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














The SC Department of Revenue provides data on retail sales in all areas of the state.

“Retail sales in Dillon County have increased dramatically in late 2014 indicating renewed interest in consumer spending, especially for the upcoming holiday season.”



WHAT IT IS...

In a bar graph and a table, this data breaks down the total population by age in years. The data is from the US Census Bureau, annual American Community Survey.

HOW TO USE IT...

Changes in age can affect several sectors. An increase in “mature” citizens can indicate an increased need for geriatric services, while changes in younger children can affect the areas education system.







"A majority of Dillon County residents (40.1 percent) leave the county for work. Only 26.6 percent live AND work in the county."

WHAT IT IS...

The size of a company may indicate its need for services, as would its employment level. Smaller companies likely do not have a human resources department and may need assistance for things like filing claims and registering for E-verify.

HOW TO TALK ABOUT IT...

"A vast majority of the employers in Dillon County are small businesses (fewer than 50 employees). There are more companies with four or fewer employees than any other company size."

WHAT IT IS...


This is an alphabetical list of the companies in your area that employ the most people. It is NOT in order of employment level.

HOW TO USE IT...

Very often the largest companies have the largest staffing needs so it may be a way to target services. In addition, some larger companies may have had to downsize their human resources department and may need that type of assistance.

HOW TO TALK ABOUT IT...

“The largest employers in Dillon County include manufacturing companies, government offices, and medical facilities.”



WHAT IT IS...

This bar graph shows major industry groups and the employment for each industry. They are listed alphabetically. NOTE: The release of this data lags behind the time period for the data due to the time required for data collection (to give employers plenty of time to report) and verification, and quality assurance (including review by the US Department of Labor).

HOW TO USE IT...

Knowing what industries (kinds of companies) are in your area will help with identifying general skills of the workforce and possibly identifying future needs.

HOW TO TALK ABOUT IT...

“In Dillon County, manufacturing companies far outnumber the next closest industry, Retail Trade, and the third in line, Health Care and Social Assistance.”



WHAT IT IS...

Using UI account information, this graph shows new companies since the last quarter.

HOW TO USE IT...

New startup firms give you an idea of the number of new companies in your area which may reflect a healthy economy.

HOW TO TALK ABOUT IT...

“Since the recession started in December 2007, new startup firms in Dillon County have been fluctuating with a low of 0 in fourth quarter 2009 and a high of 8 (first quarter 2014).”





It combines data items like employment and wages with demographic and UI data. Because it combines so much data, release usually falls about six months after the time period.

HOW TO USE IT...

LED has workforce indicators that can help you know your area: New hires, turnover, and age of workers. Turnover can show a problem with a certain industry, many times caused by low pay.

HOW TO TALK ABOUT IT...

“Accommodation and food services had the highest turnover rate (16.1 percent) in Dillon County in the first quarter of 2013. Construction had the second highest turnover rate, and the lowest turnover rate was found in Educational Services.”



WHAT IT IS...

Employers UI tax records provide this wage data by industry. It is the most recent quarter of data.

HOW TO USE IT...

Wages can affect employment and turnover so looking at wages is an important part of being familiar with your area.

HOW TO TALK ABOUT IT...

“The Finance and Insurance industry is by far the best paying industry in Dillon County with an average annual wage of \$49,608. Information pays an average of \$46,280 per year. The lowest wage is \$11,700 found in the Accommodation and Food Services industry.”

HOW TO USE IT...

The Age of Workers by Industry can show which industries may have a young workforce that may need some workforce support or training, and which industries may be facing a large period of retirement of workers.




