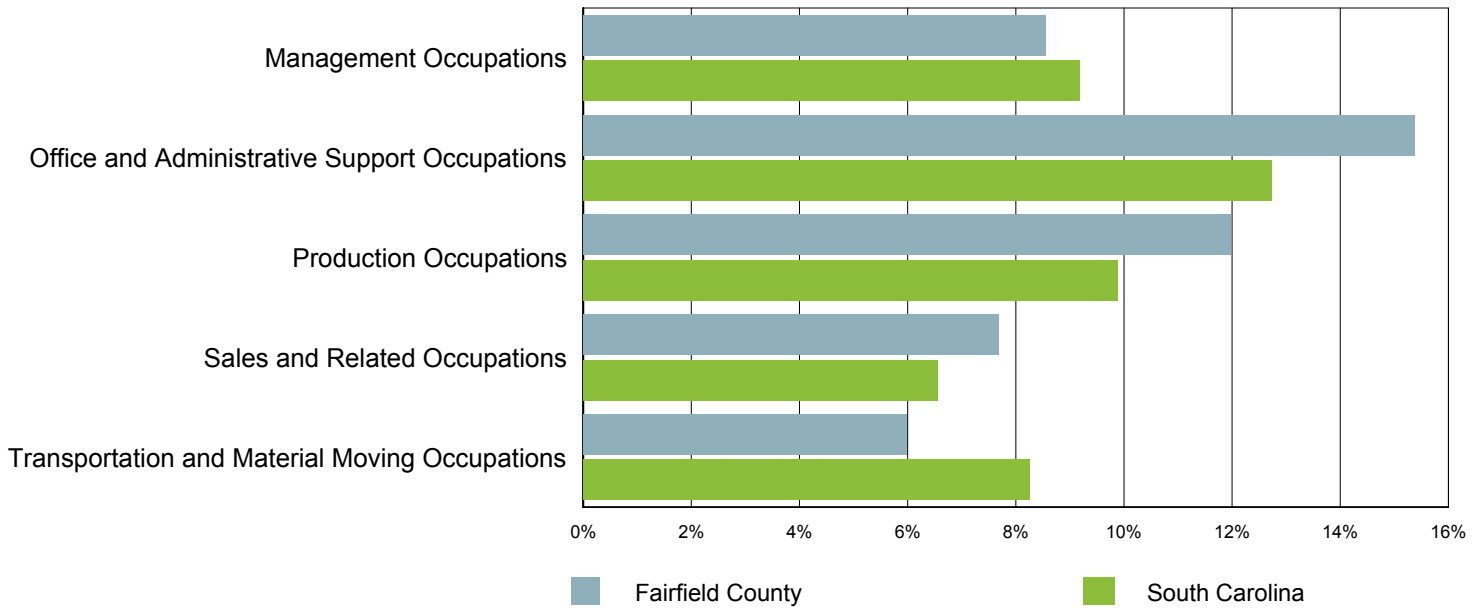

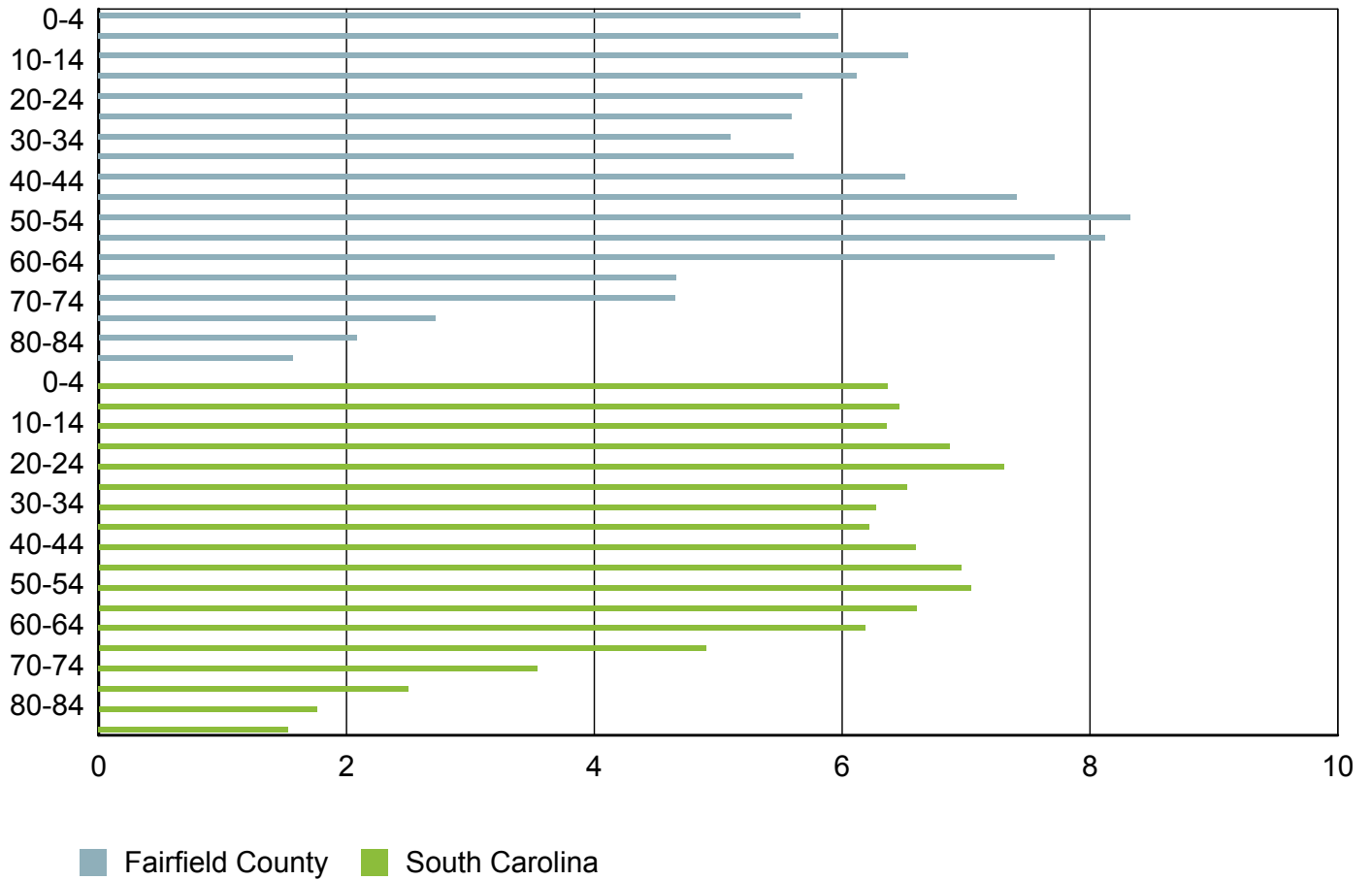

