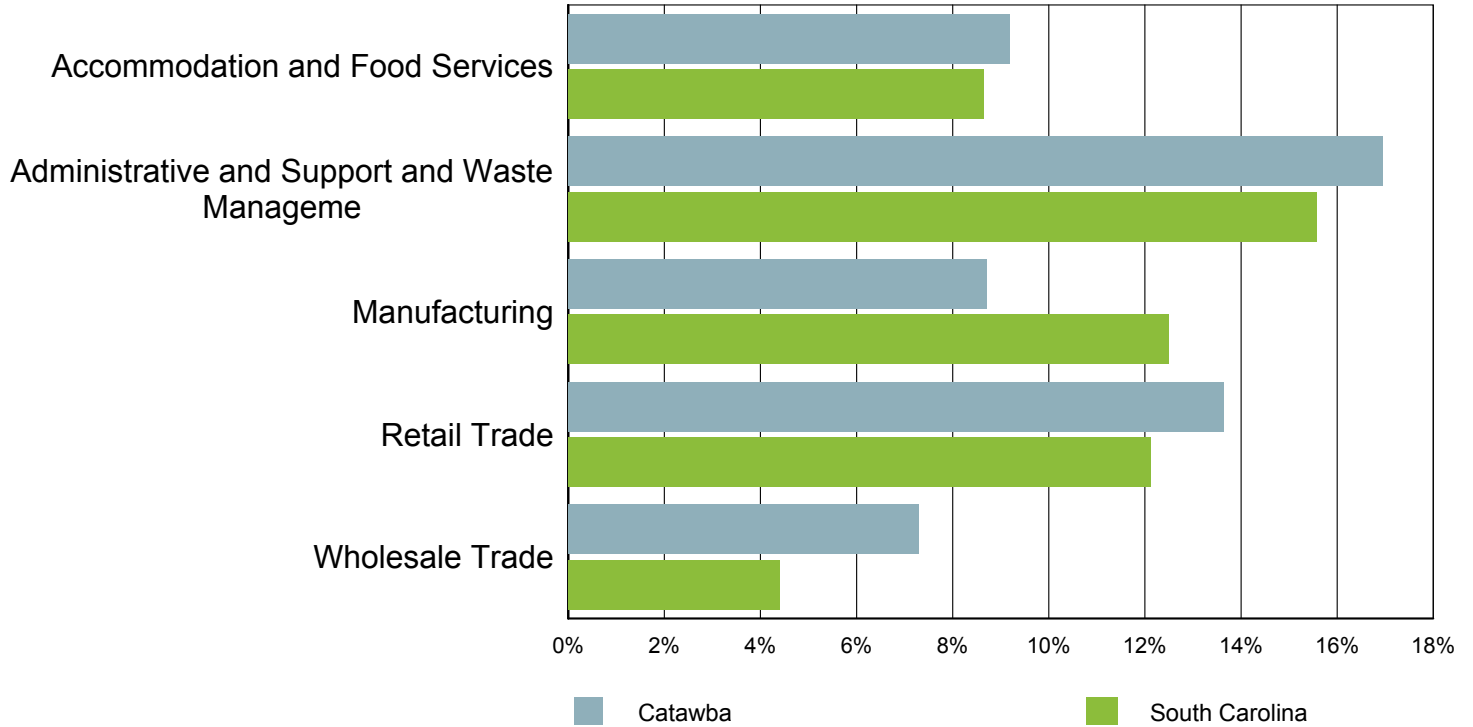

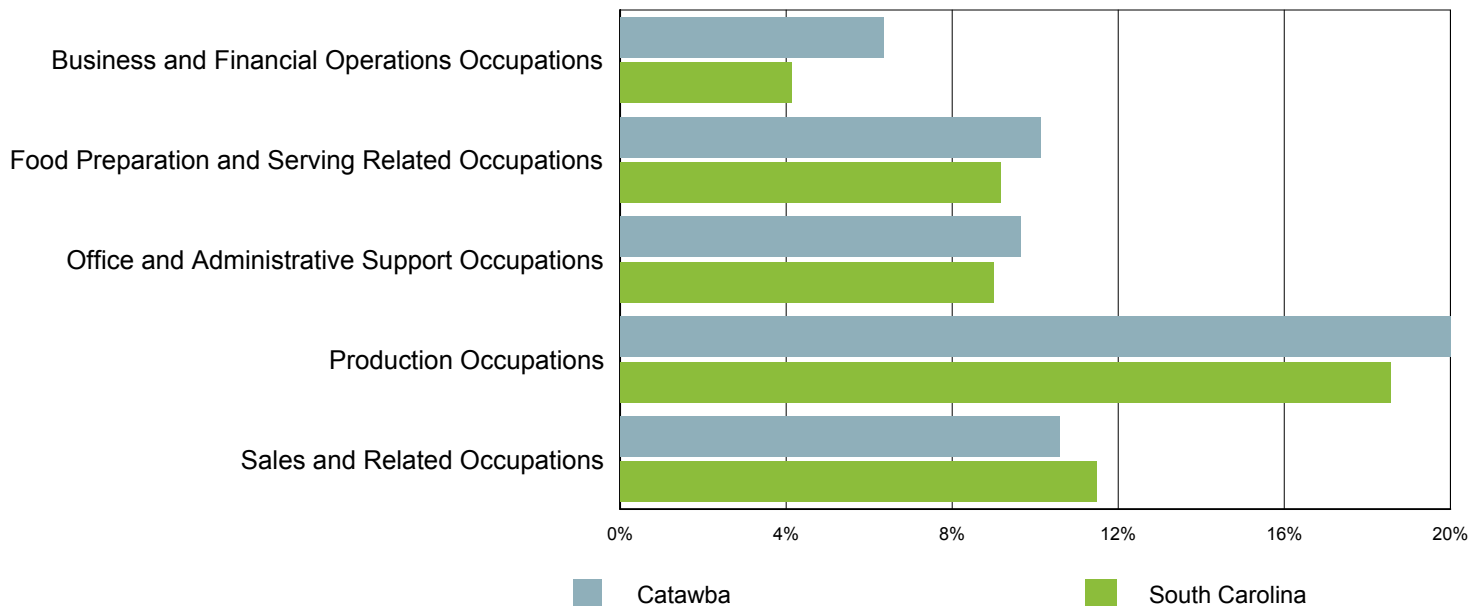

