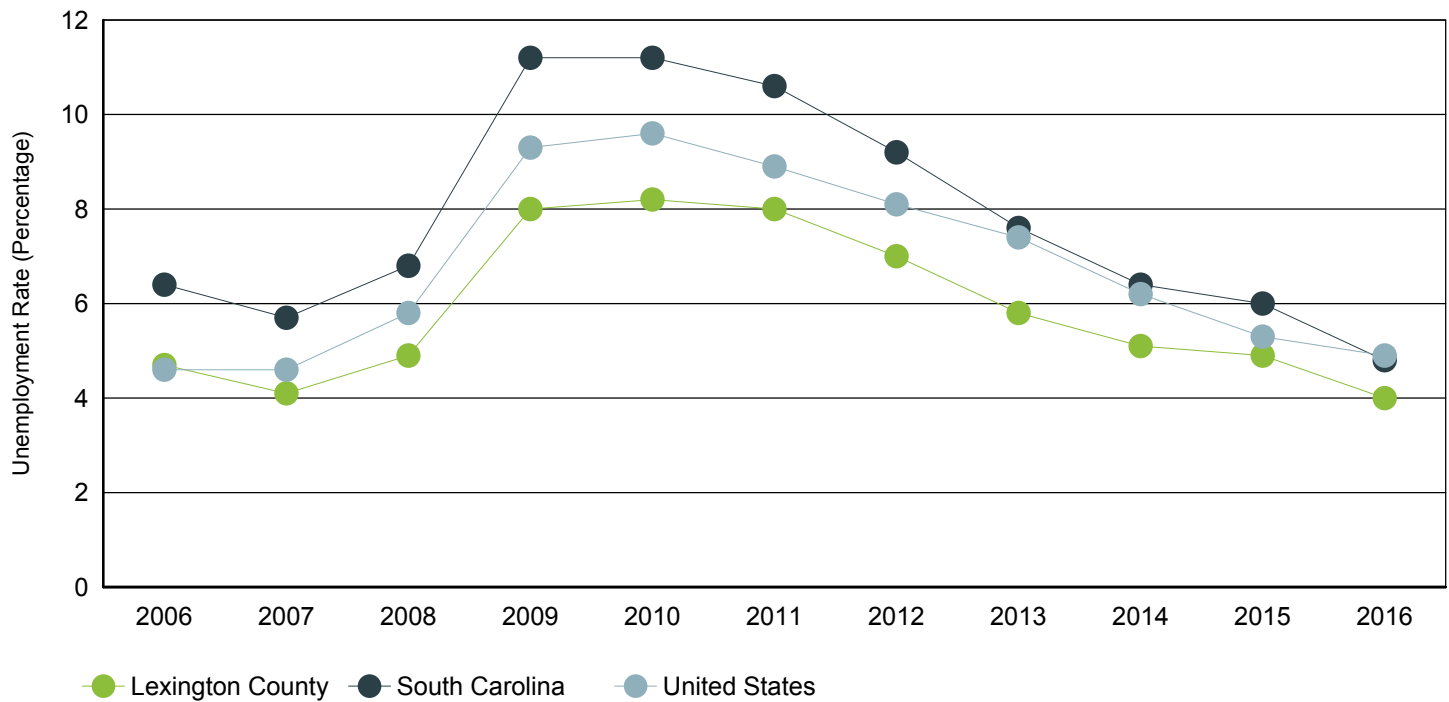

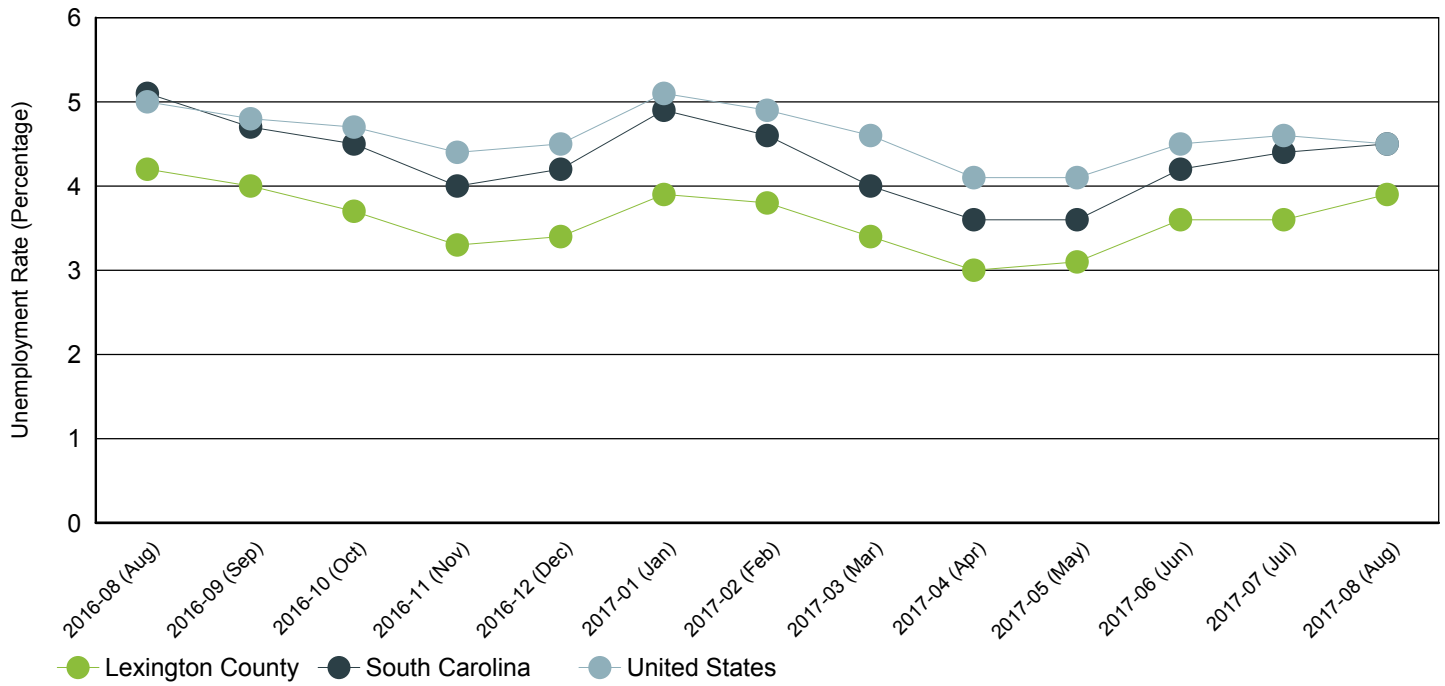