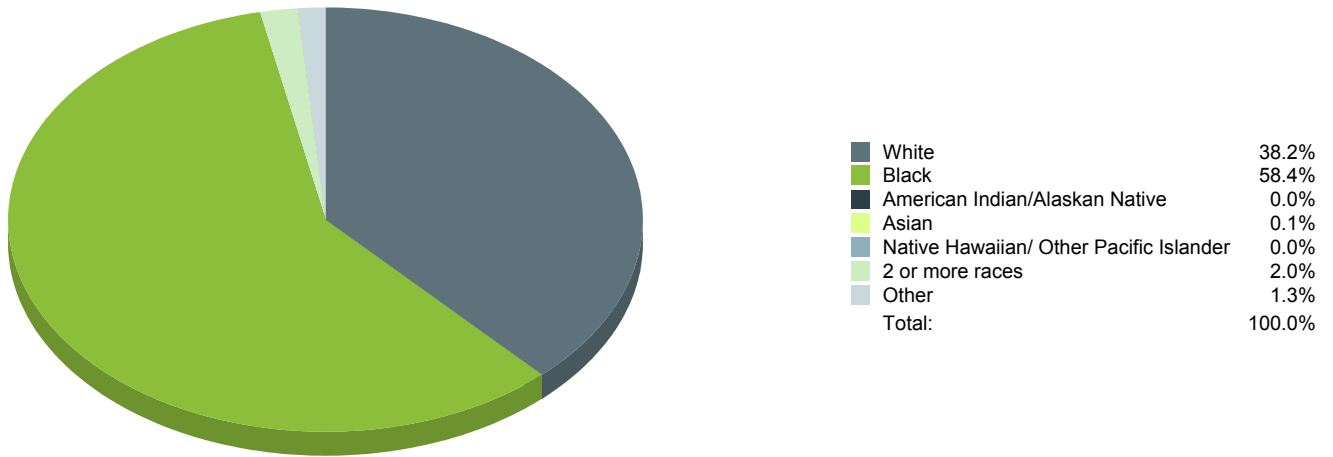

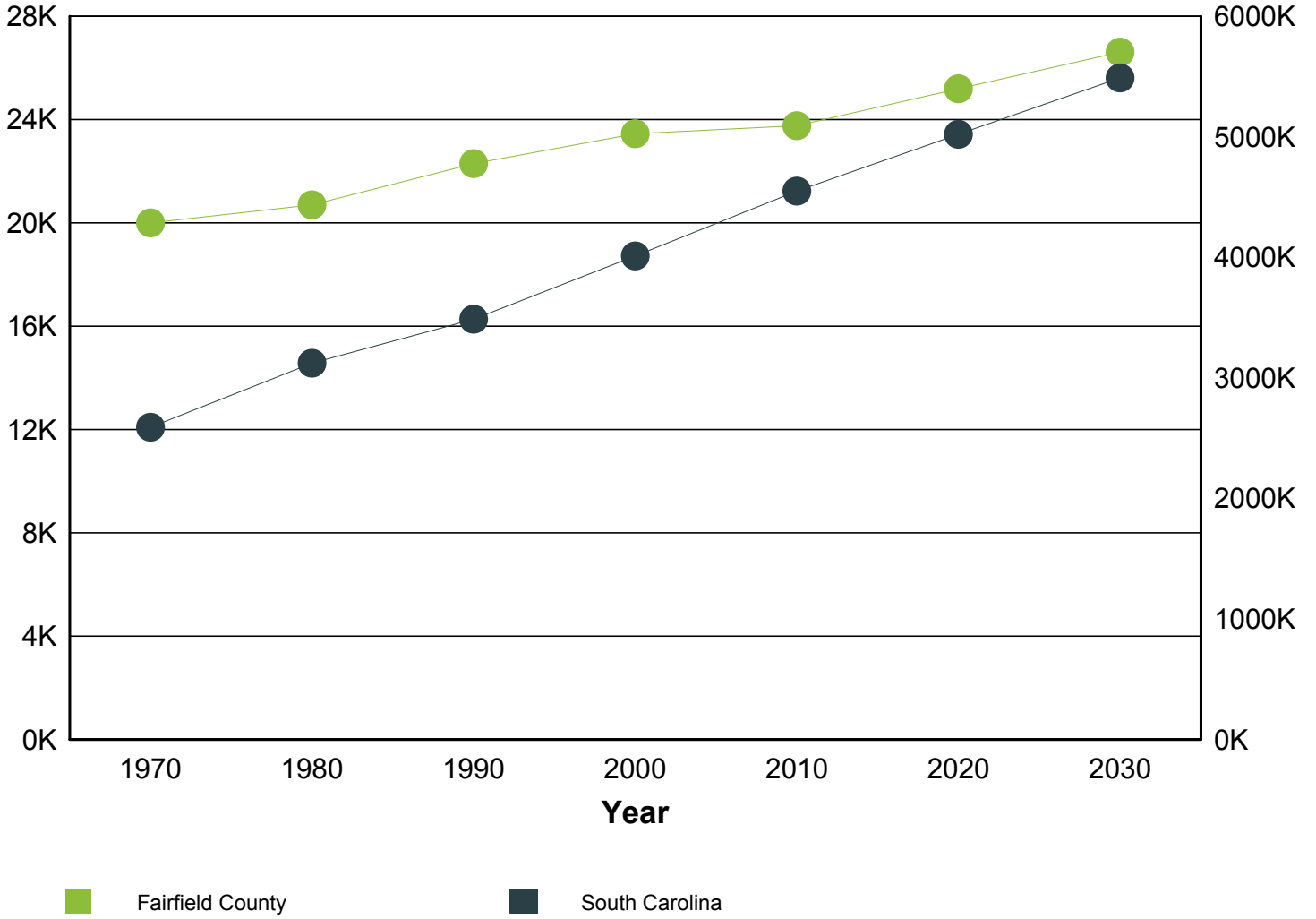

