

# HOT JOBS!

## in South Carolina

South Carolina is expected to add more than 169,300 jobs between 2014 and 2024, according to employment projections by the SC Department of Employment and Workforce's Business Intelligence Department. That is a projected rate of just over 8 percent over the ten-year period.

Based on the results of this forecast, "Hot Jobs" have been identified as in-demand for this time period. This list is helpful to educators, career counselors, students, and others making career plans.

- **Accountants and Auditors**
- **Computer Systems Analysts**
- **Computer User Support Specialists**
- **Electricians**
- **Elementary School Teachers, Except Special Education**
- **First-Line Supervisors of Construction Trades and Extraction Workers**
- **First-Line Supervisors of Office and Administrative Support Workers**
- **General and Operations Managers**
- **Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers**
- **Industrial Machinery Mechanics**
- **Machinists**
- **Management Analysts**
- **Registered Nurses**
- **Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing, Except Technical and Scientific Products**
- **Secondary School Teachers, Except Special and Career/Technical Education**

All of these occupations meet three specific criteria:

- A projected growth rate of at least 8 percent over the ten years,
- An increase of at least 900 jobs, and
- An average annual salary of at least \$40,580 (the 2015 average for all jobs in South Carolina).

The most in-demand job will likely be Registered Nurses (+6,085) and the highest salary will be for General and Operational Managers at \$96,070 per year.

The data for these projections was compiled using standard statistical models funded by the U.S. Department of Labor. The projections were reviewed and revised by economic experts in South Carolina prior to publication.