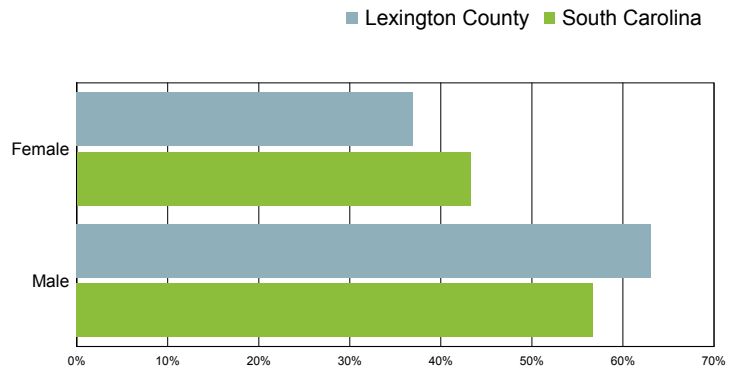

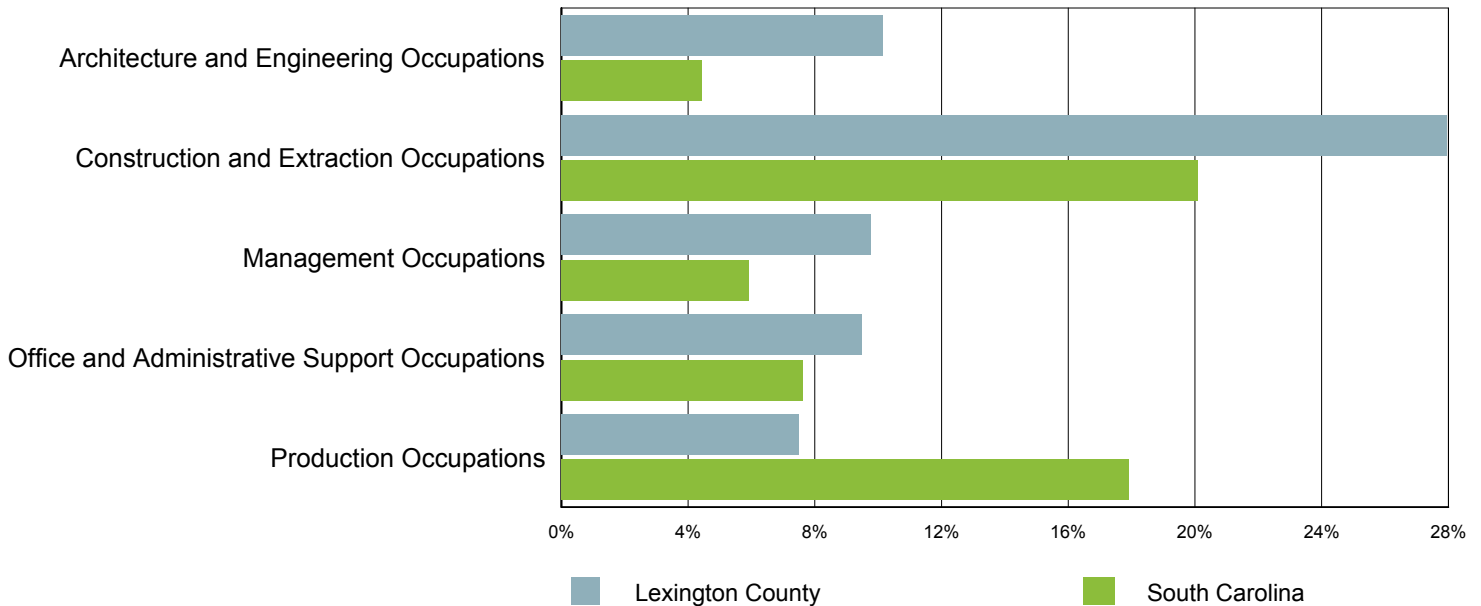