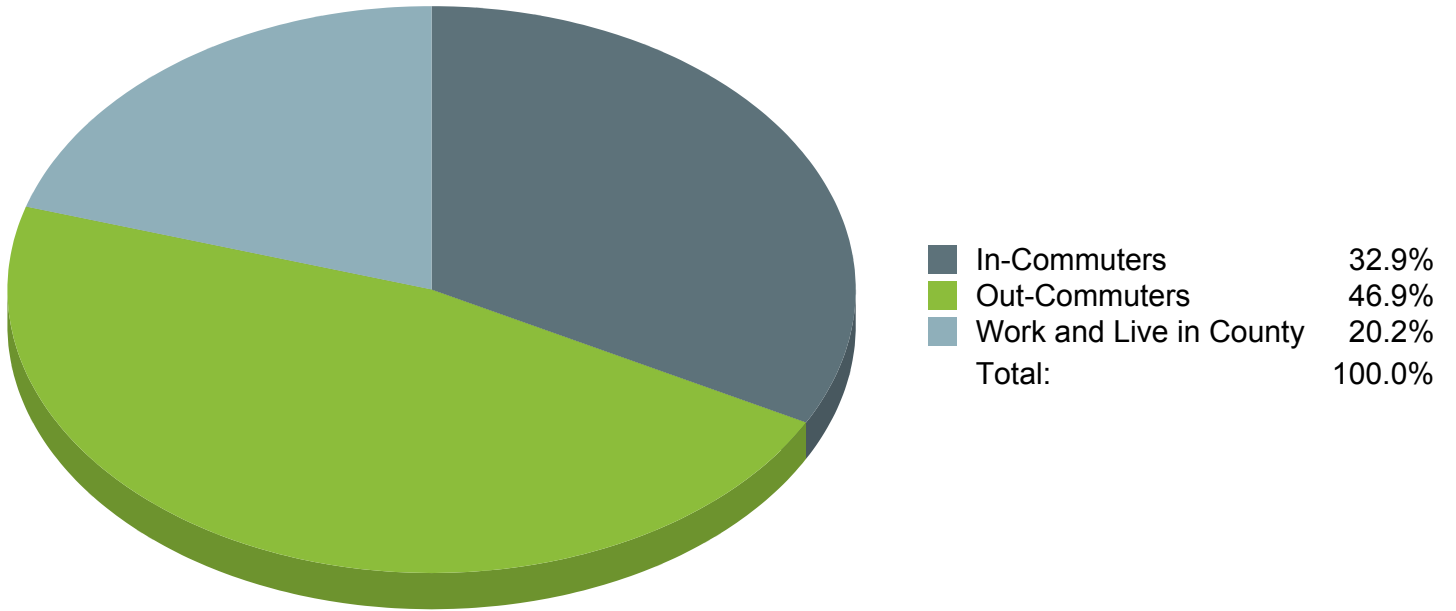

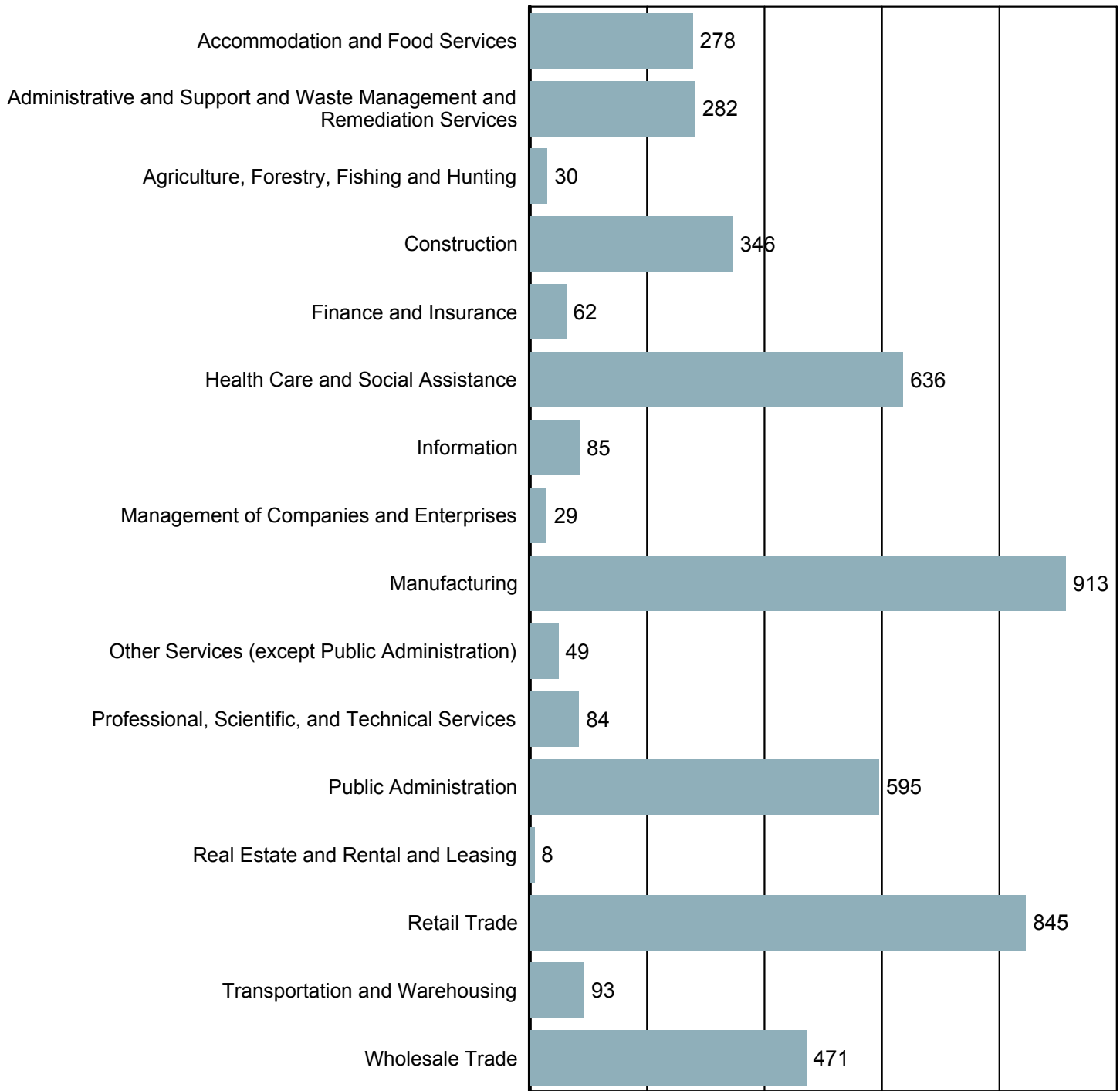