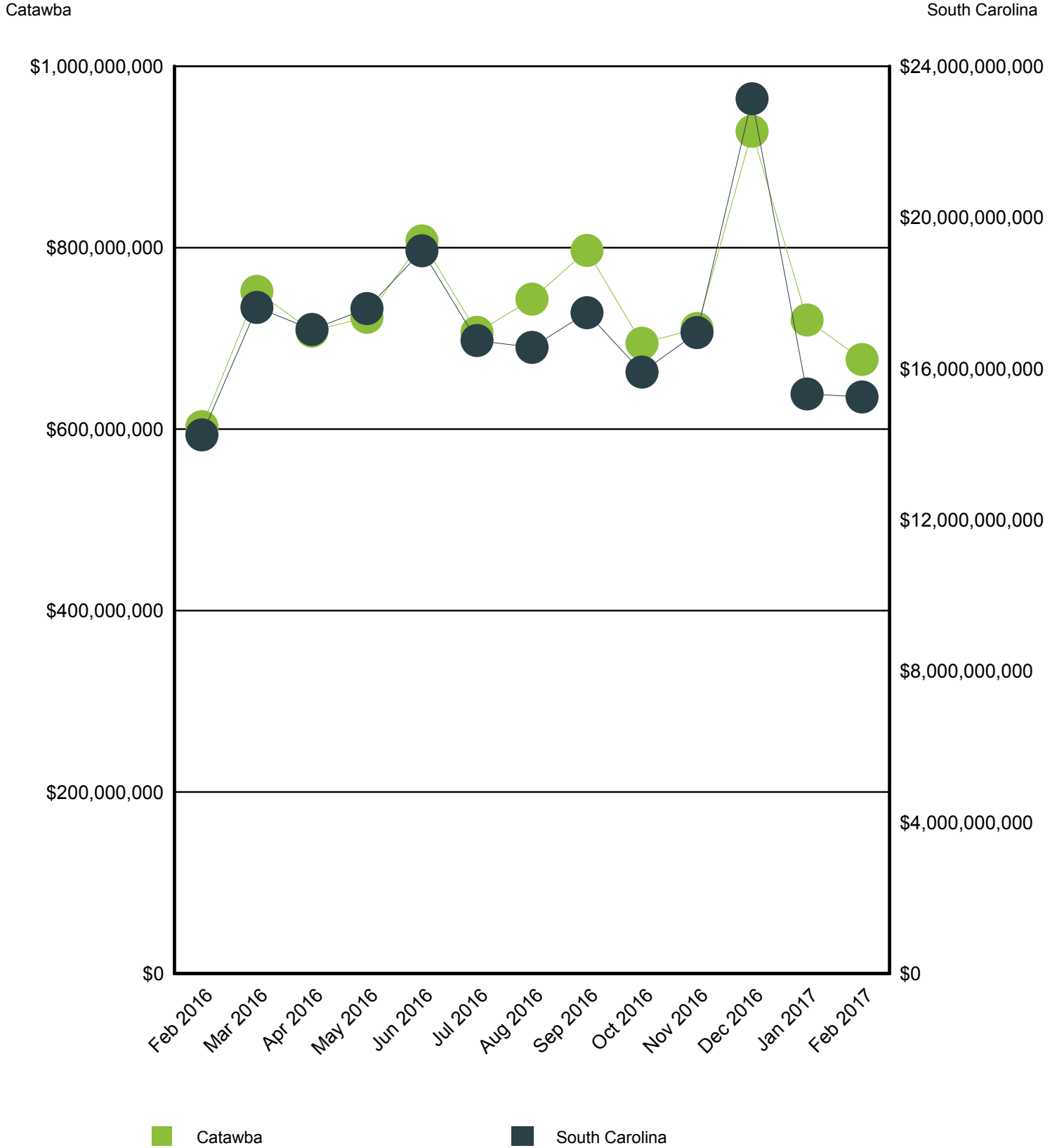

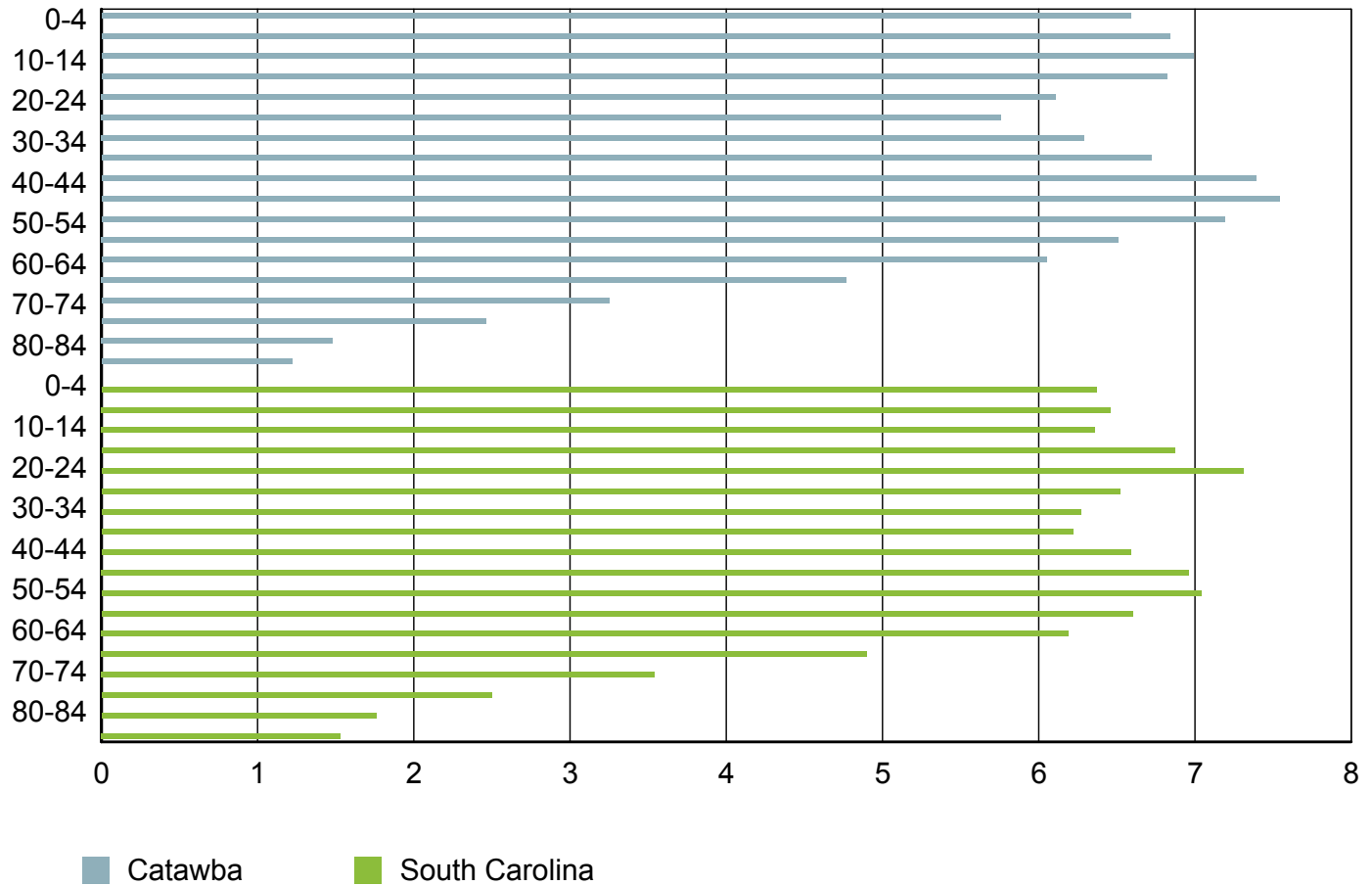

Population by Age