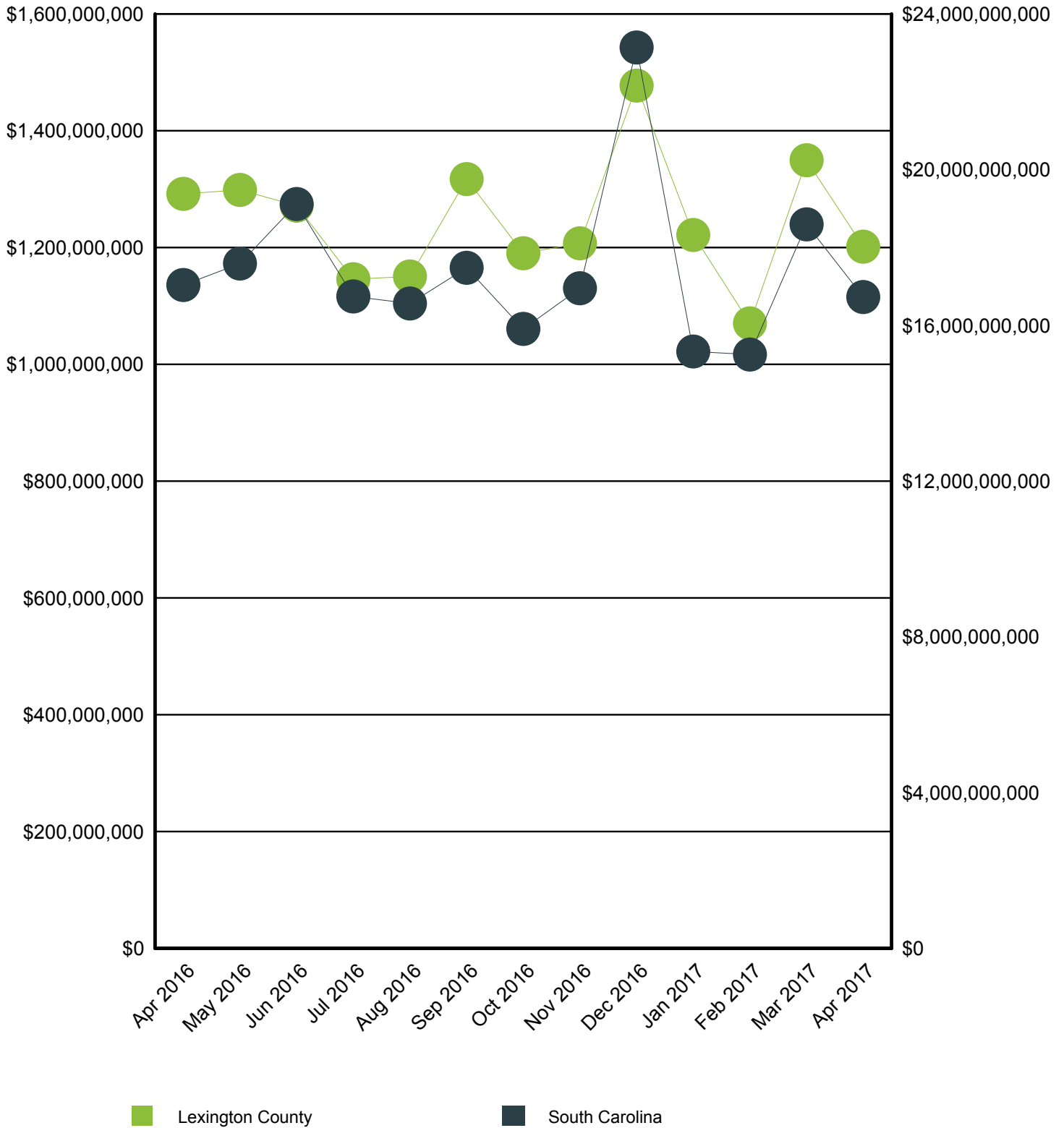

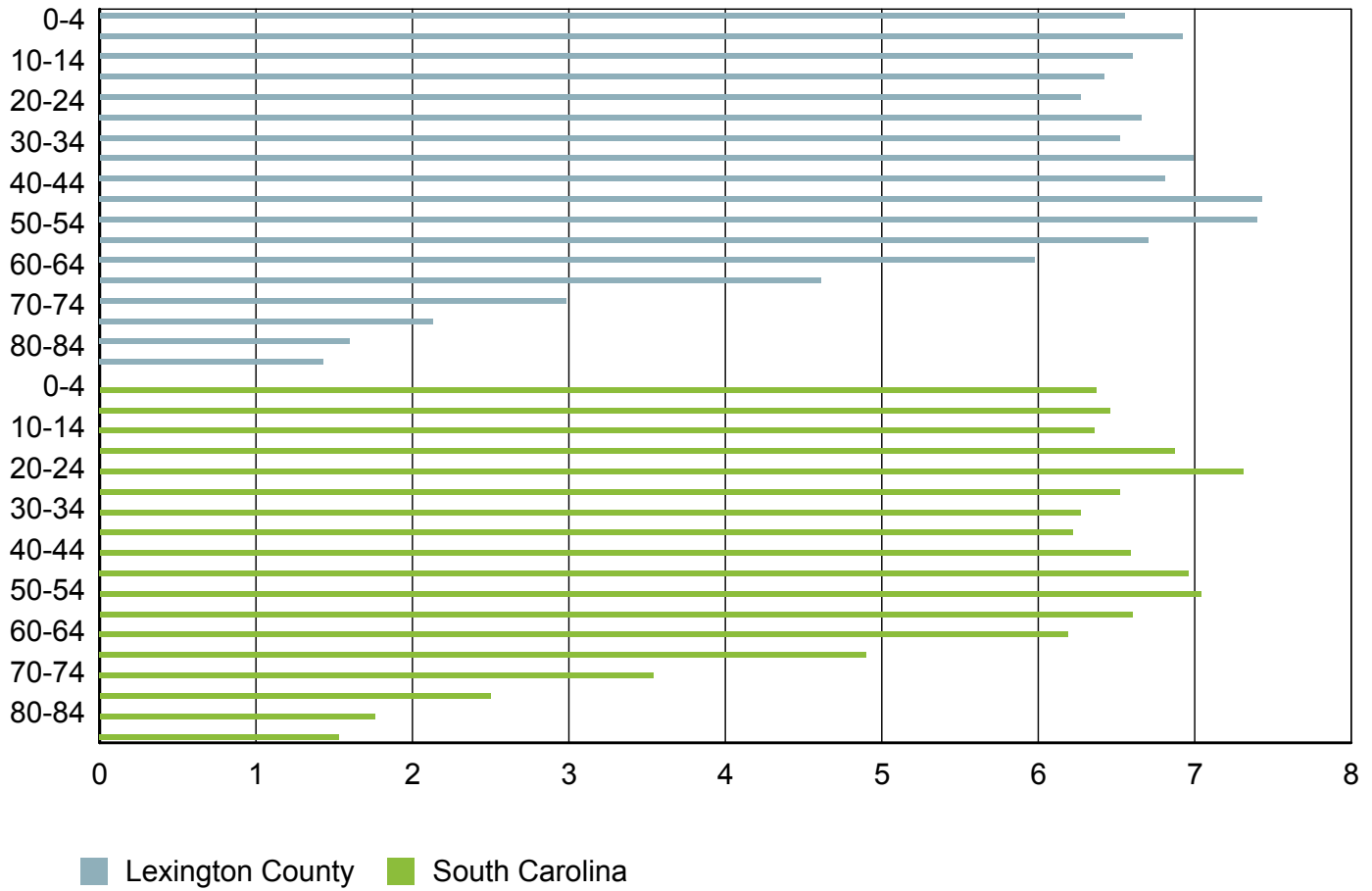