### Employment by Industry

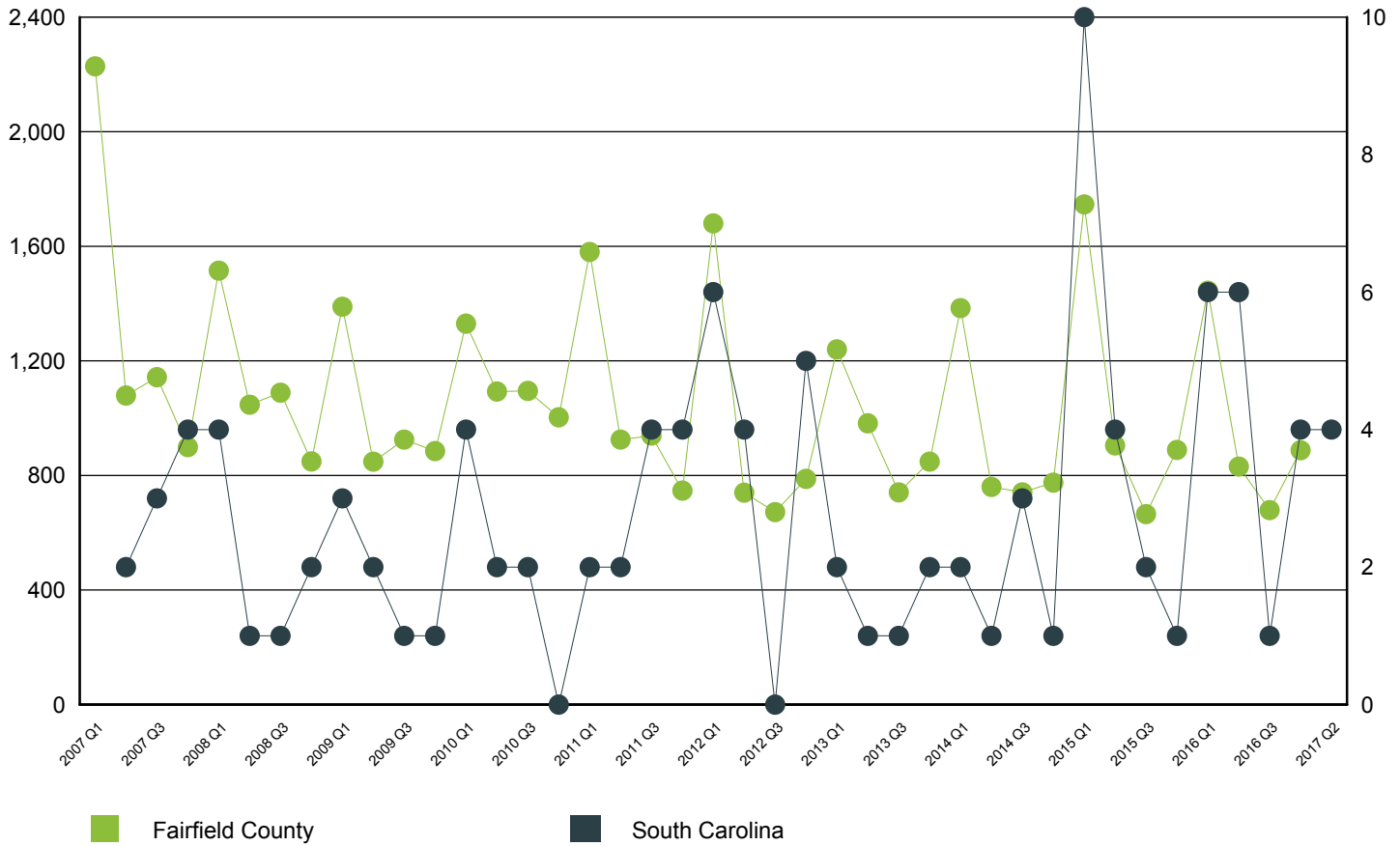