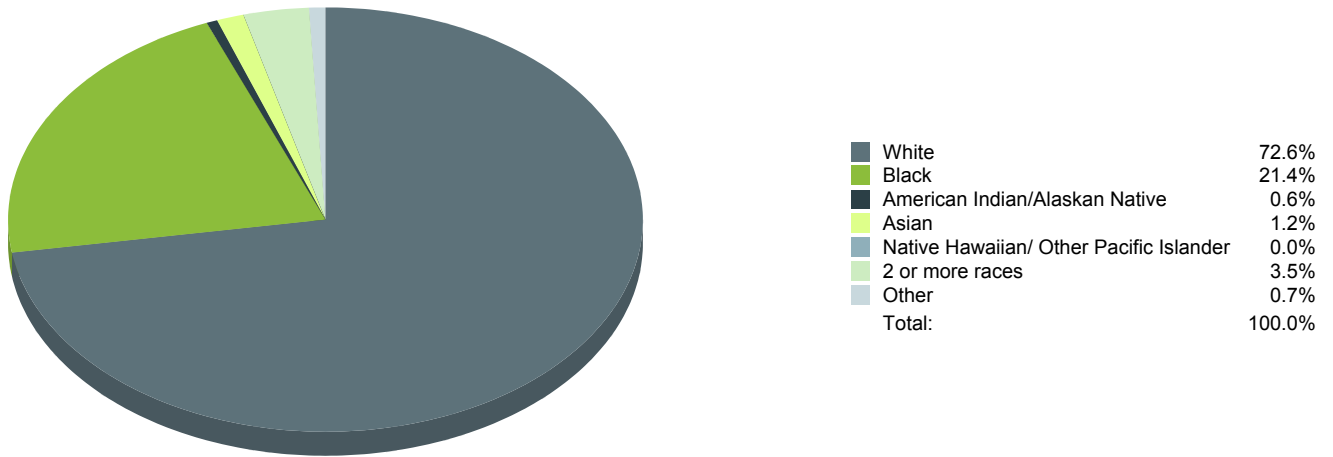

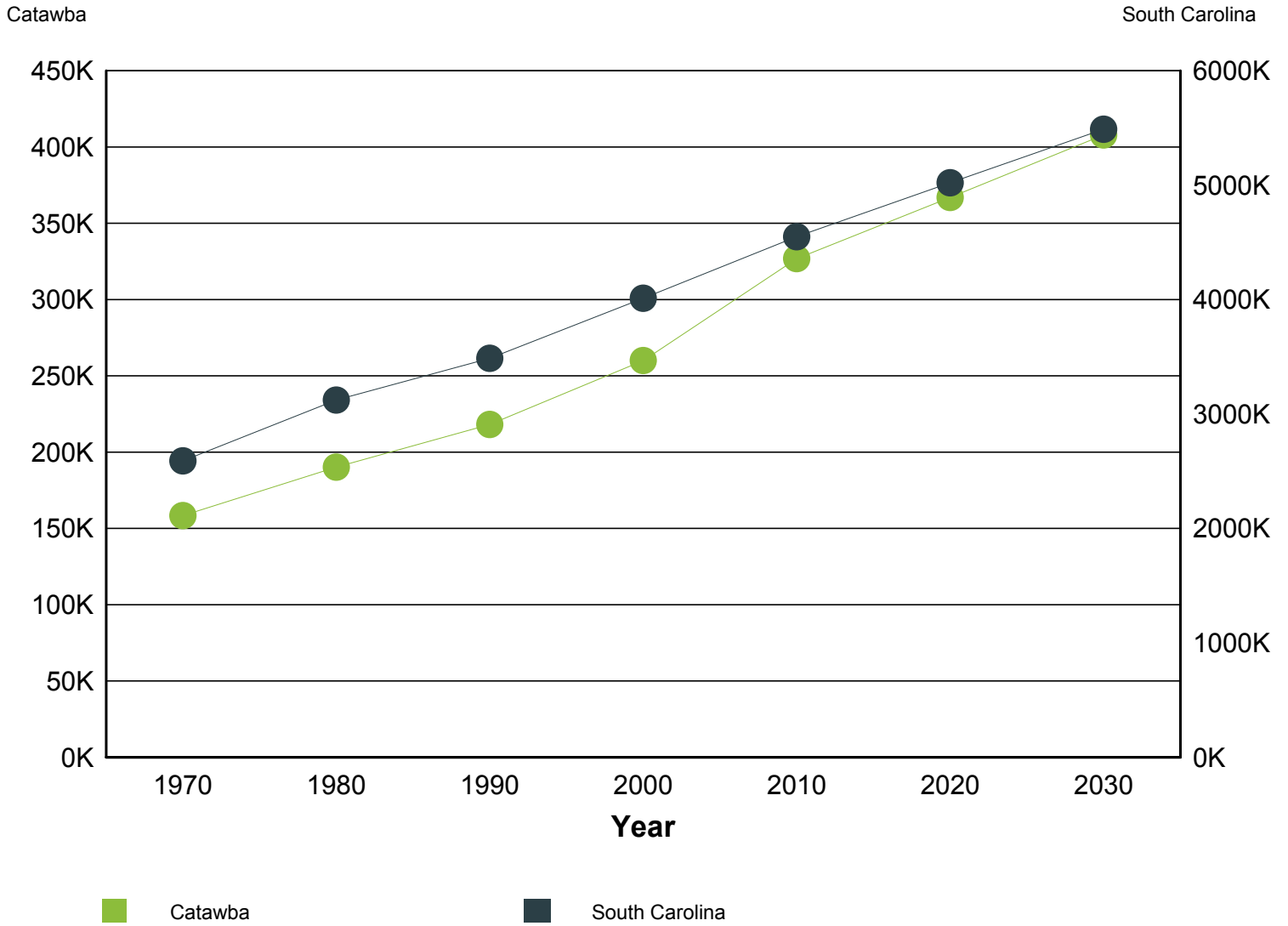