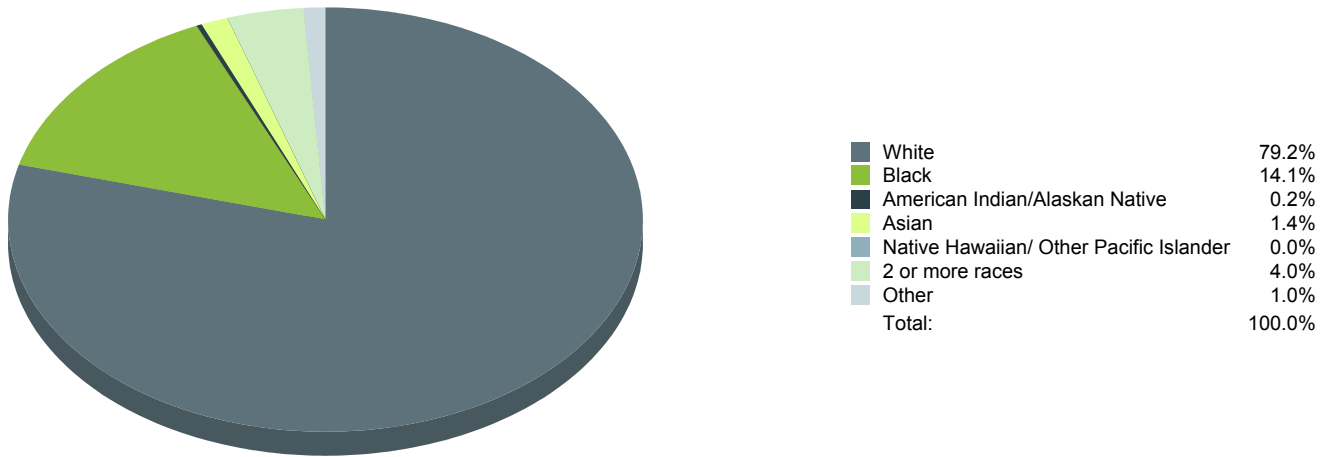

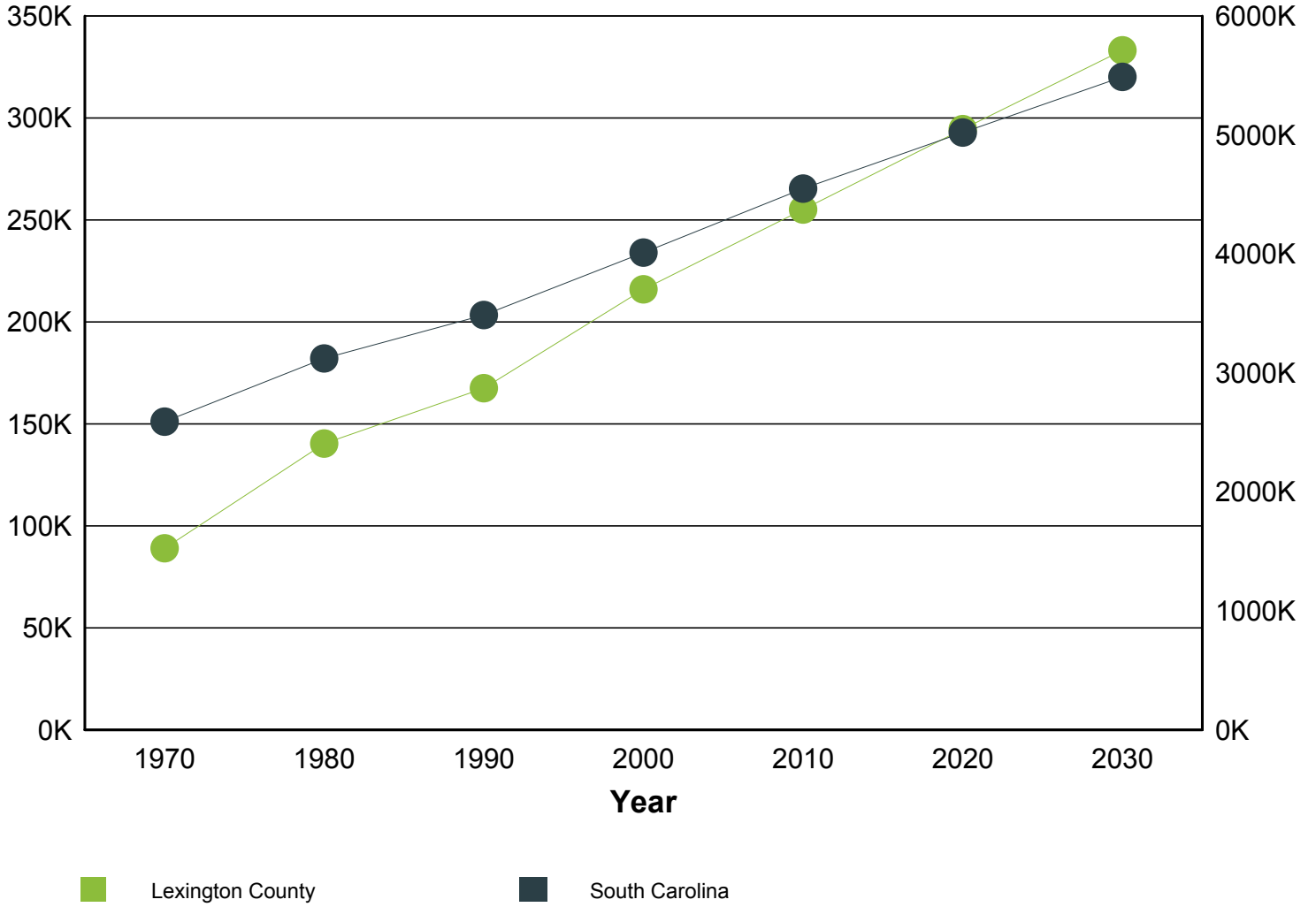