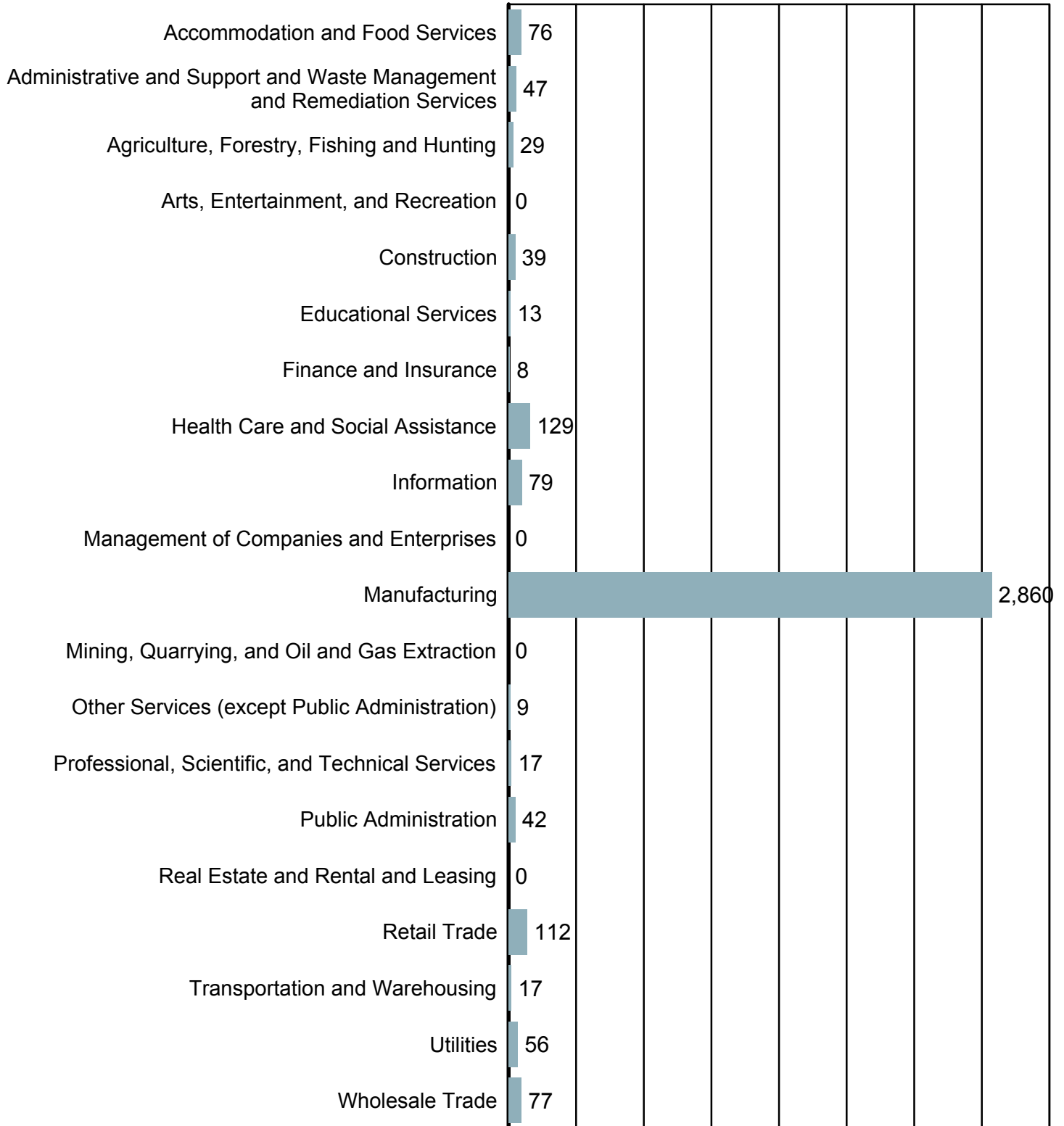

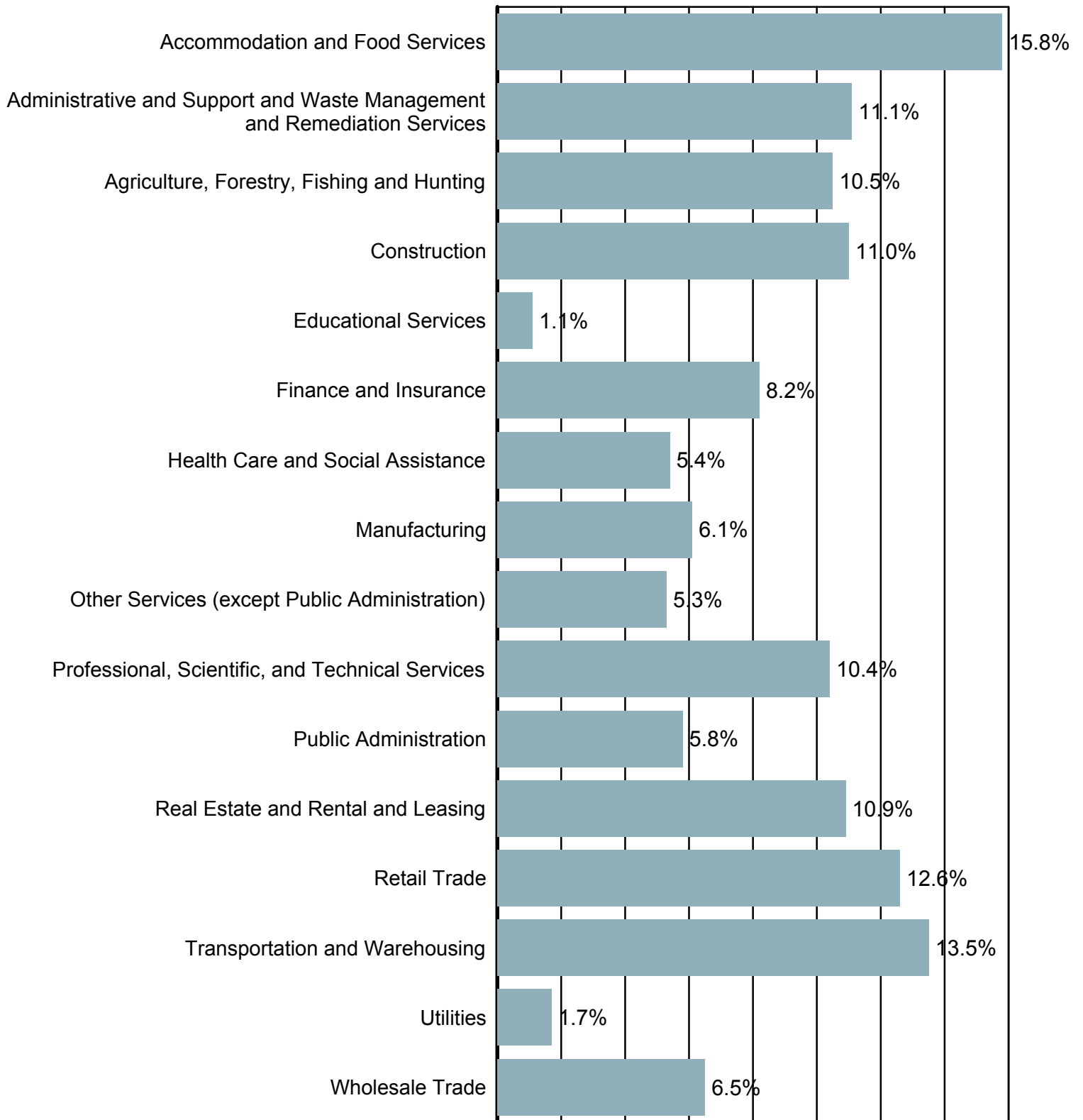