Population by Gender

Population Change

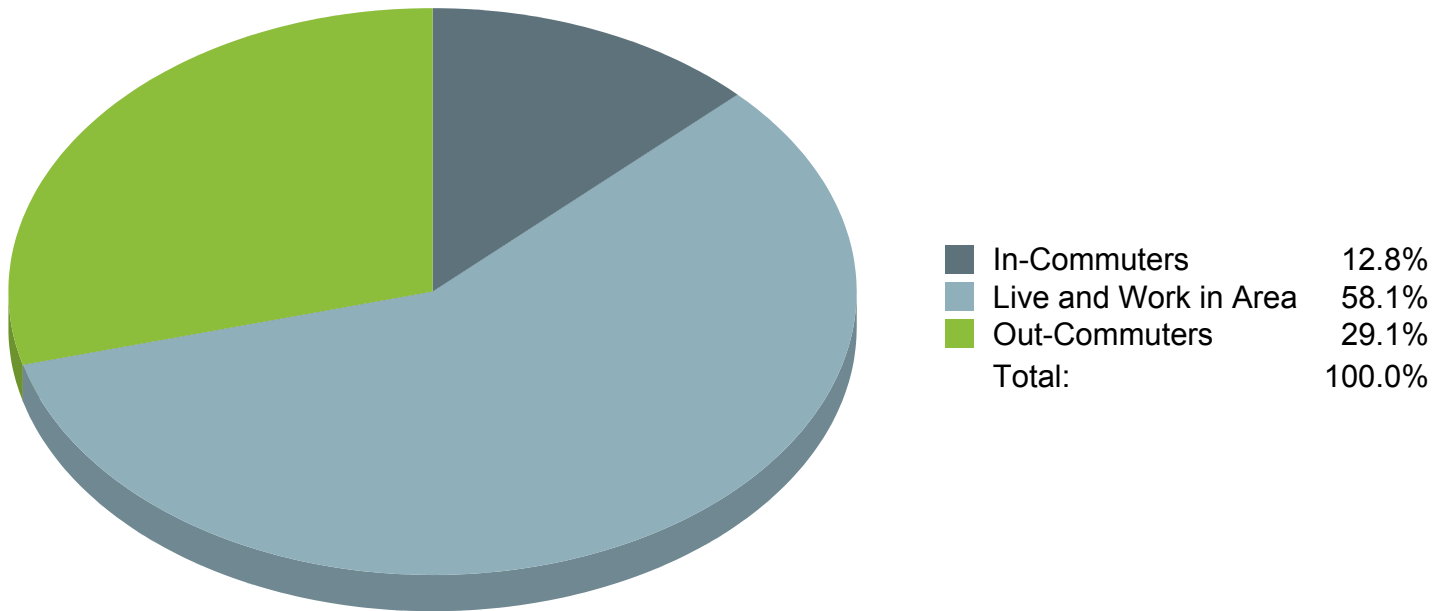