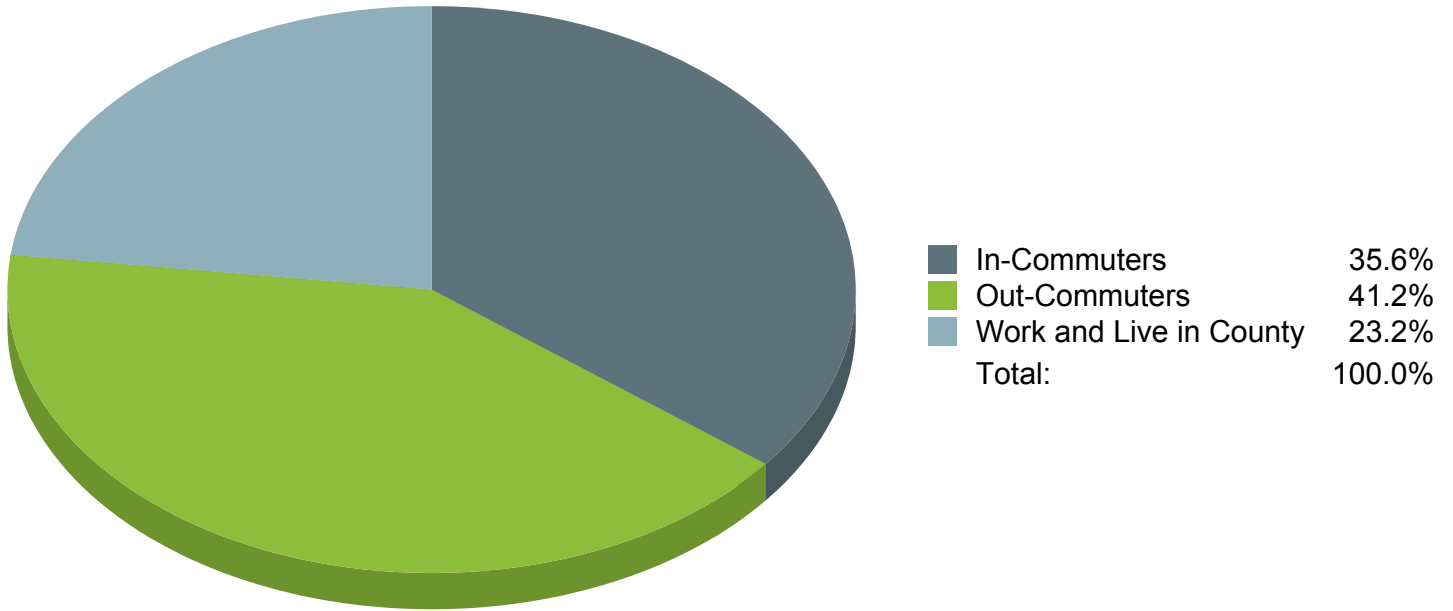

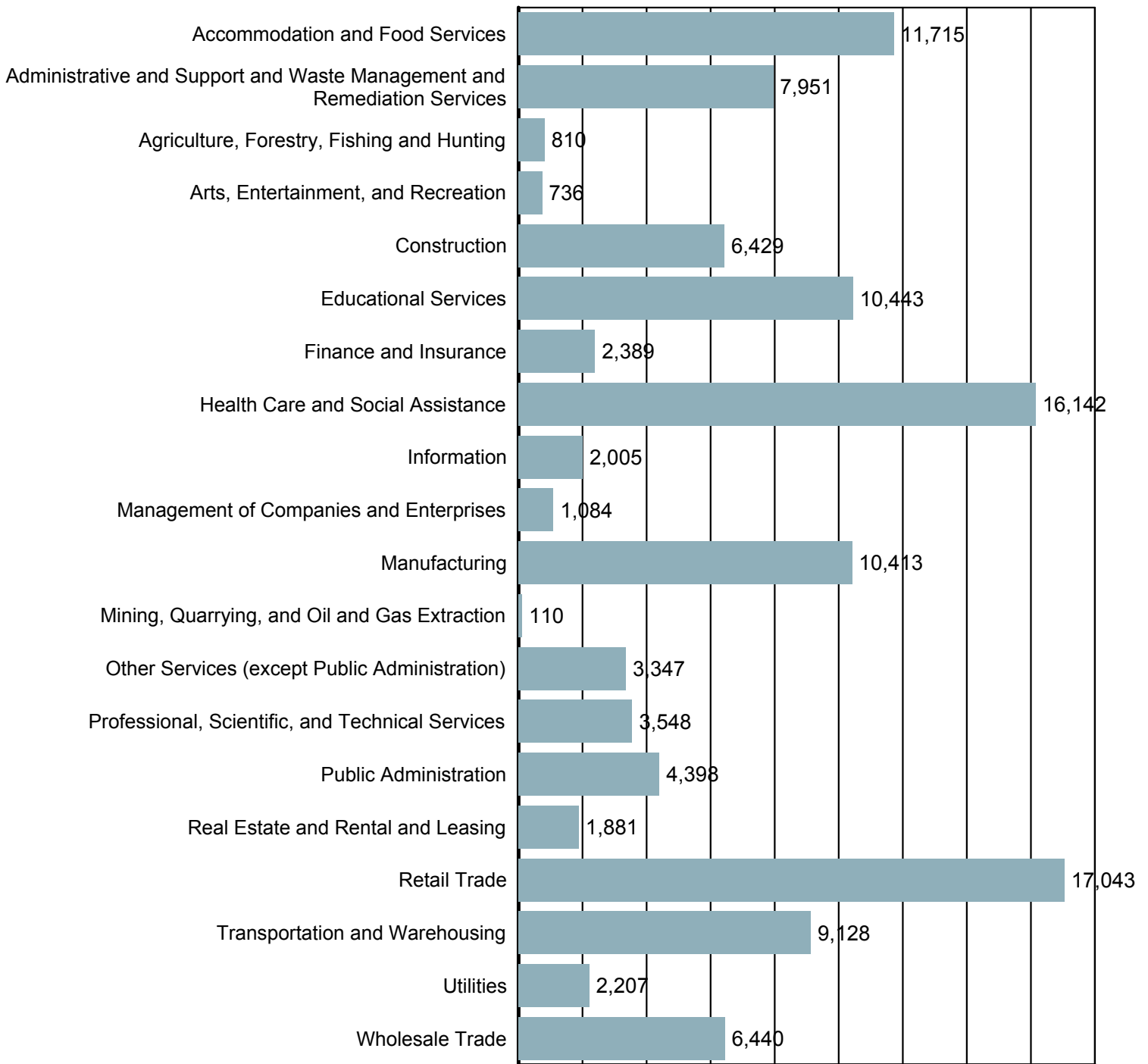