### New Hires by Industry



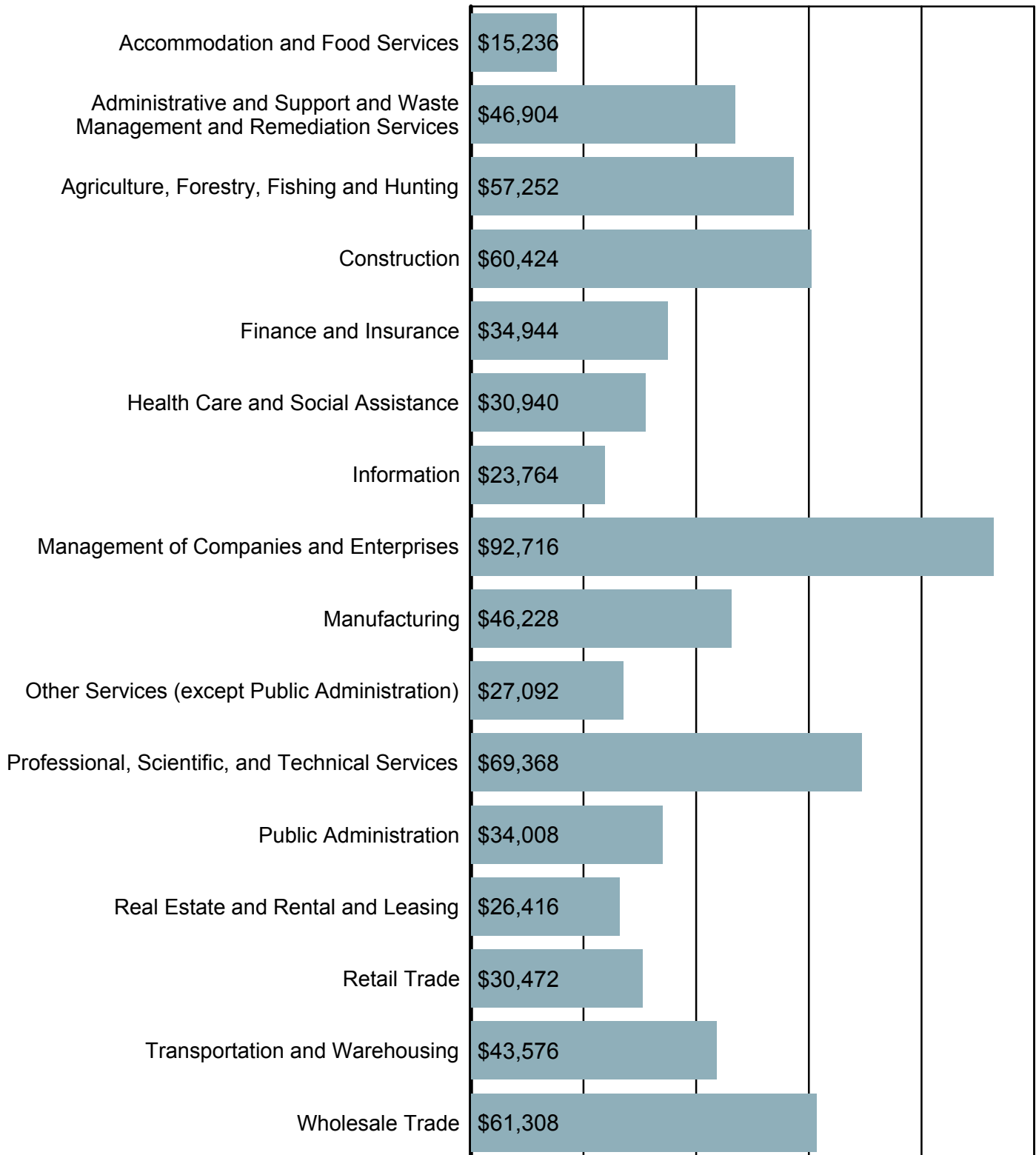