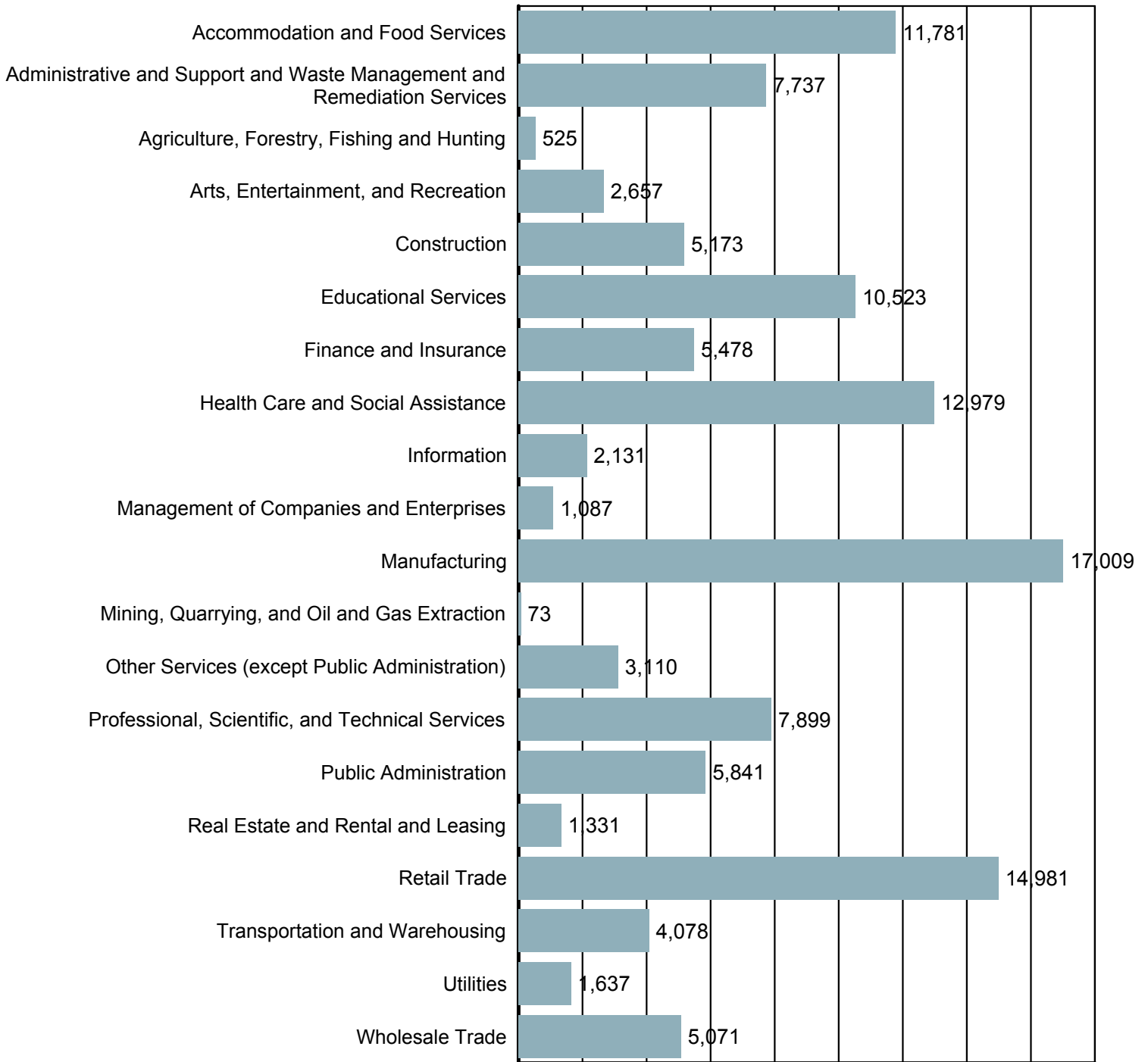

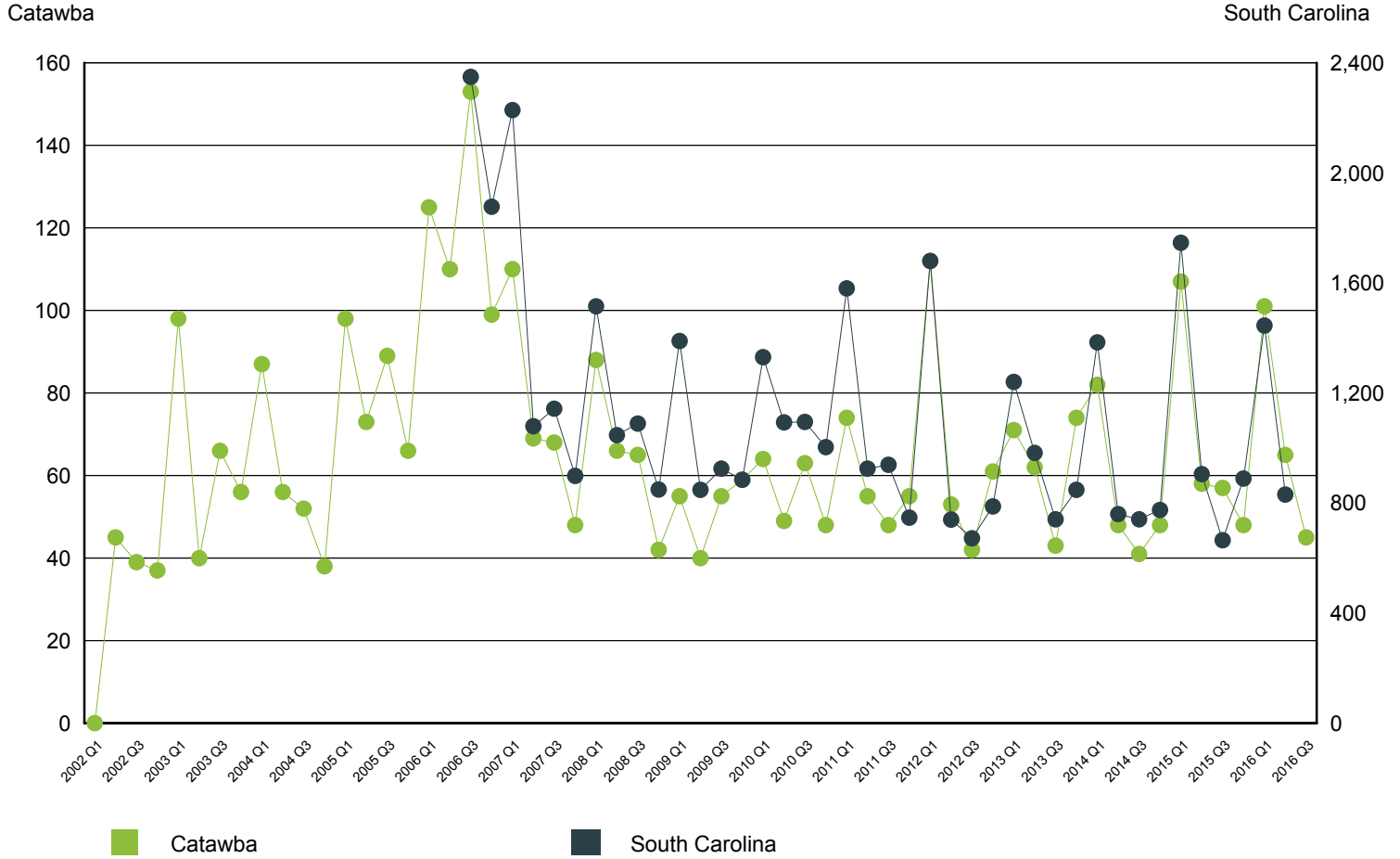