Employment by Industry

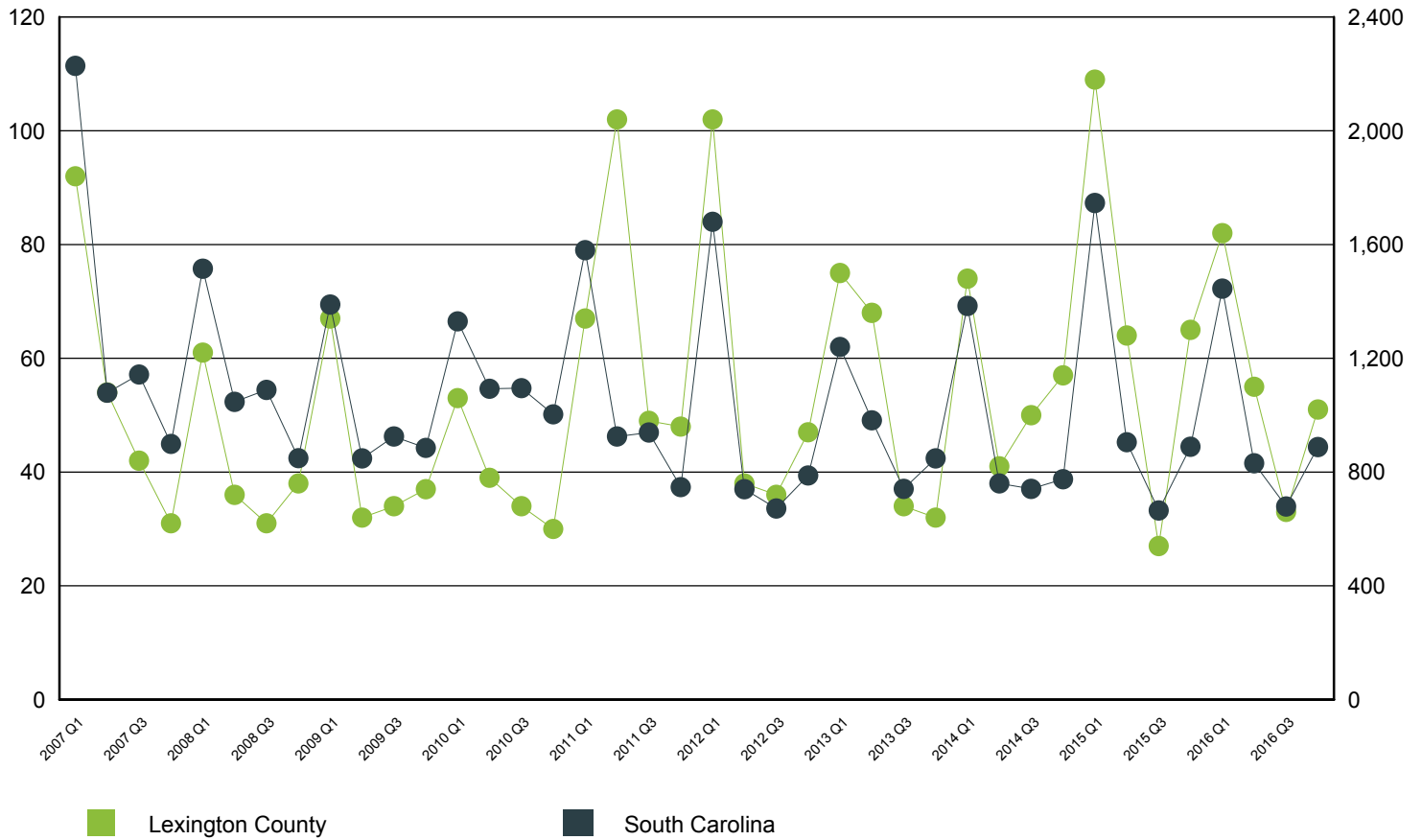

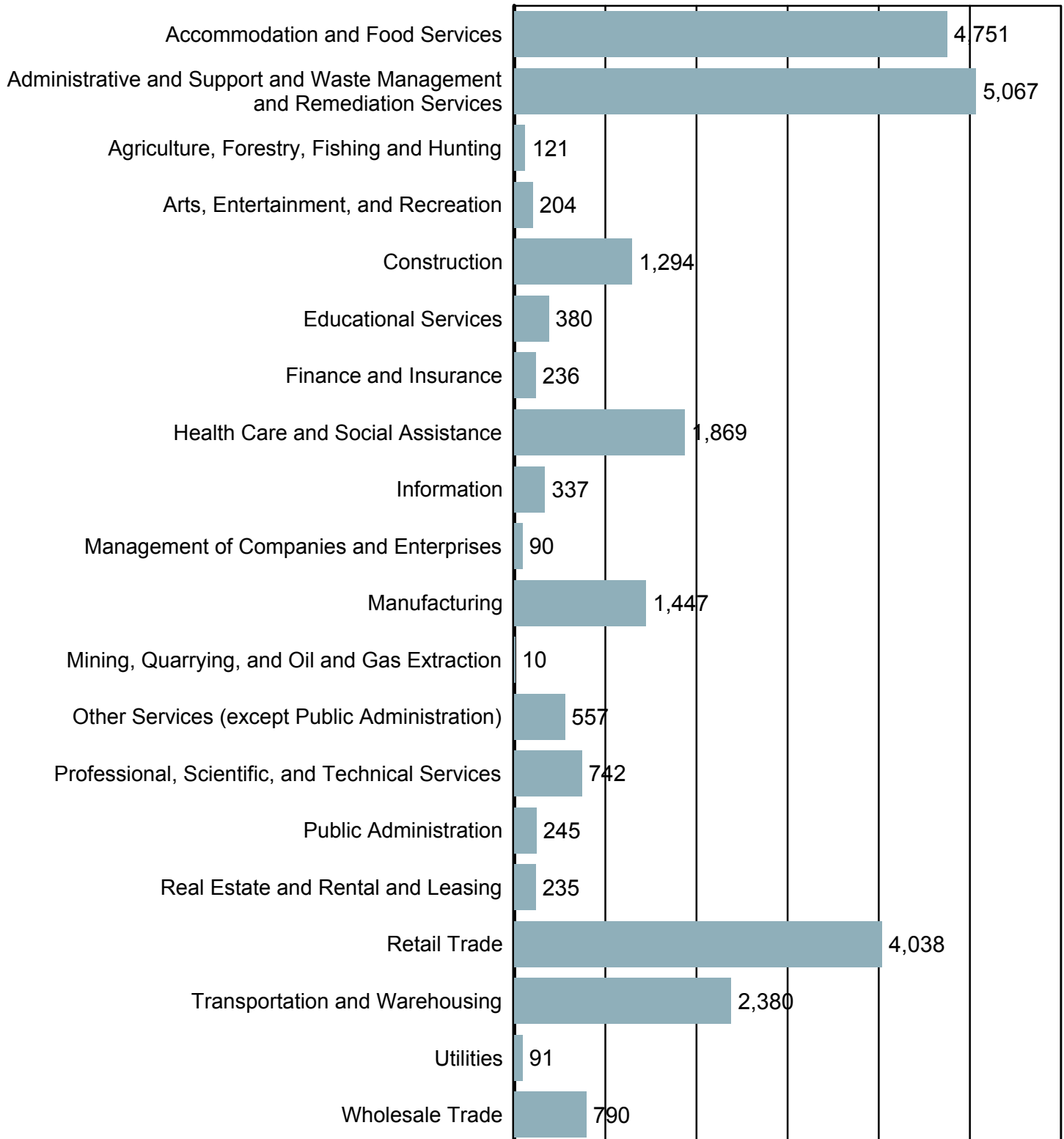