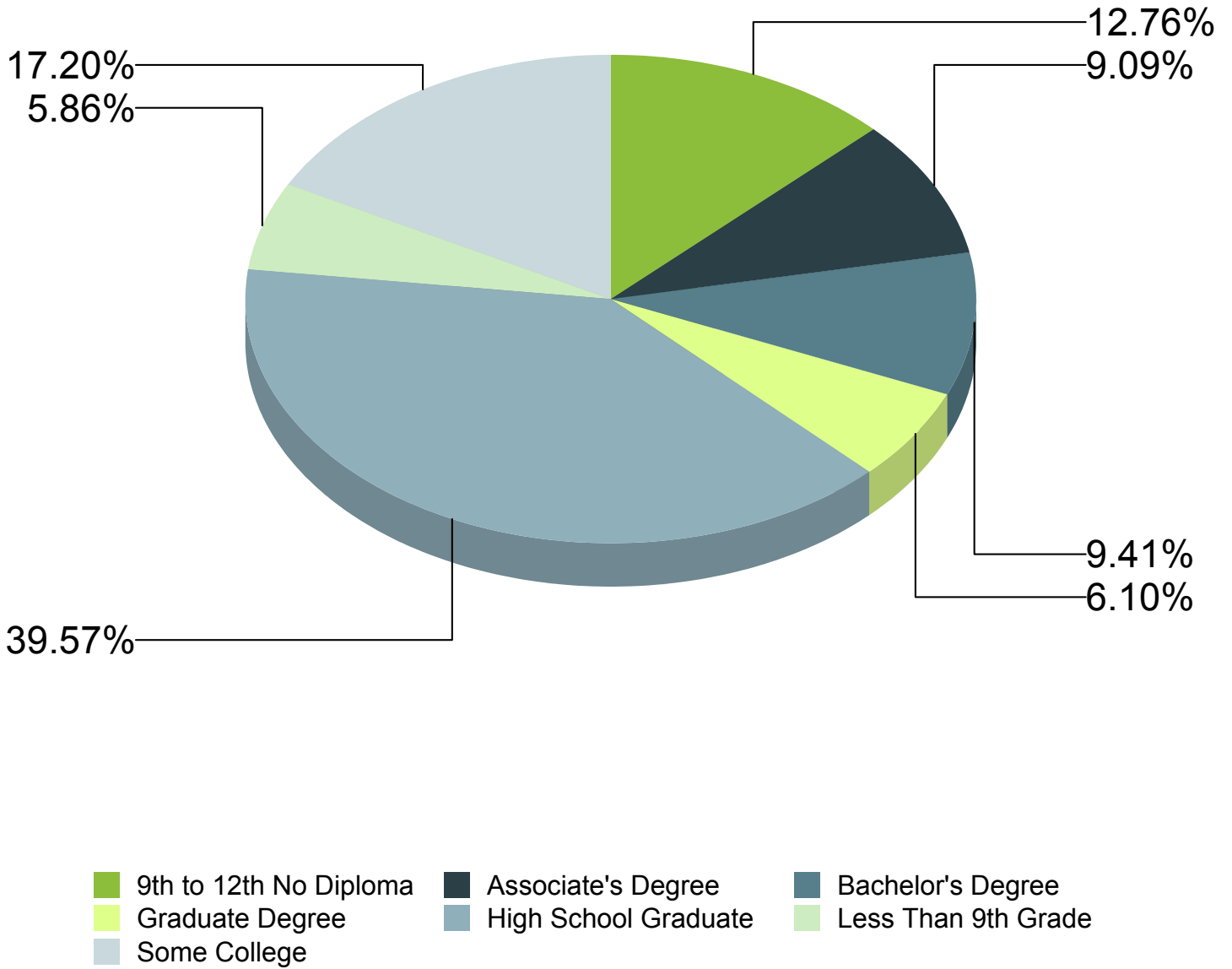

# Educational Attainment