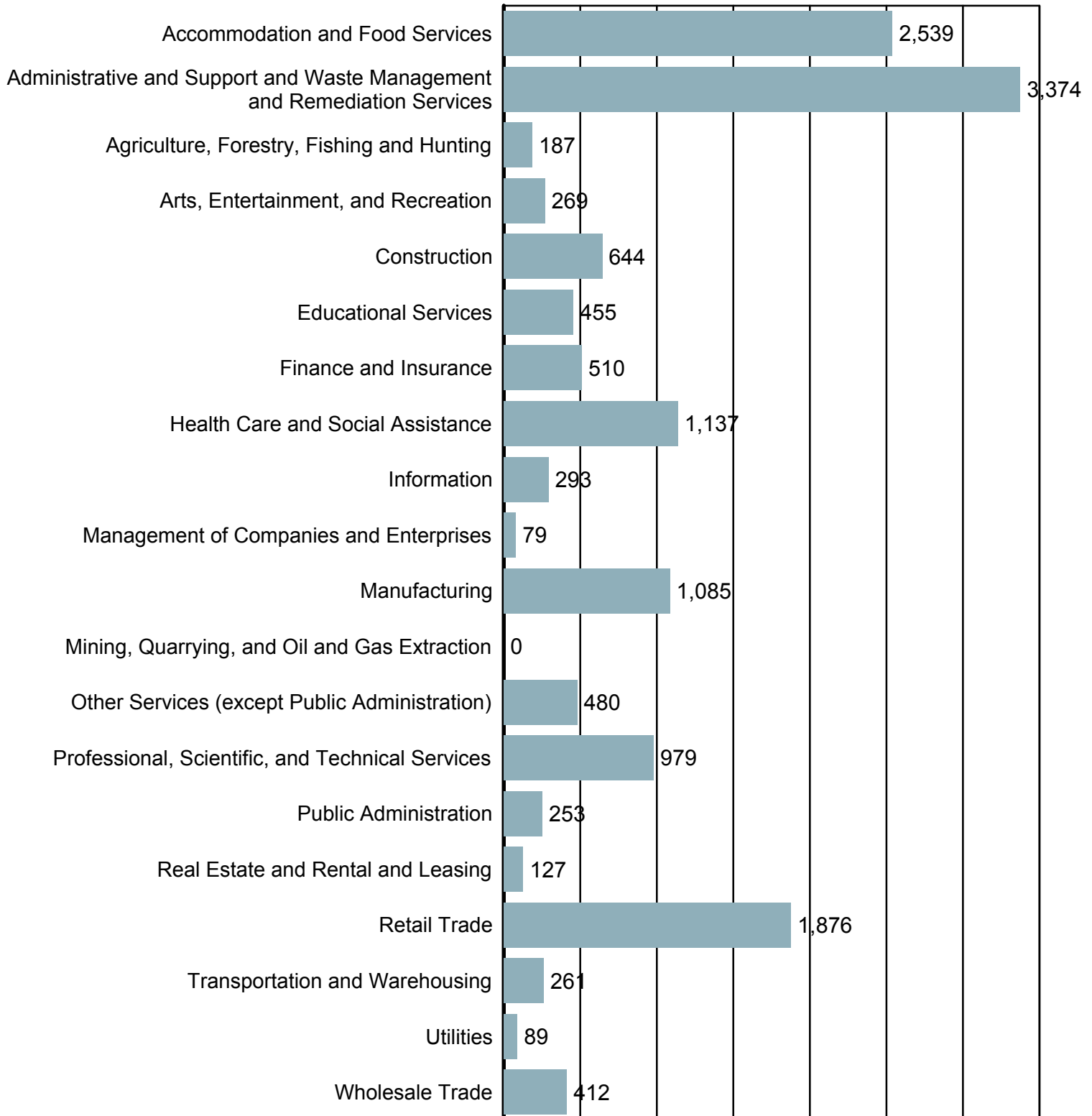

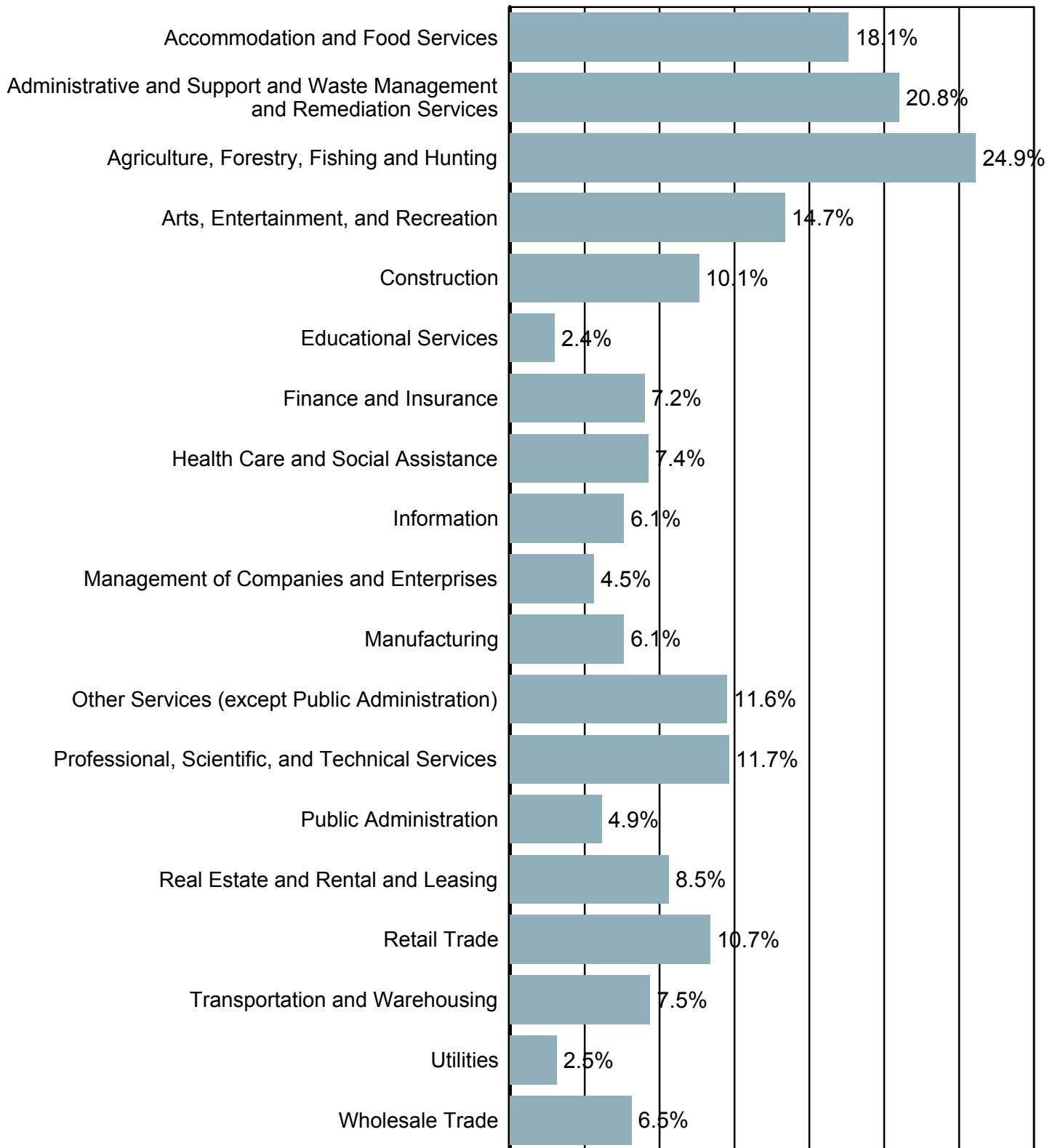

New Hires by Industry