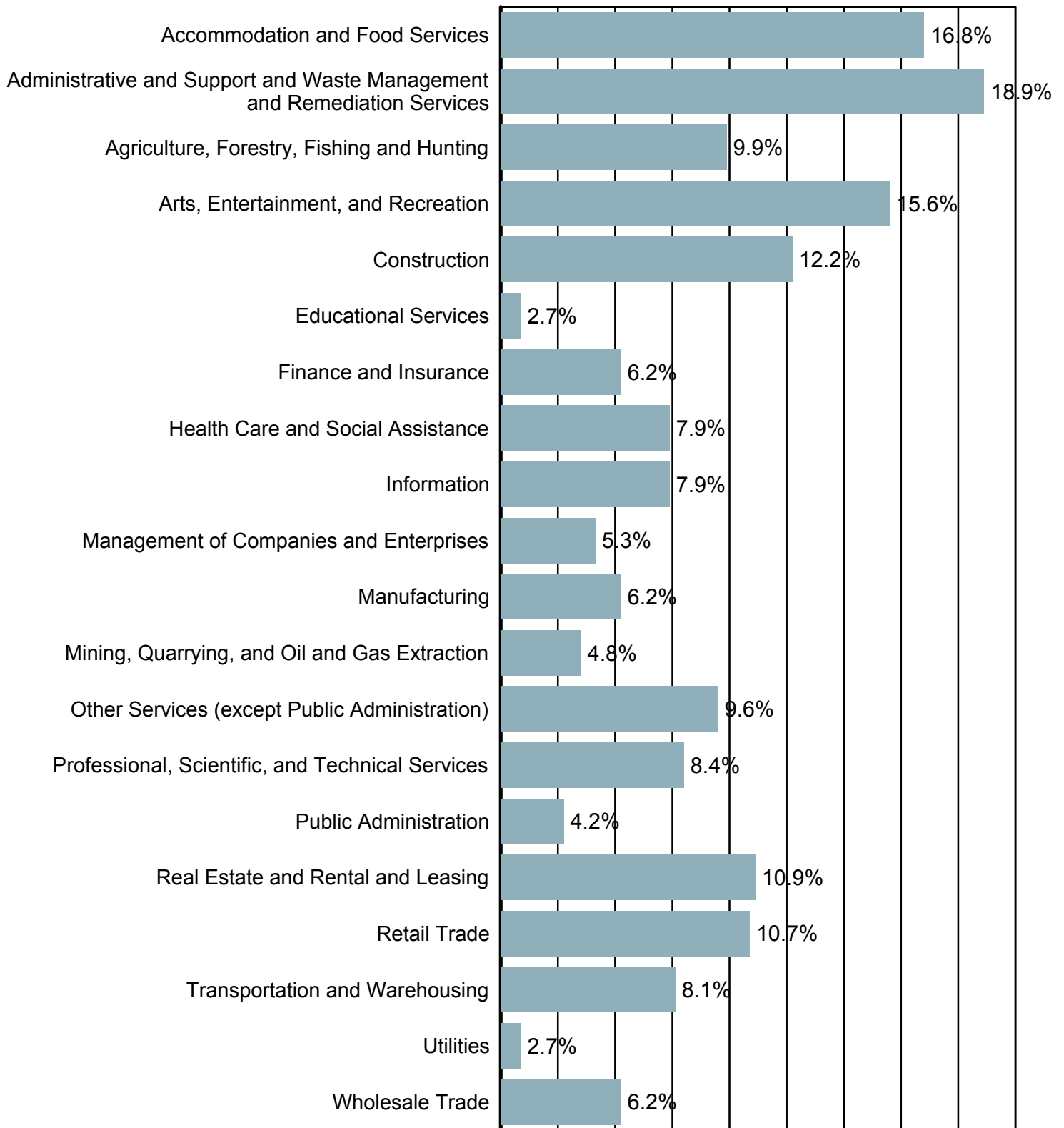

New Hires by Industry