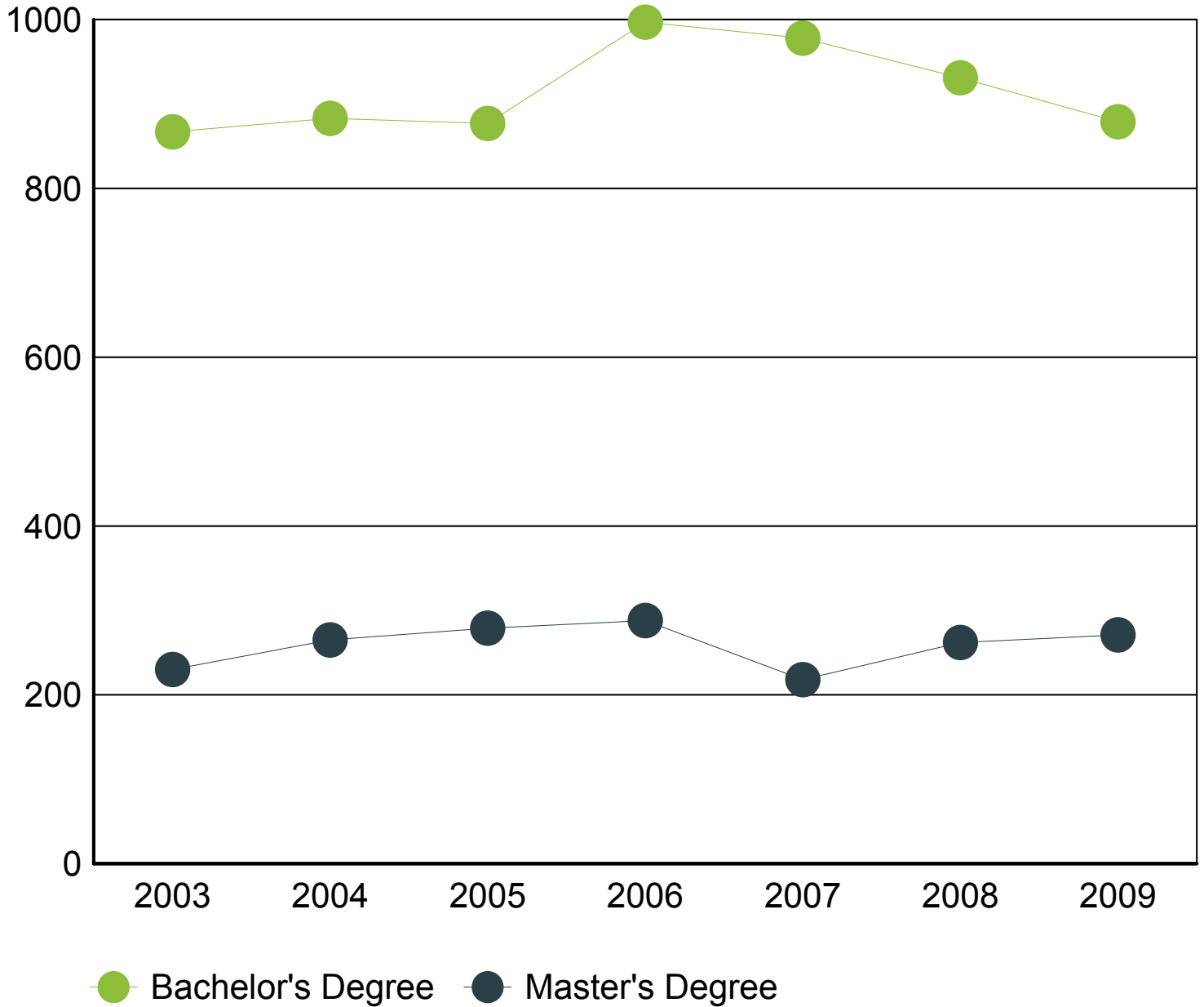
(Population 25 Years and Older)
