TRAINING BEYOND HIGH SCHOOL

Some jobs require formal training beyond high school but not a college degree. For example, Licensed Practical Nurses usually have certificates of training from a technical or community college. This is called a "postsecondary career award." These are not four-year college degrees but certificate or diploma programs that provide essential skills and training specific to the job.

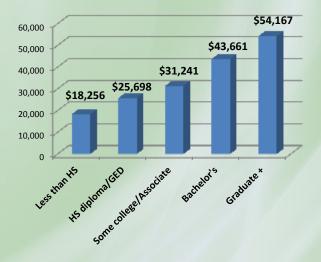