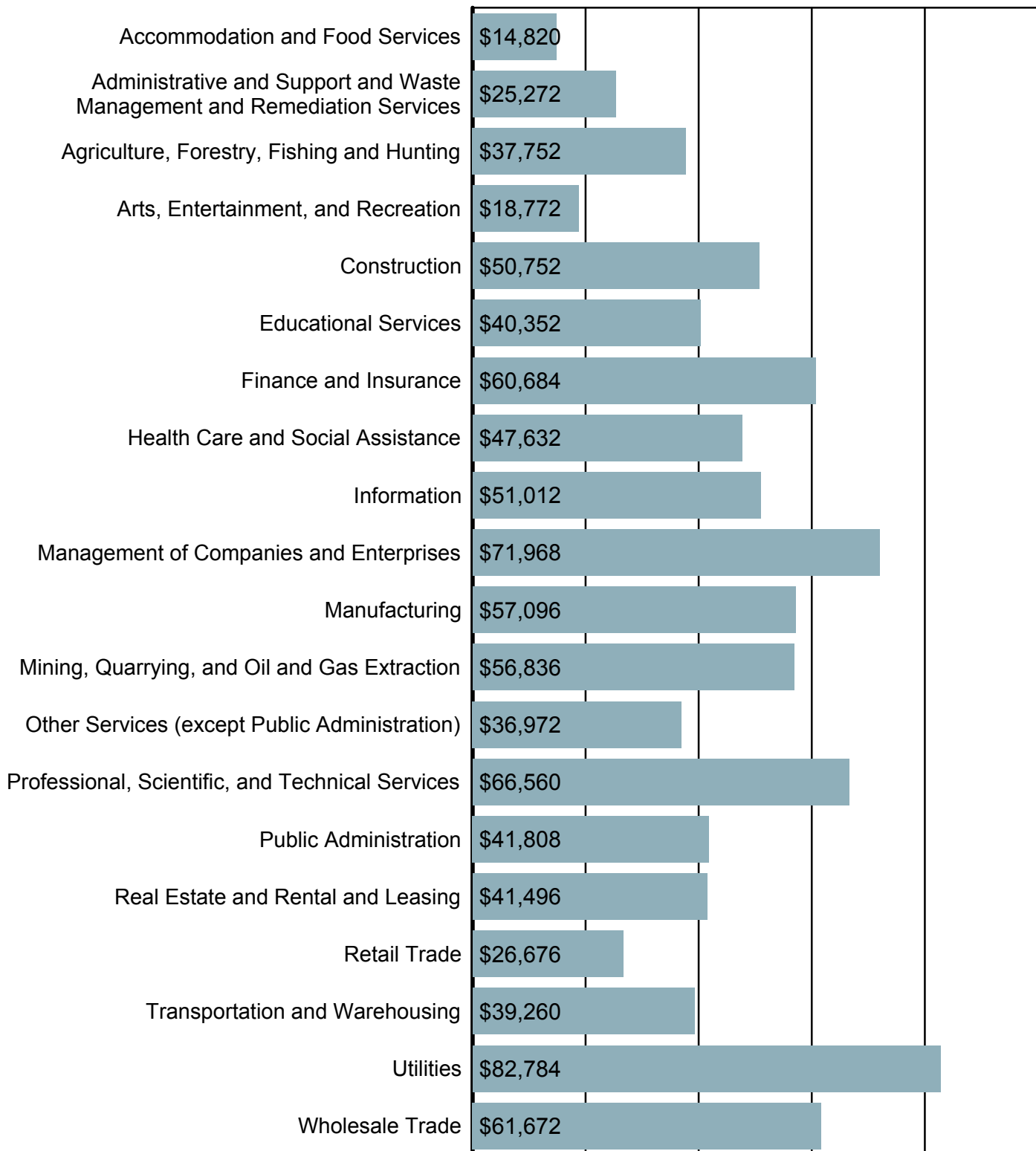

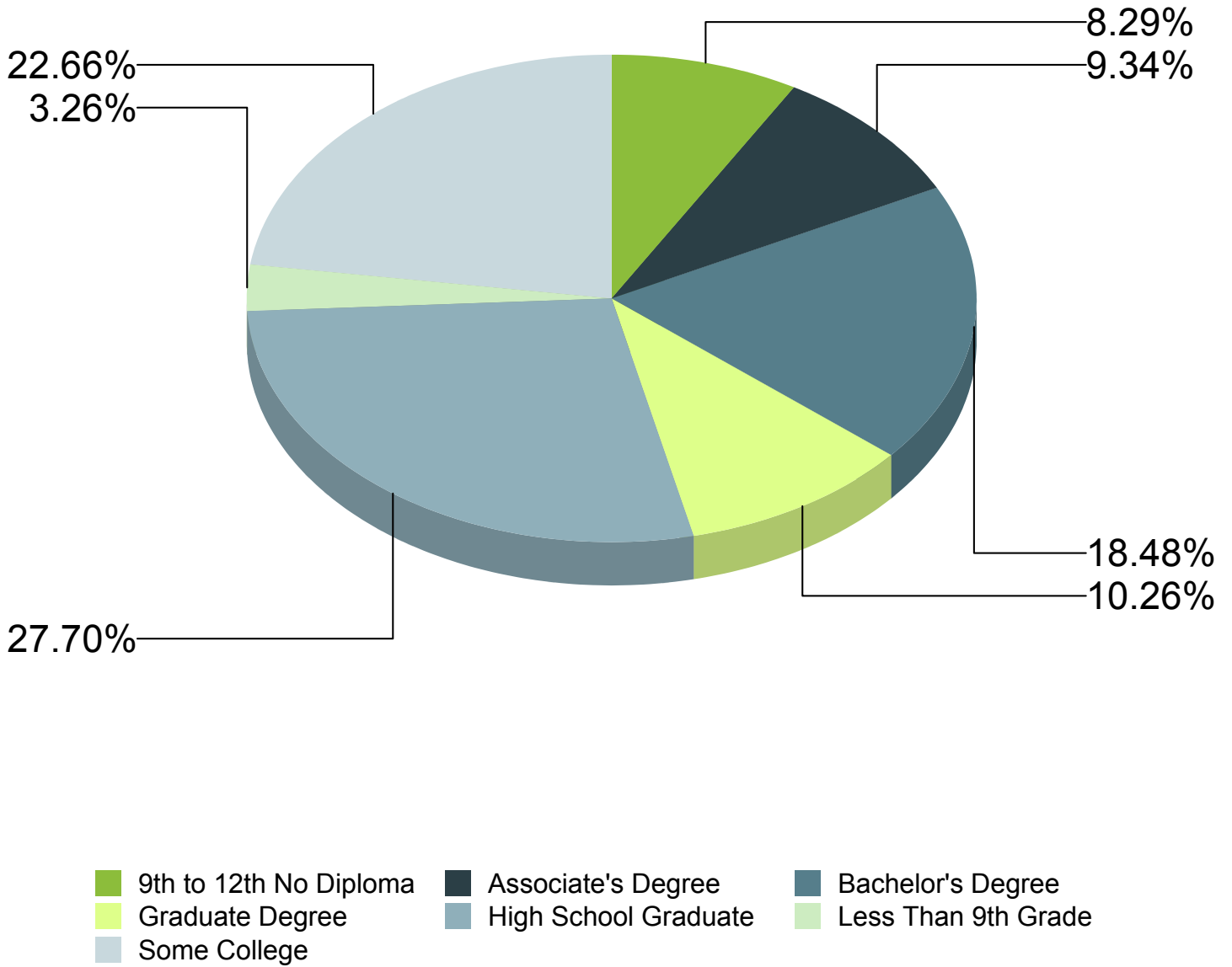