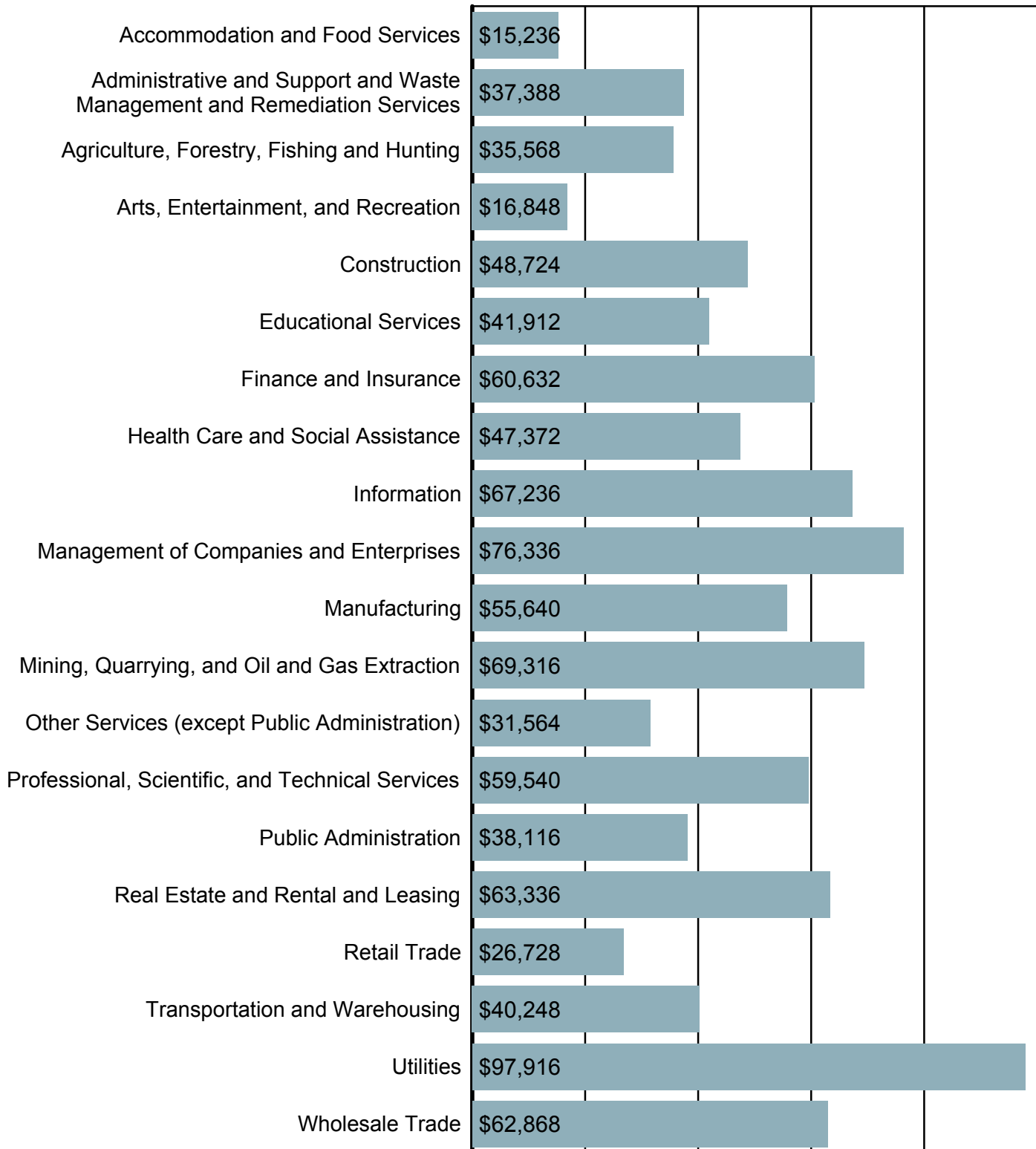

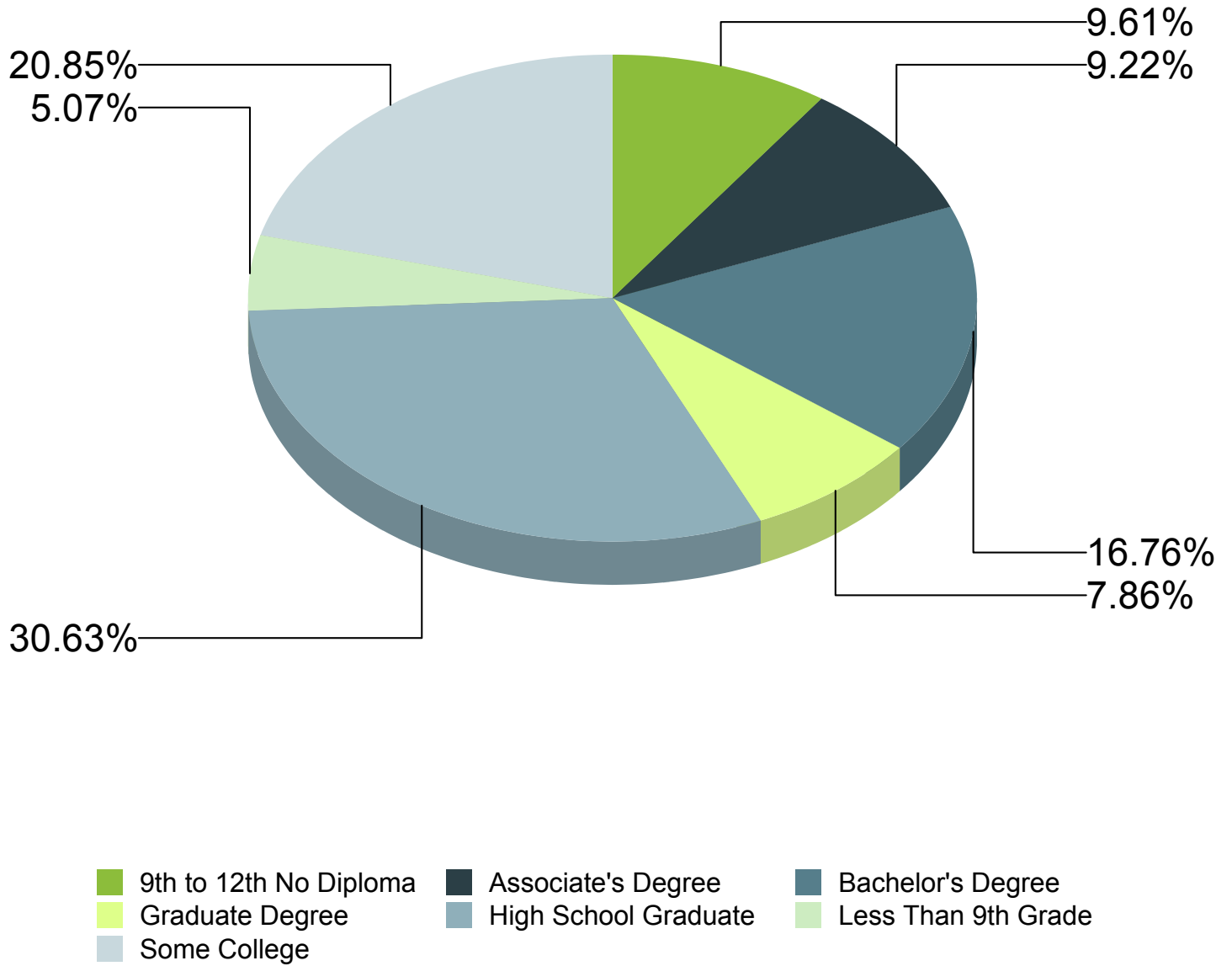

Educational Attainment

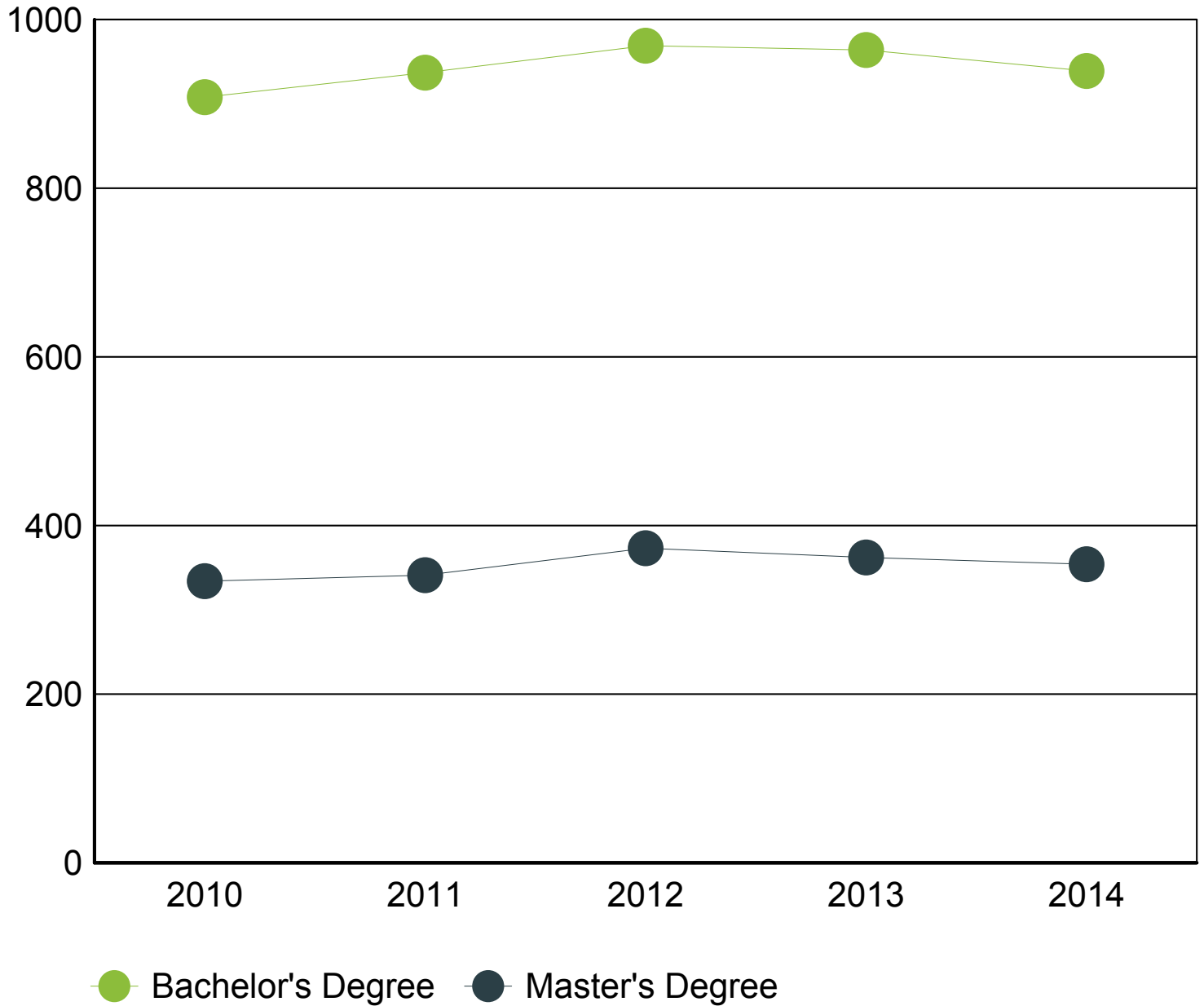
(Population 25 Years and Older)
